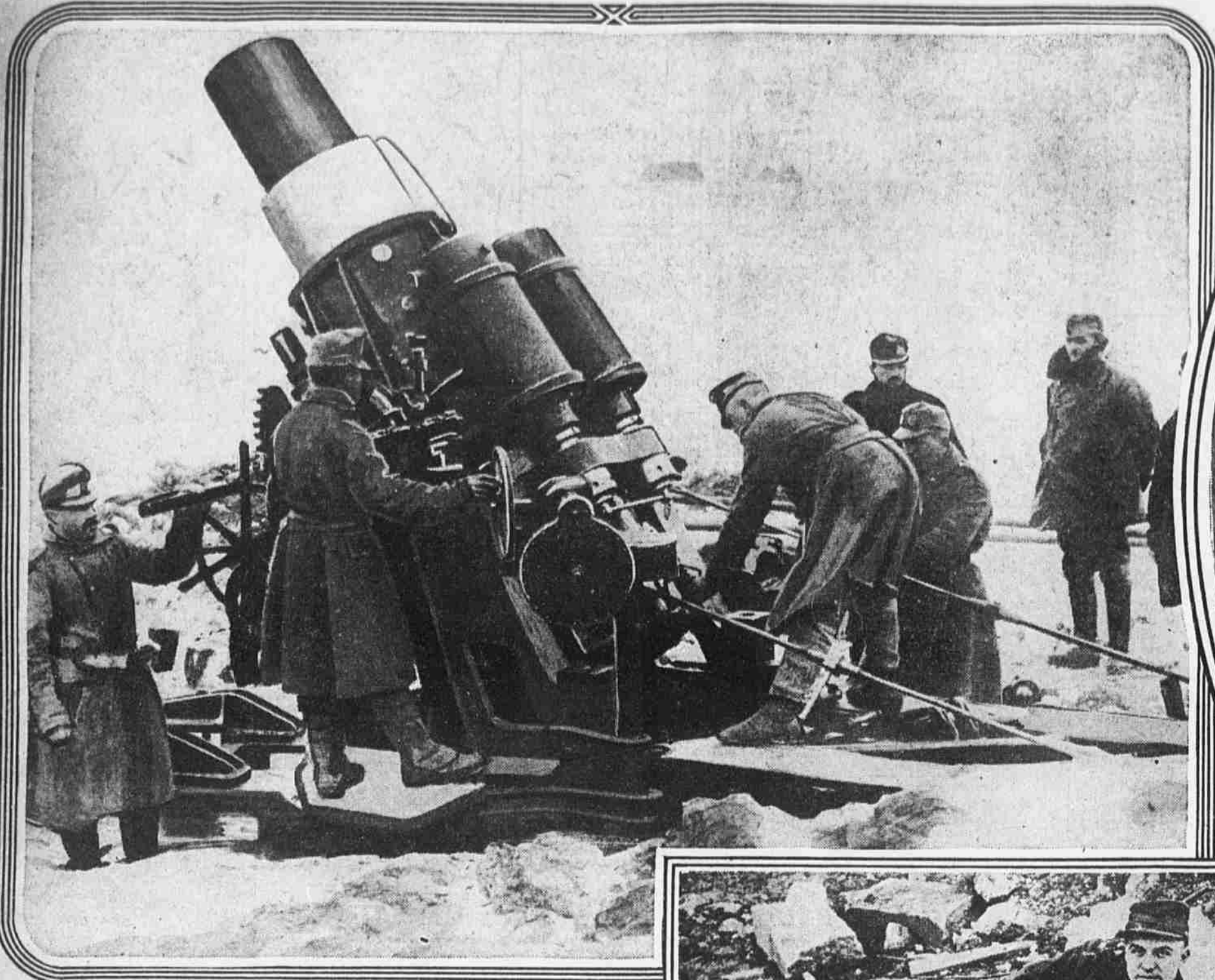

Its military title is "Skoda." While not quite as powerful as its German relation, no fort has been found capable of withstanding its attack.

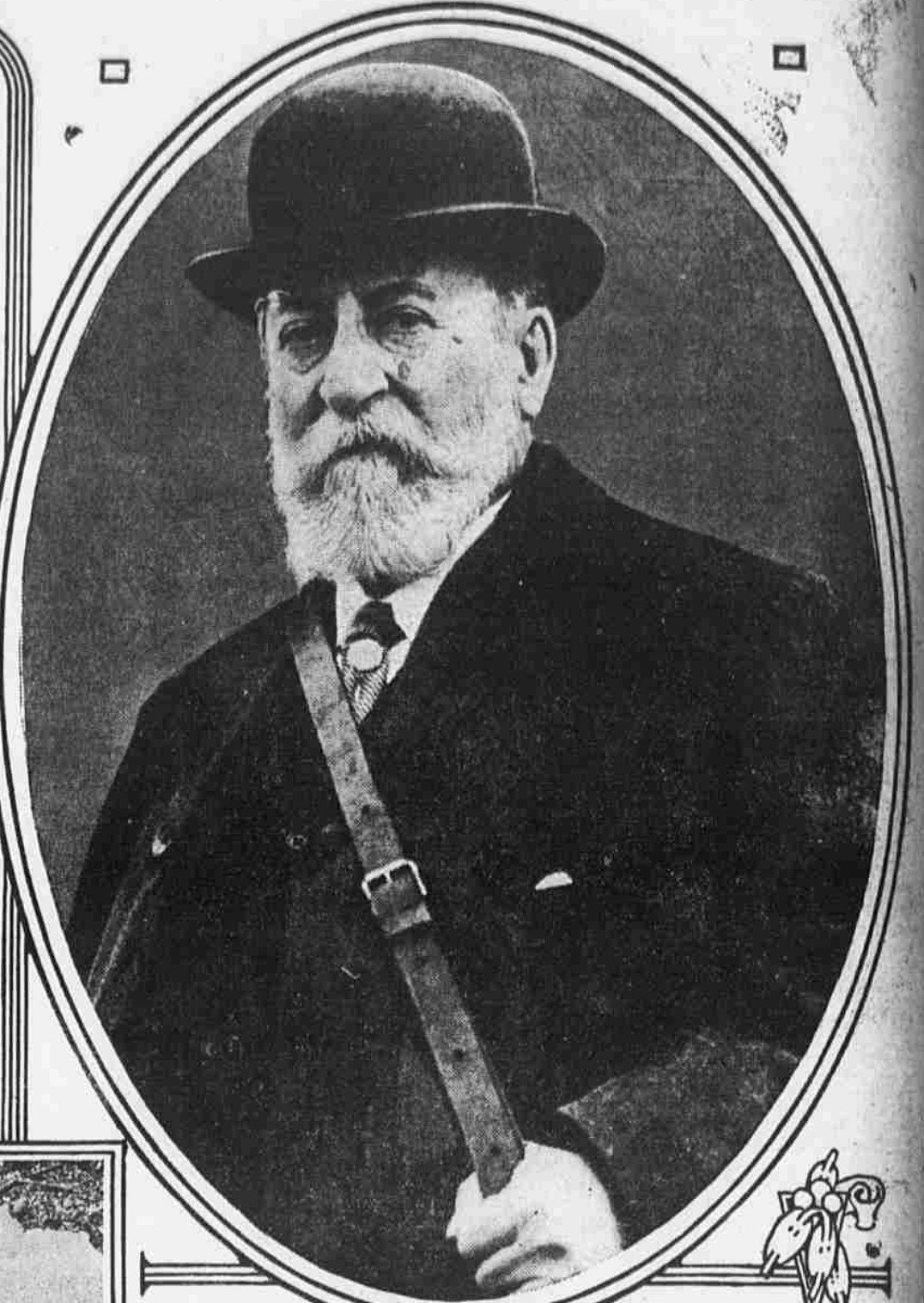

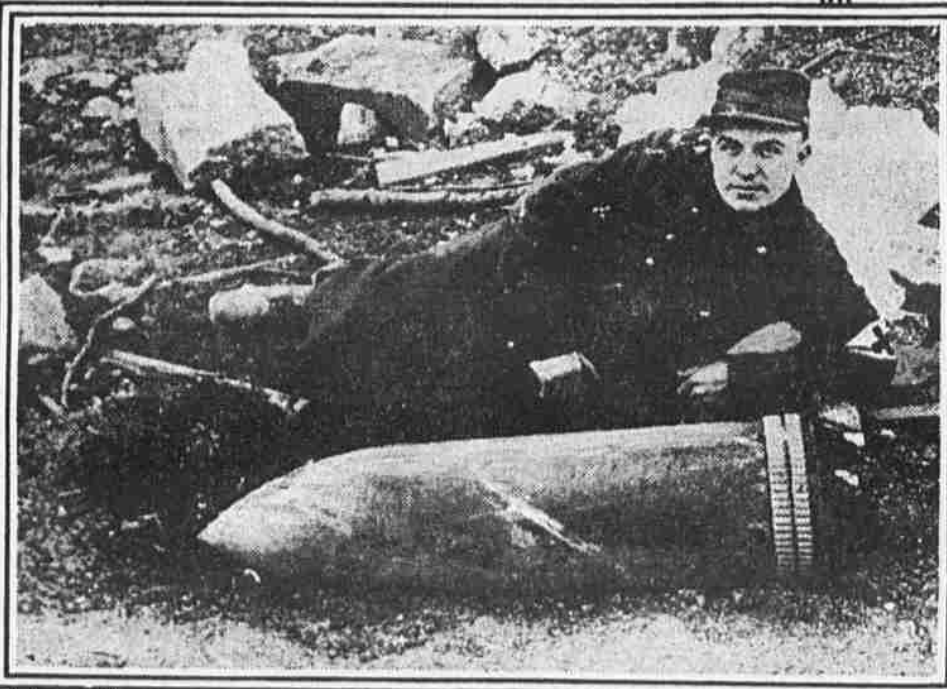

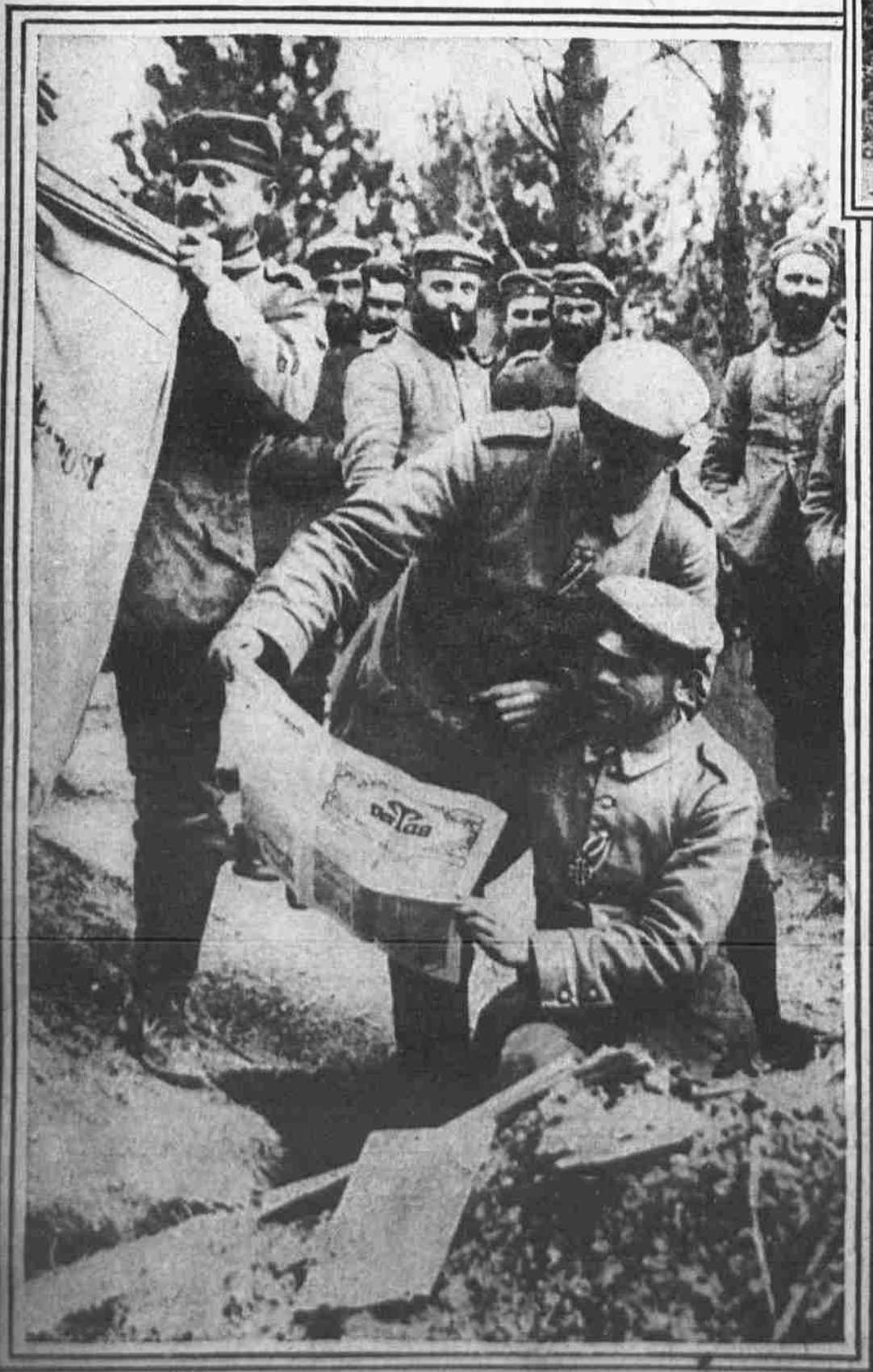
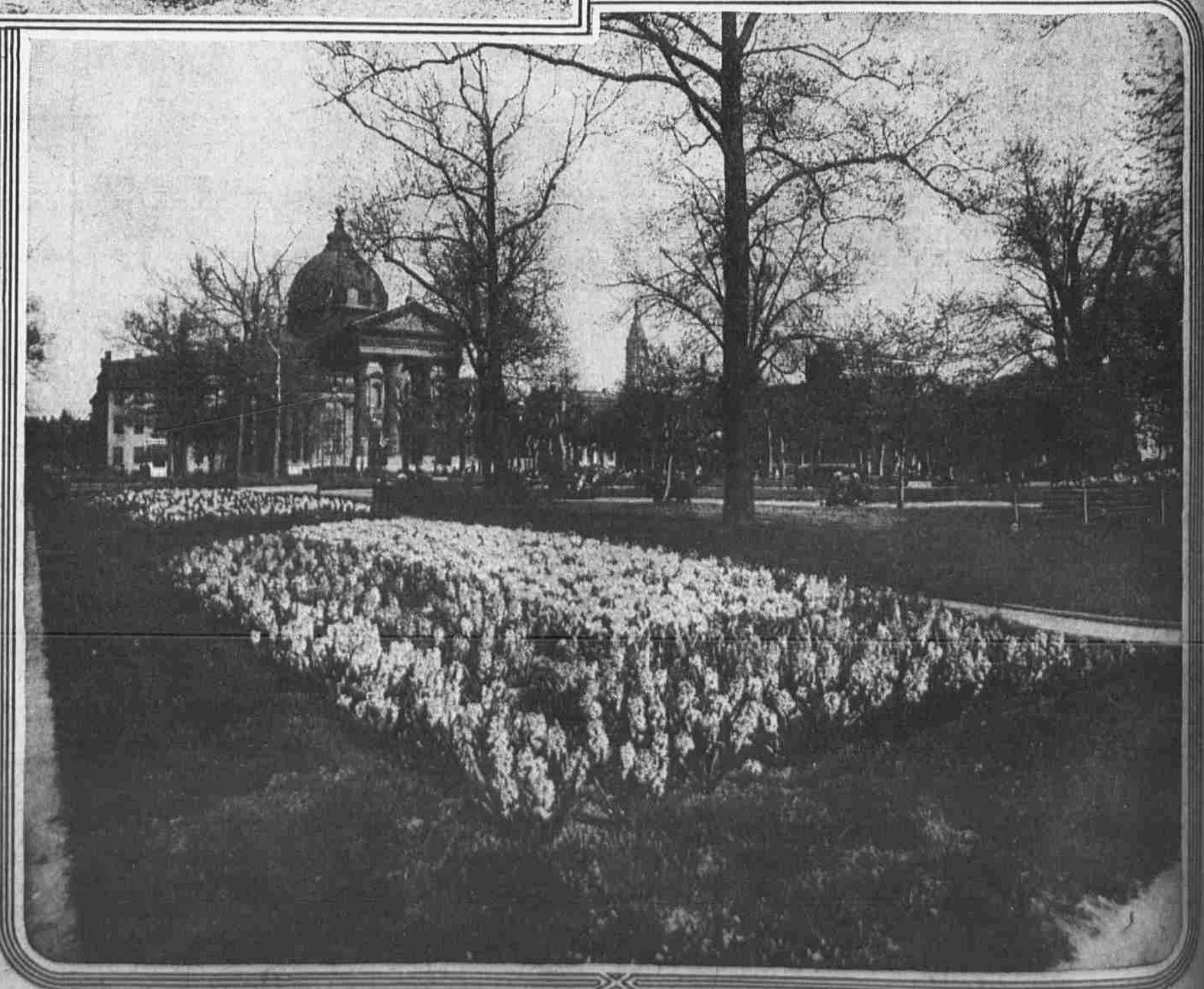
