

POPE HOPEFUL AMERICAN INTERVENTION MAY END WAR

Quirinal Announces Pontiff's Sovereignty Will Be Strictly Respected. ROME, June 1. Pope Benedict XV at an audience granted today to Bishop Thomas F. Kennedy and a number of newly consecrated American prelates expressed the hope that America would use its best efforts to bring an end to the European war. The audience was one of the very few so far granted by His Holiness since Italy entered the war. The Pope today granted a special dispensation to religious in seclusion, enabling the use of convents and monasteries as hospitals. An official announcement from the Quirinal today said that the Italian Government will take no steps during the war that may be construed as threatening the sovereignty of the Pope. This fact has been communicated to foreign powers.
