

# MRS. VANDERBECK BEATS MRS. BARLOW AT GOLF—IDENTITY OF "MR. RYAN" DISCOVERED

## MYSTERIOUS ATHLETE RYAN, OF ATHLETICS, IS LEWIS A. MALONE

Young Second Baseman Who Has Been Playing Rattling Game for Mackmen in Mt. St. Joseph's College Star Athlete.

The mysterious Ryan, the collegian who has been playing second base for the Athletics, is in reality Lewis A. Malone, star of the Mount St. Joseph's College team, of Baltimore. Joe Engel, pitcher of the Washington Club, admitted today that this is the real name of the youngster who has been playing such fine ball at second base for the Athletics for the last two days.

Engel is a former student of St. Mary's College, of Emmittsburg, Md., and coached St. Mary's this spring. Mt. St. Mary's and Mt. St. Joseph's are bitter rivals on the diamond, and keep close tabs on the players and naturally Engel knew Malone well. When the Senators appeared at Shibe Park yesterday Engel recognized Malone at once, as he had played summer ball with him three seasons before.

Had it not been for the fact that St. Mary's and St. Joseph's are to meet for the championship this week, Engel would not have revealed the identity of Malone. Malone came to this city Sunday with the Mt. St. Joseph's team to play against Villanova at Villanova on Monday, but Manager Mack, who has had an agreement with the youngsters all this season, called on him and induced him to play with the Athletics instead.

Malone's teammates were sworn to secrecy and agreed to play without him on Monday. On Monday Malone made his debut with the Athletics under the name of Ryan and looked so good that Manager Mack intended to use him at second base until Lajoie returns to the game.

The revelation of the real identity of Malone will bar him from the final game of the season with St. Joseph's, and Manager Mack says that the lad will be signed to a contract and will remain here until he goes to Baltimore for the summer exercises at Mt. St. Joseph.

The game scheduled for today between the Athletics and Washington was postponed on account of rain and the teams will play a double-header tomorrow. Manager Mack says that he will use Wyckoff and Bresler on the mound for the Athletics, while Griffith will use Shaw and either Engel, Gallia or Boehling.

## GOLF TITLE LANDED BY MRS. VANDERBECK

Philadelphia Cricket Club Woman Wins Eastern Golf Association's Championship.

HAVERFORD, Pa., June 2.—Mrs. Clarence H. Vanderbeck, of the Philadelphia Cricket Club, won the Woman's Eastern Golf Association championship here today with a score of 180 for the 36 holes. She began her round this morning two strokes worse than Mrs. Ronald H. Barlow, but she easily won this deficit and finished up six strokes better than Mrs. Barlow with 92 strokes against 100.

Considering that the weather was of the most miserable description, Mrs. Vanderbeck played wonderful golf, and her performance demonstrated beyond a shadow of a doubt that she is playing better golf now than ever before in her career. Mrs. Barlow and Mrs. Vanderbeck each had 45 strokes on the first nine holes, but coming in Mrs. Vanderbeck went right away from her opponent with 44 to 52. Under any conditions a 4 would be excellent, but today it was nothing short of wonderful. Miss Harriet Curtis, of Essex County, came in third with 183.

In the 11 years that the Eastern championship has been held, Mrs. Barlow has won it three times in 1911, 1912 and 1913, and Mrs. Vanderbeck's victory today marks the only other success of local players. It also marks Mrs. Vanderbeck's first important golf victory outside of purely local events.

Mrs. H. R. Stockton, Plainfield, N. J., won the handicap for 35 holes with a net score of 184. Mrs. Raymond Scott, Philadelphia, was second with 185, and Mrs. J. C. F. Huntington, Valley Forge, Pa., was third with 186.

With the Eastern championship concluded the stage is set for the inter-city matches for the Clement A. Griscom cup. Boston plays New York tomorrow and on Friday Philadelphia plays the loser. On Saturday the winners of Thursday and Friday play for the trophy, which was won last year by the Women's Golf Association of Philadelphia.
