JUDGE GRAY INVOKES PEACE IN LAW'S NAME

Eminent Jurist Tells N. J. Bar United States Should Lead Way.

ATLANTIC CITY, June 12.—How lamentable it seems that all the hopeful efforts made during the last decade toward accomplishing permanent peace among the nations of the earth, efforts that were engaging the best thought and experience of the civilized world, should have been so cruelly interrupted by the unprecedented savagery of war, which in some of its practices seems little less than a reversion to barbarism.

"Amid all the savagery and lawlessness which have been engendered by this unprecedented strife, respect for international law has not entirely perished; its precepts are still appealed to by the warring nations and its obligations are recognized even in their violation.
