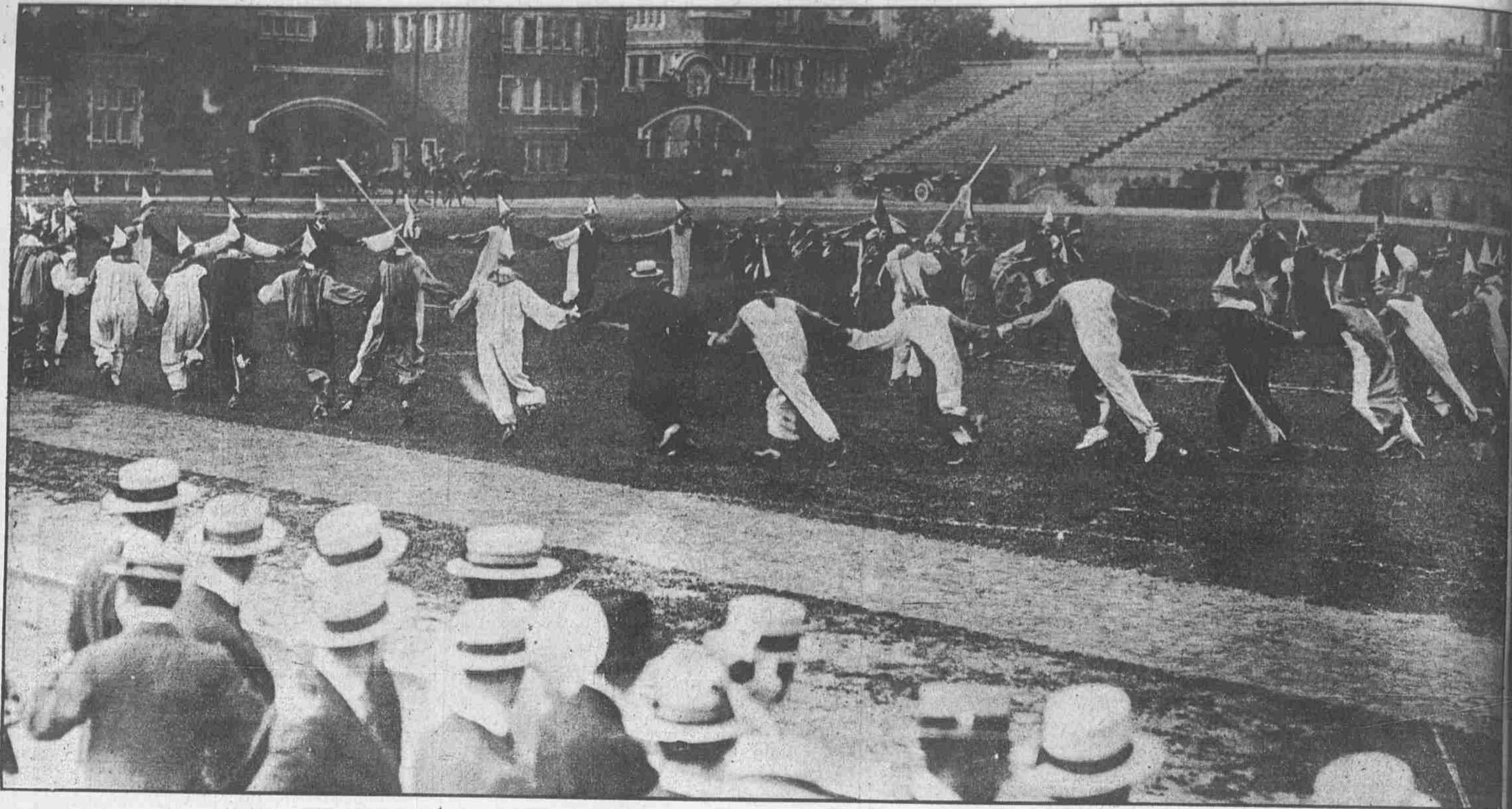




ALUMNI AT PENNSYLVANIA AND AT PRINCETON JOIN IN FANTASTIC AND SPECTACULAR PARADES



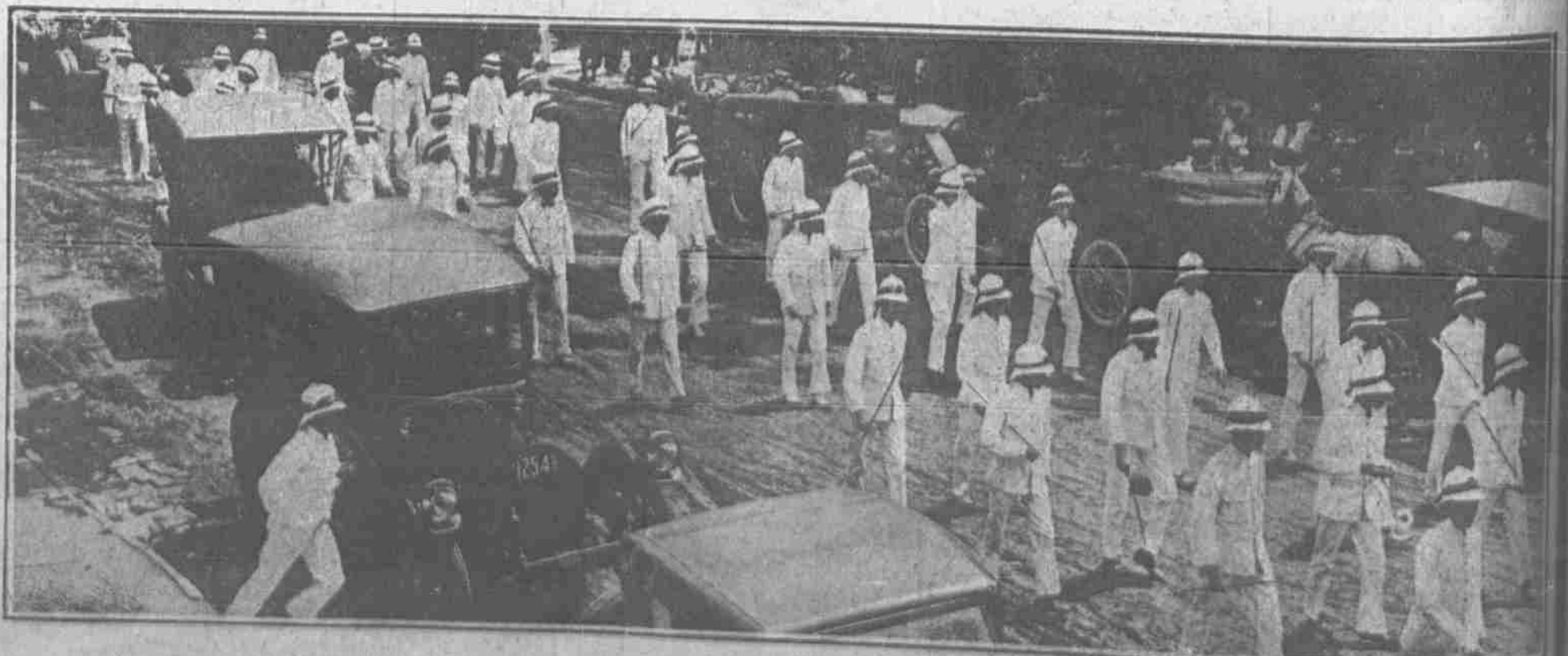
THE YOUNGER CLASSES SHOWED THE WAY TO THE OLDER GRADUATES AT PENN
