J. C. DAVIDSON LANDS ATLANTIC GOLF TITLE AT WILMINGTON CLUB

Columbia C. C. Man Defeats Fellow Clubman, E. B. Eynon, Jr., 5 up and 4 to Play in a Rather Different Exhibition.

WILMINGTON, Del., June 13.—J. Davidson, of the Columbia Country Club, Washington, won the Middle Atlantic Golf Association championship at the Wilmington Country Club today. In the final round he defeated a fellow club member, E. B. Eynon, Jr., after a rather indifferent exhibition of golf, 5 up and 4 to play.

Davidson returned a really good medal score of 28 out, and three over four to the fourteenth coming home, but that was the result of his high-class putting, the one redeeming feature of the match.

Davidson won four holes of the first nine and lost two, so was 2 up at the 11th hole. On one of the holes, the 13th, Eynon picked up after playing his fourth into a ditch, while his opponent was on the green in two. Davidson, coming in, won the 11th, where he laid Eynon a dead stroke, and the 13th and 14th, where the match ended.

FEDERALS WILL BUILD BIG PARK IN NEW YORK FOR SEASON OF 1916

Finley J. Shepard and Henry C. Frick Reported Behind Plans for Rival Ball Club—Stadium to Be Biggest in Country.

NEW YORK, June 18.—The Federal League will have a club in New York city in 1916. The team will be transferred from one of the other cities in the western end of the Federal circuit.
