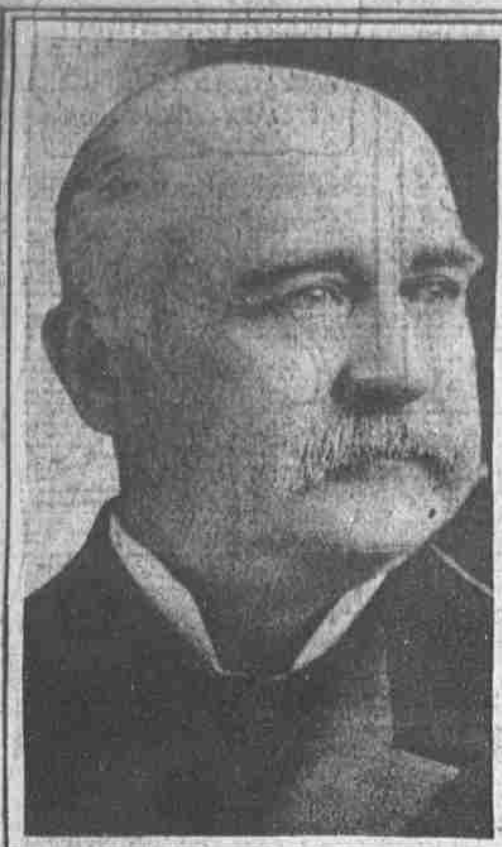




WHOM WILL YOU VOTE FOR AS THE CITIZEN OF THE STATE MOST DESERVING OF SIGNAL HONOR?
