

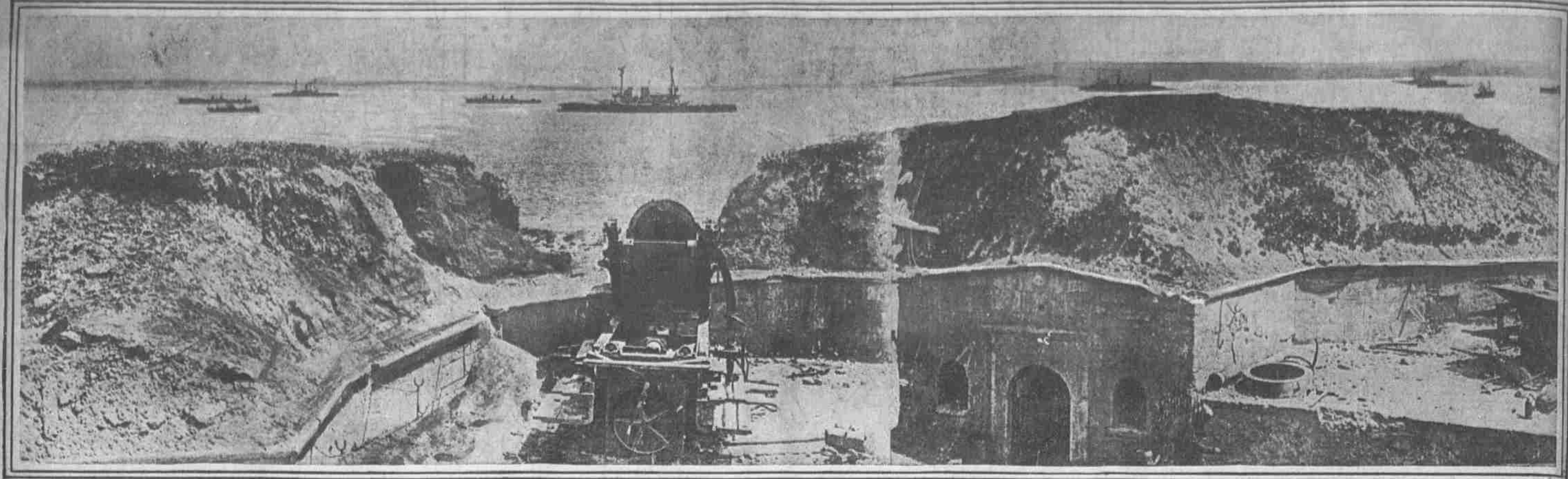

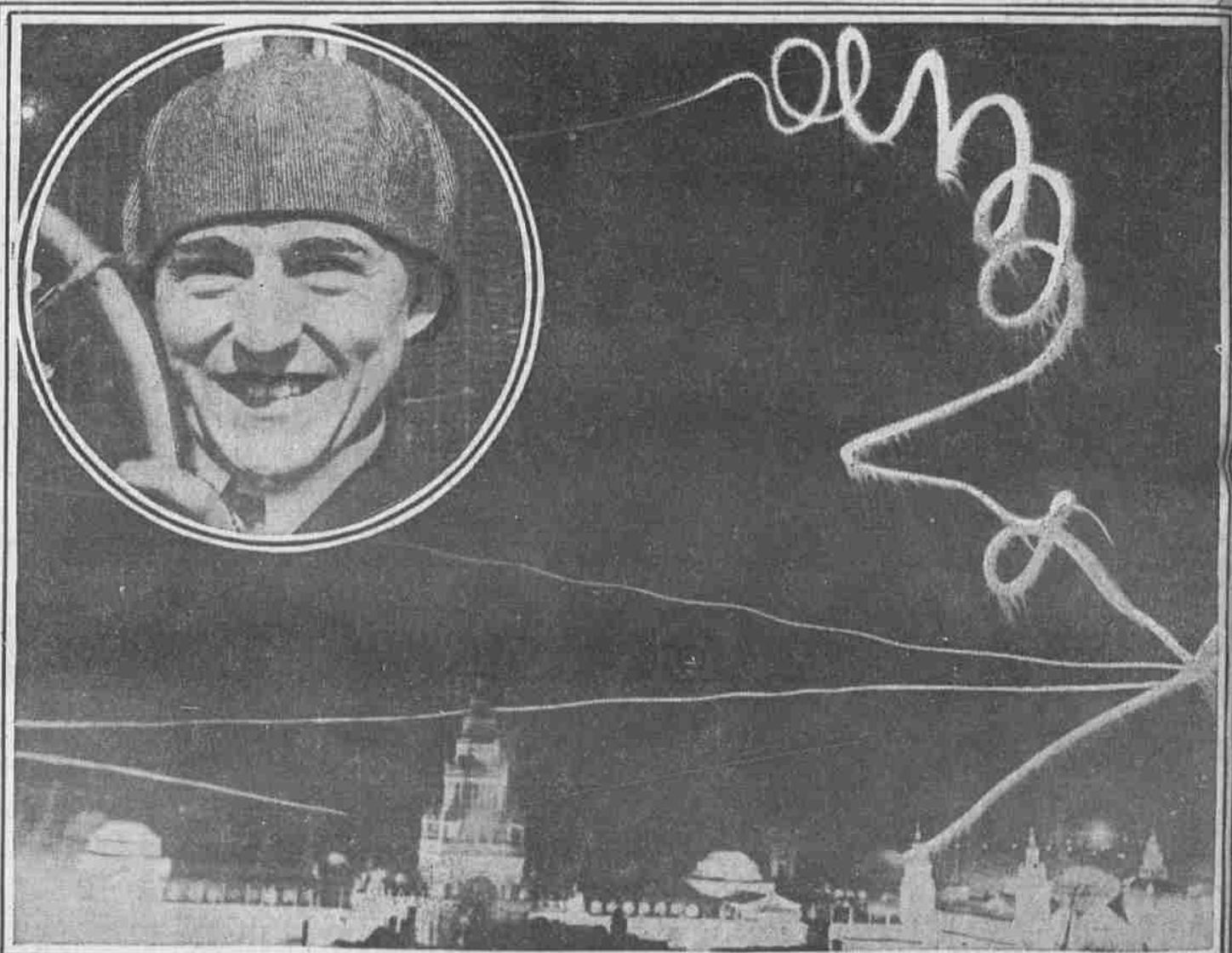

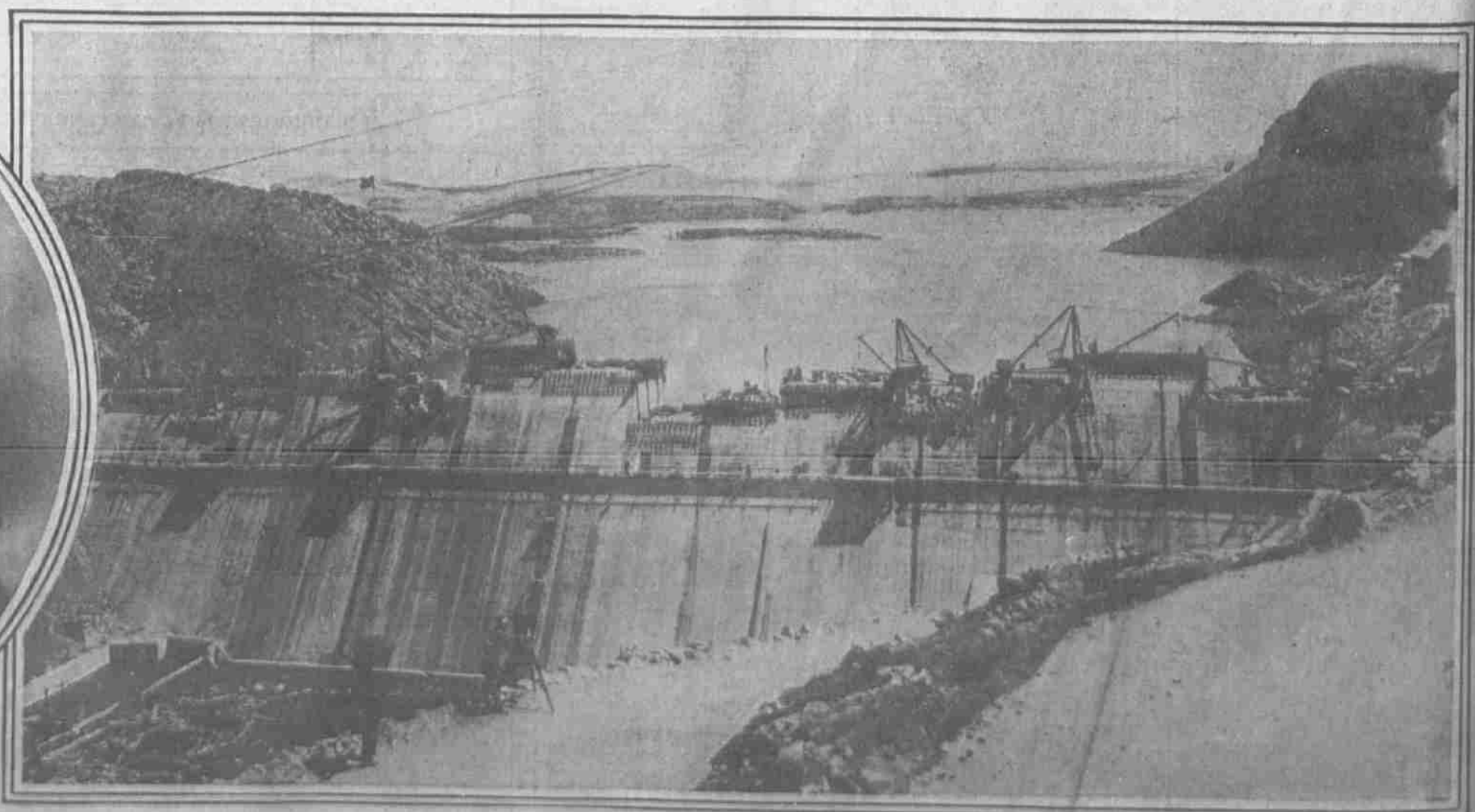
DARING YOUNG AVIATOR MAKES NIGHT FLIGHTS IN ILLUMINATED MACHINE

ONE OF THE WORLD'S GREATEST IRRIGATION PROJECTS NEAR COMPLETION
