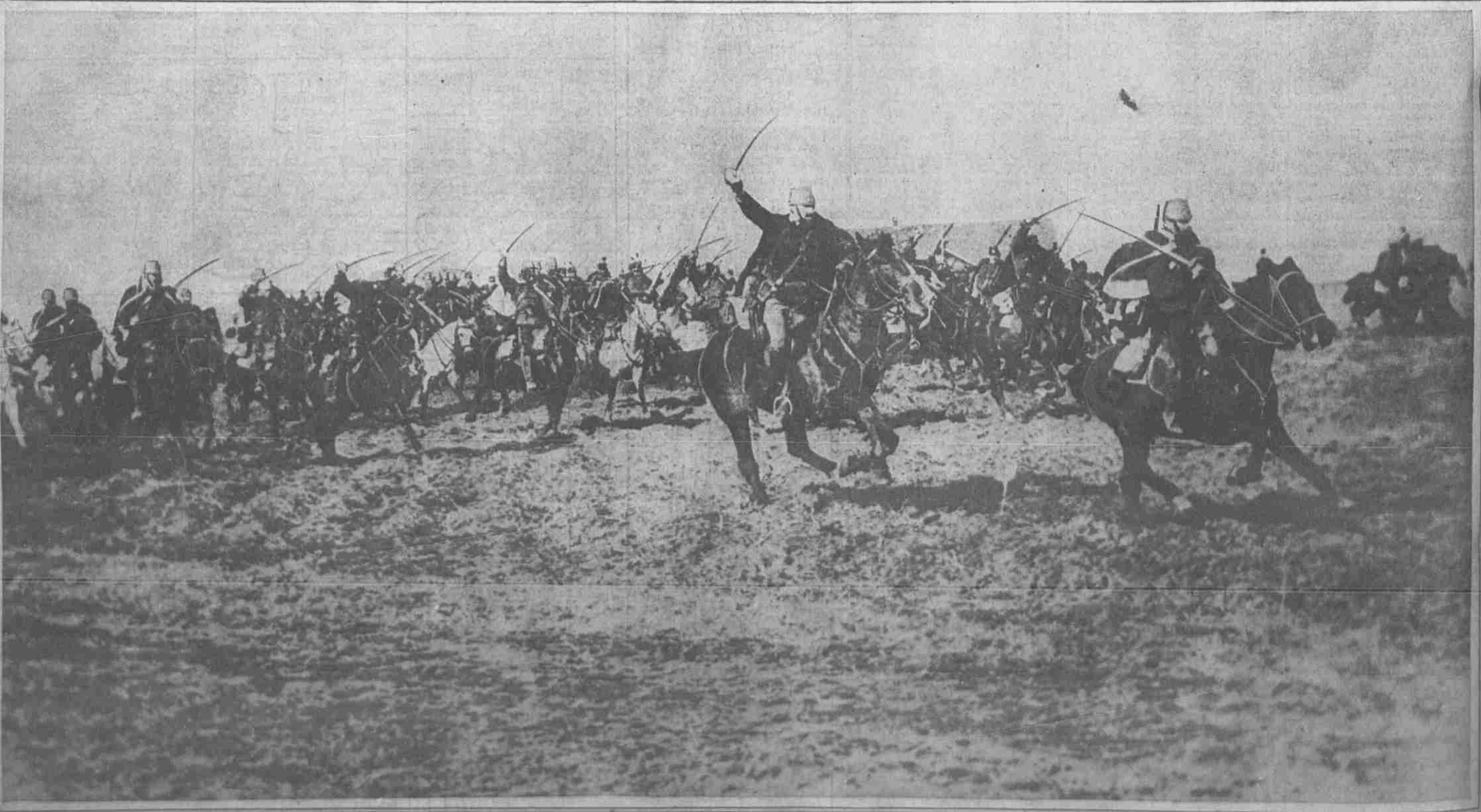

CHARGE OF FRENCH TROOPS ON HILL POSITION HELD BY GERMANS AND HUNGARIAN CAVALRY IN MASSED DRIVE AGAINST RETREATING RUSSIANS

The upper photograph illustrates one of the most dramatic incidents in the recent ferocious fighting around the hills of Carency. It shows a company of French infantry, led by their captain, dashing to the assault of Notre Dame de Lorette. One soldier is seen falling, another has dropped. The taking of Notre Dame de Lorette was rated as one of the most brilliant achievements of the campaign in that region. French troops ever have had the reputation of being at their best in the charge. The lower picture shows one of the crack regiments of mounted Hungarians assisting in the series of rushing attacks, over a wide front, that eventually drove the Czar's forces out of Galicia and carried them well into their own territory. The Austro-German armies made it their business to give the Russians no rest, but constantly harried their rear guard forces in an endeavor to turn the retreat into a wholesale rout. In this campaign cavalry attacks played a leading part.
