

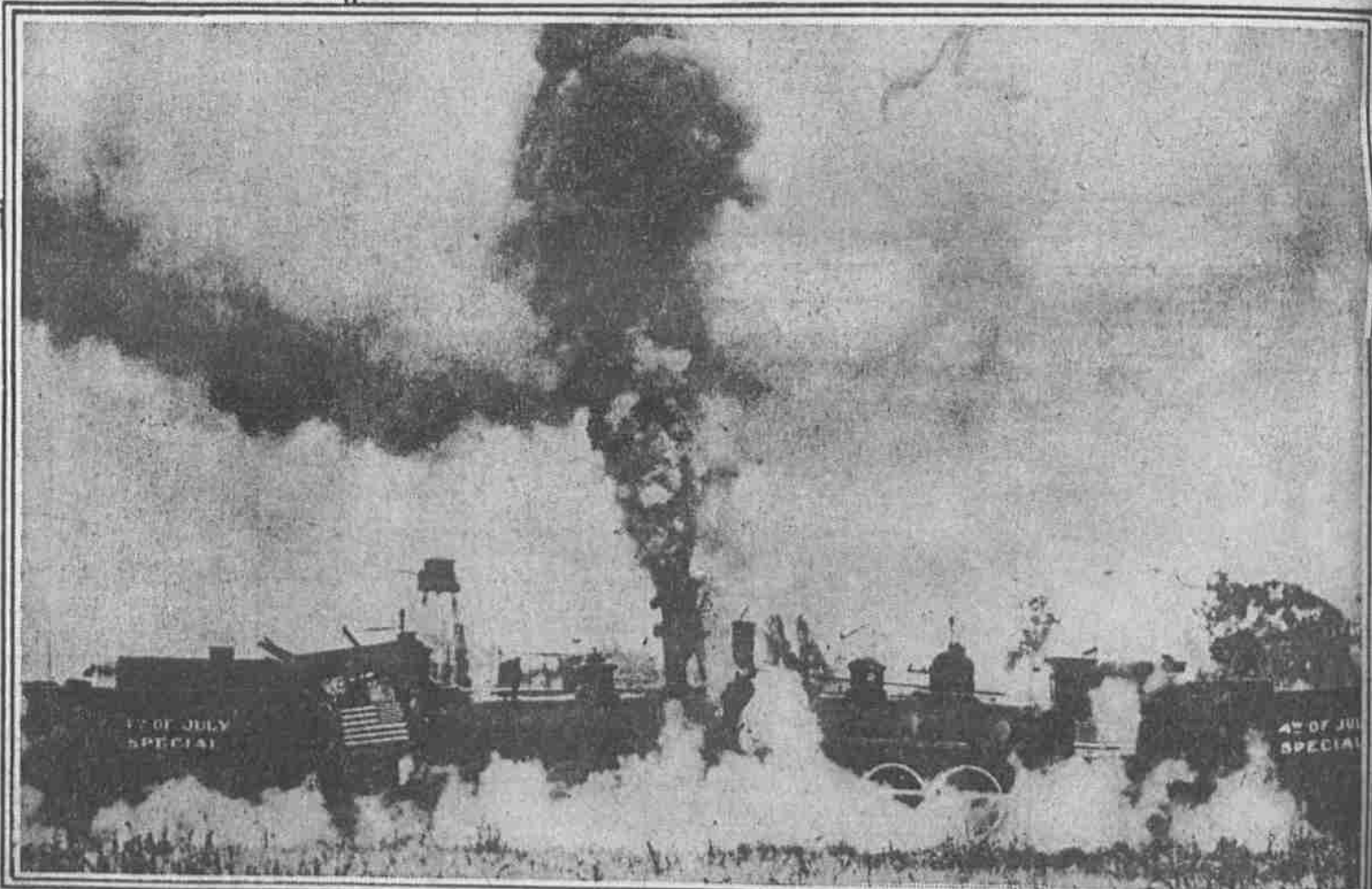

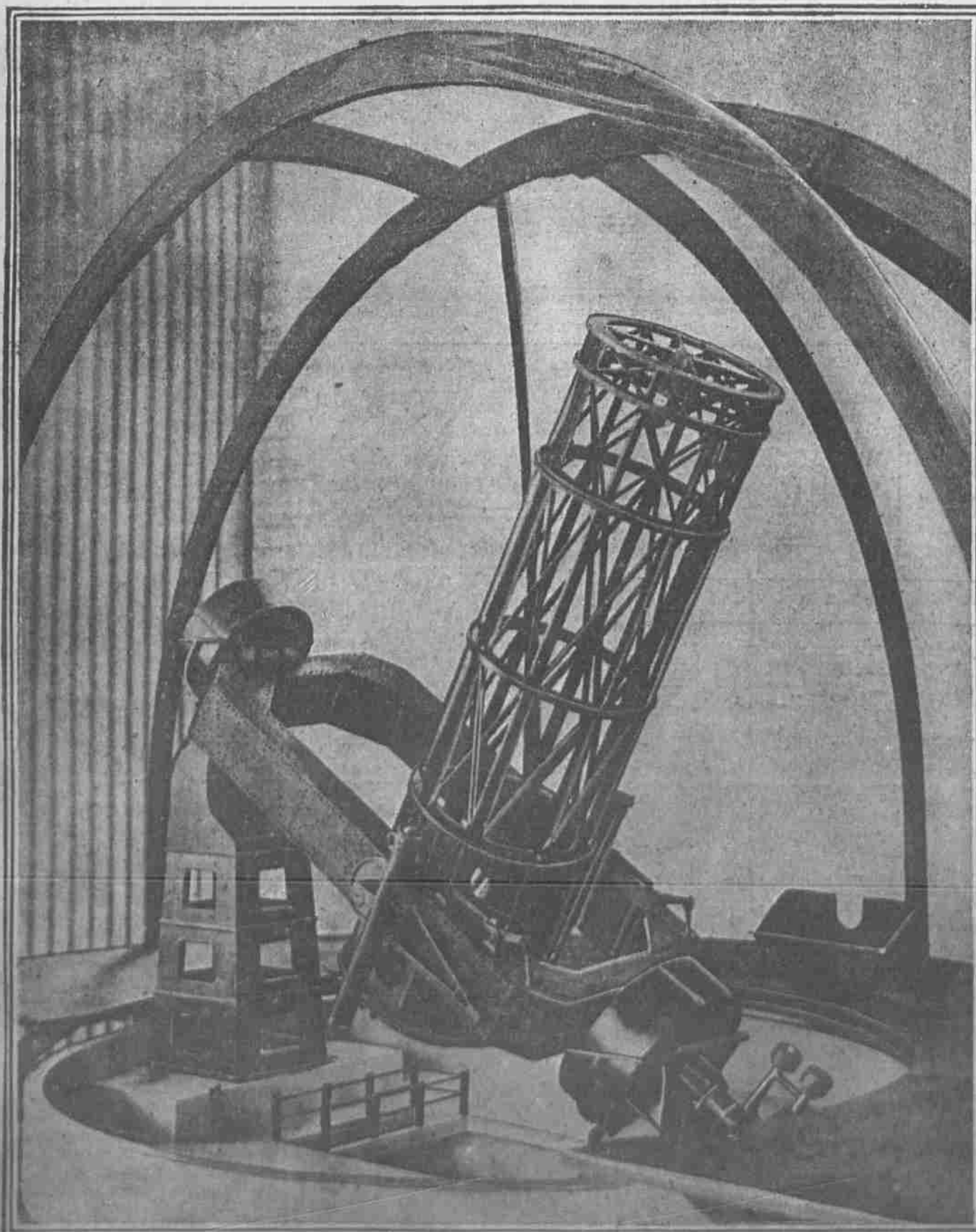


RICHEST GIRL TO WED ONE OF HER EMPLOYEES
