Walnut, Best for Rifle Grows Scarce and Price Mounts.

Walnut lumber from which to make rifles may be one of the factors of the war. The European countries are local firearms manufacturers. Black walnut, the wood from which all stocks are made, is becoming scarcer and more expensive.

Several European nations have sent orders to the United States for more than 100,000 walnut rifle stocks. This means that a tremendous quantity of this lumber will have to be produced with the wood, at its present price, the cost of the completed stocks would be prohibitive.
