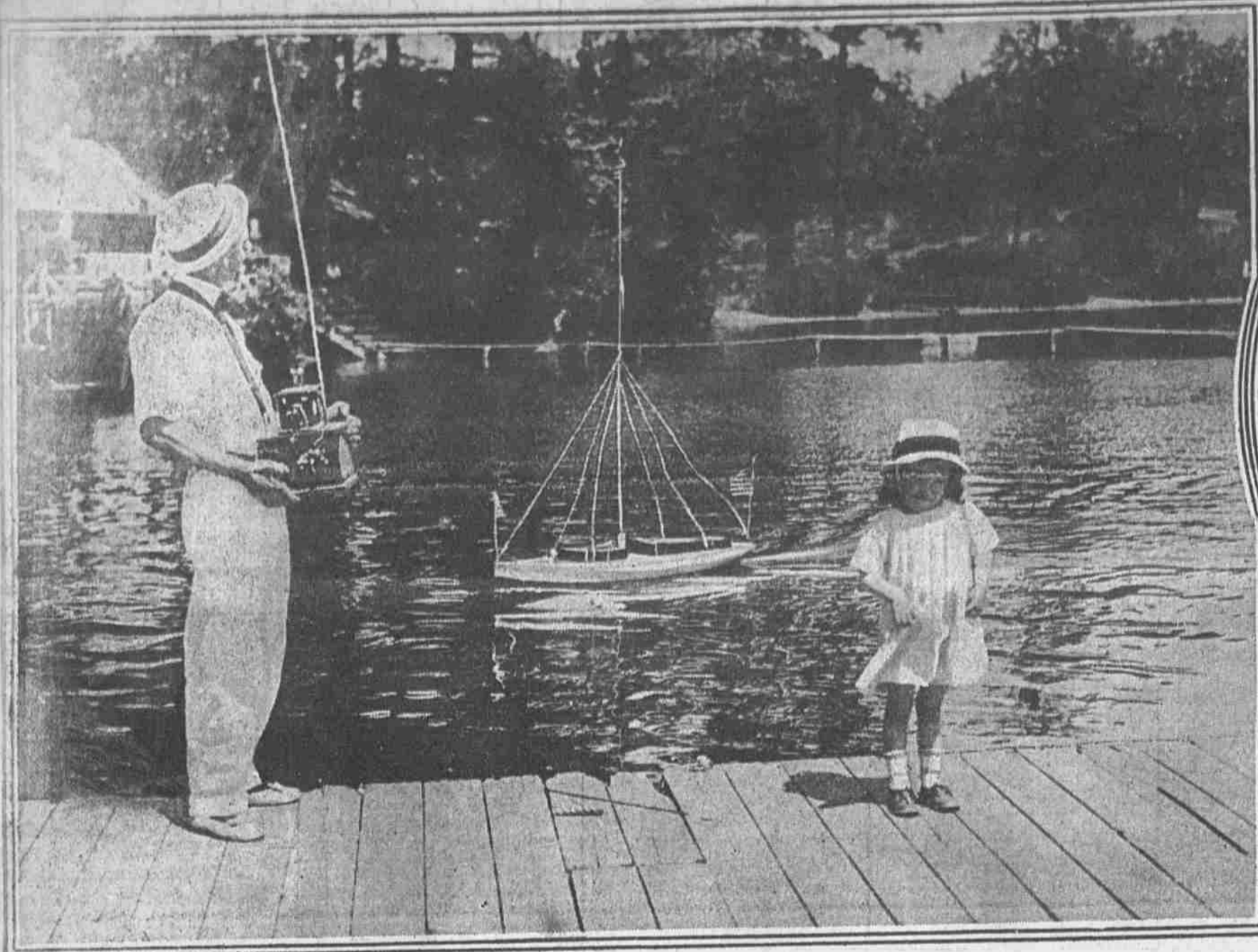

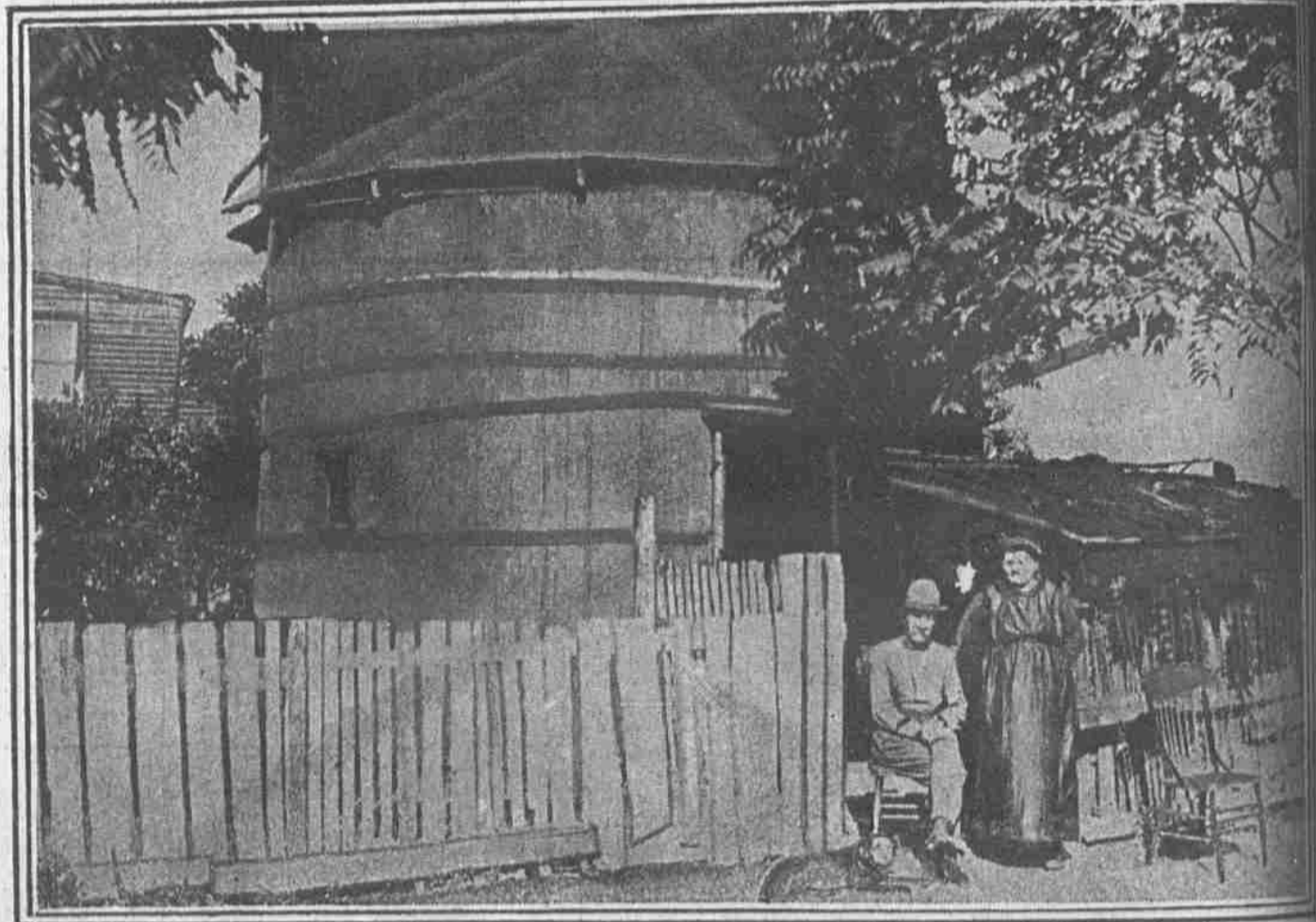


MOST BEAUTIFUL OF RUSSIANS
Mme. Ratmirova, singer, is declared to be the most beautiful Russian woman London ever saw. She is wearing the national headdress, the kokochnik.



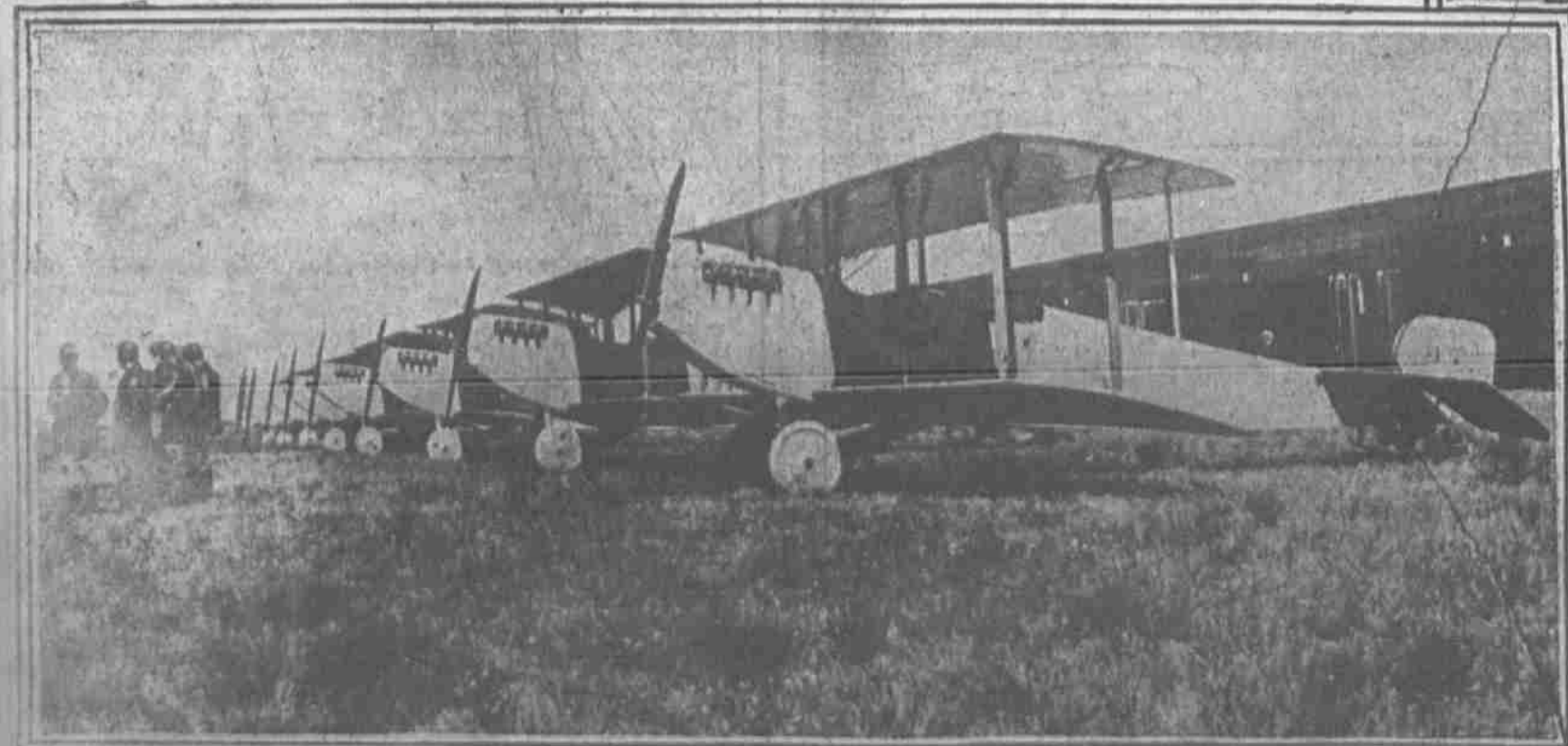
DELAWARE FARM WIVES GET EXPERT INSTRUCTION

UNIQUE SUN DIAL TELLS TIME FOR HARVARD FRESHMEN

This dial on Smith Hall has a steel rod projecting from the face in such a way that it throws a shadow as the earth revolves around the sun, over the figures, one, two, three, etc. Unlike a clock, the figures 12 and 1 are at the bottom of the face instead of at the top. The half hours are indicated by lines between the hours.
