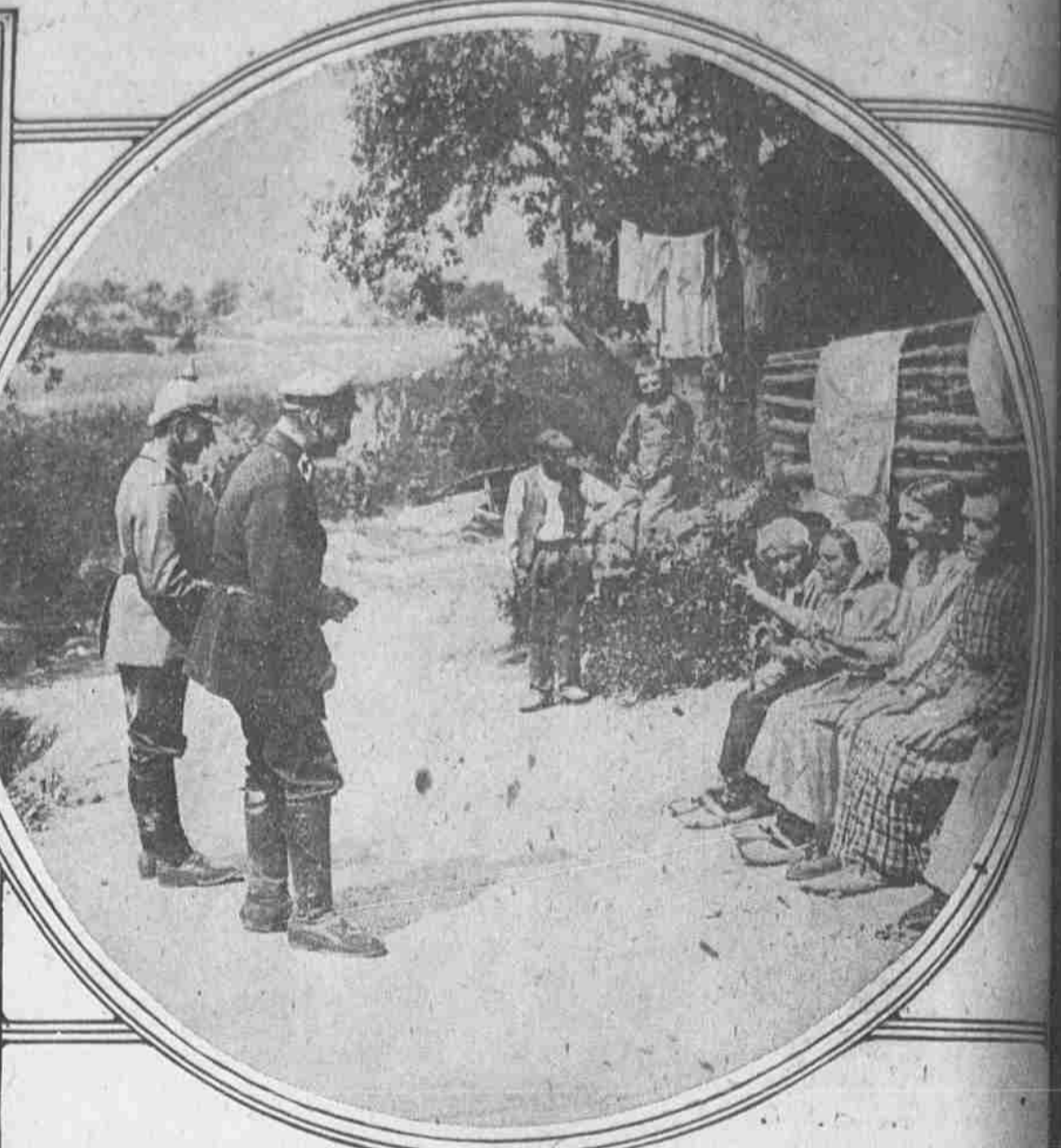
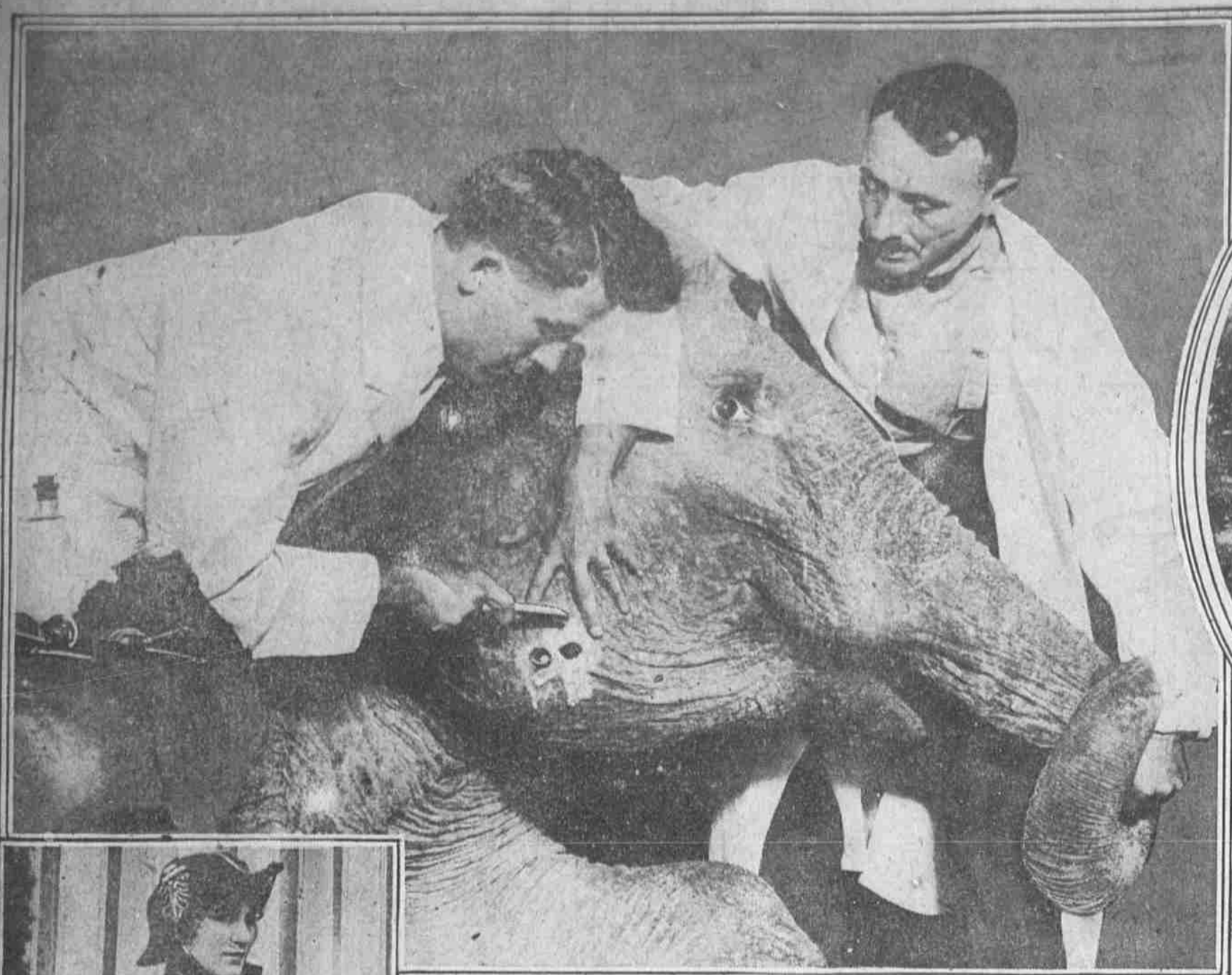

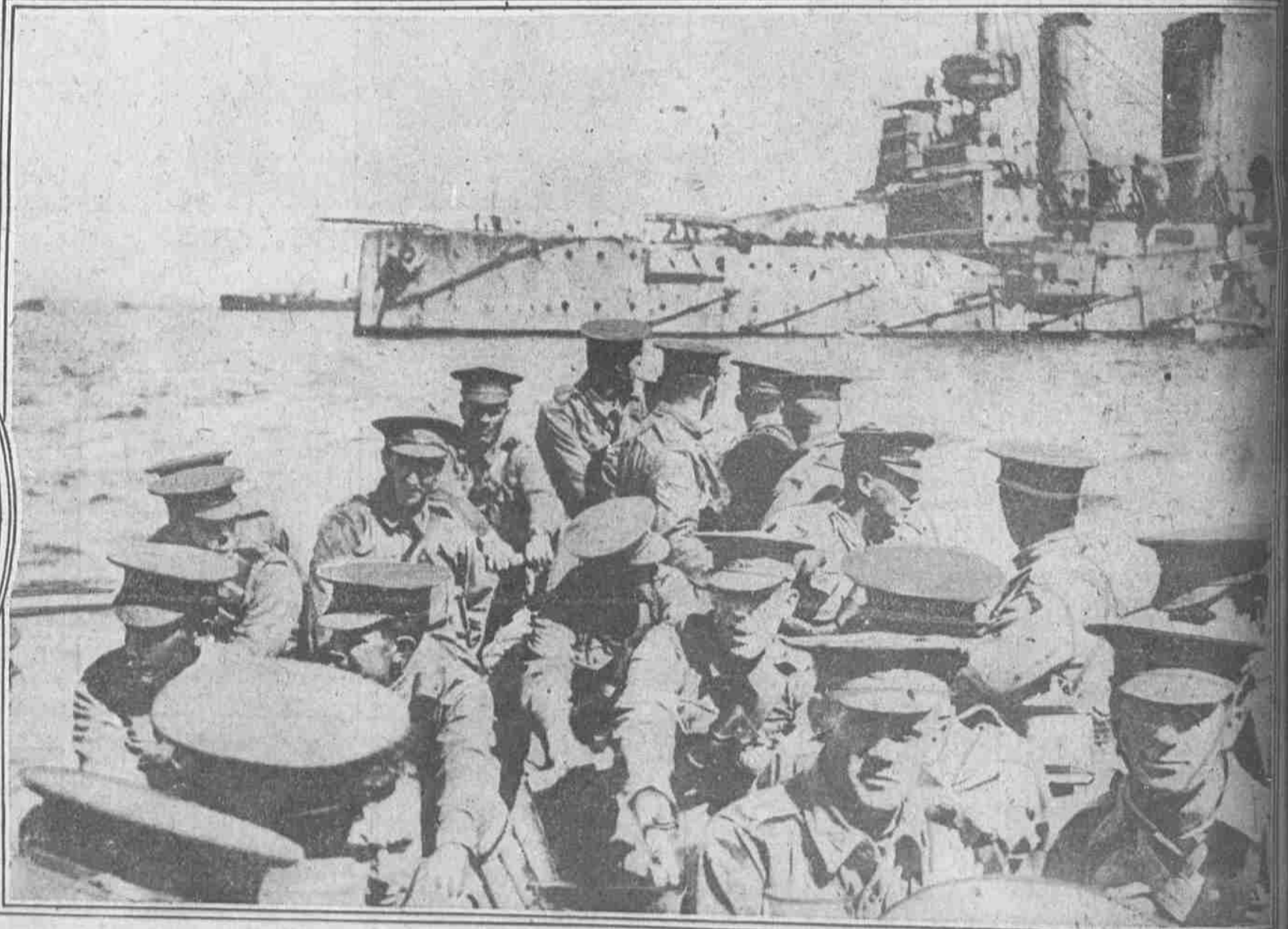


**WAR'S EFFECT ON BRITISH FASHIONS**  
The photo shows a woman with a hat modeled after the naval model and known as the Jellicoe hat, in honor of the famous admiral, worn in combination with a military cape.

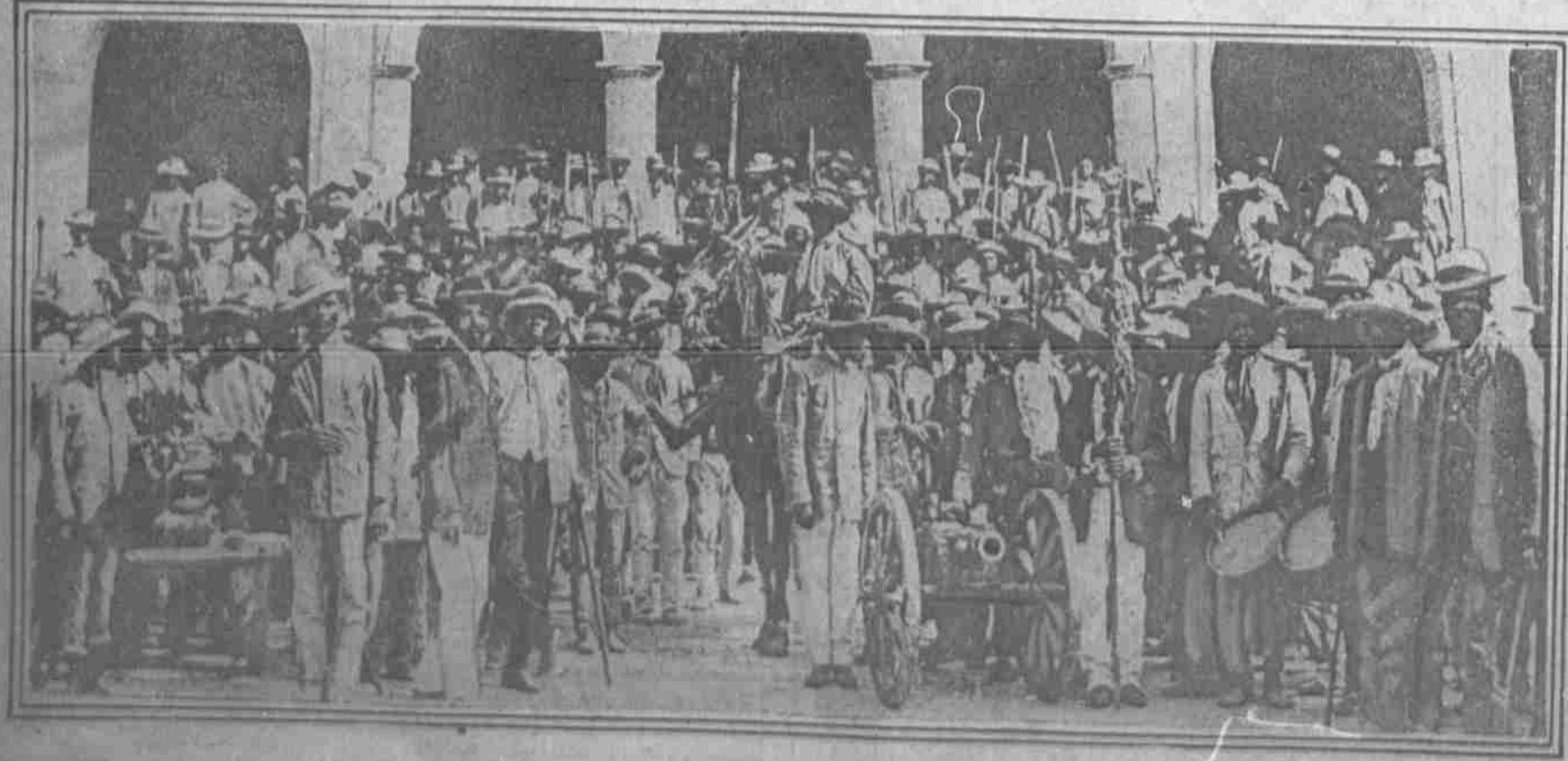
