Curiously Elder watched her, the woman he had loved for years. Varied

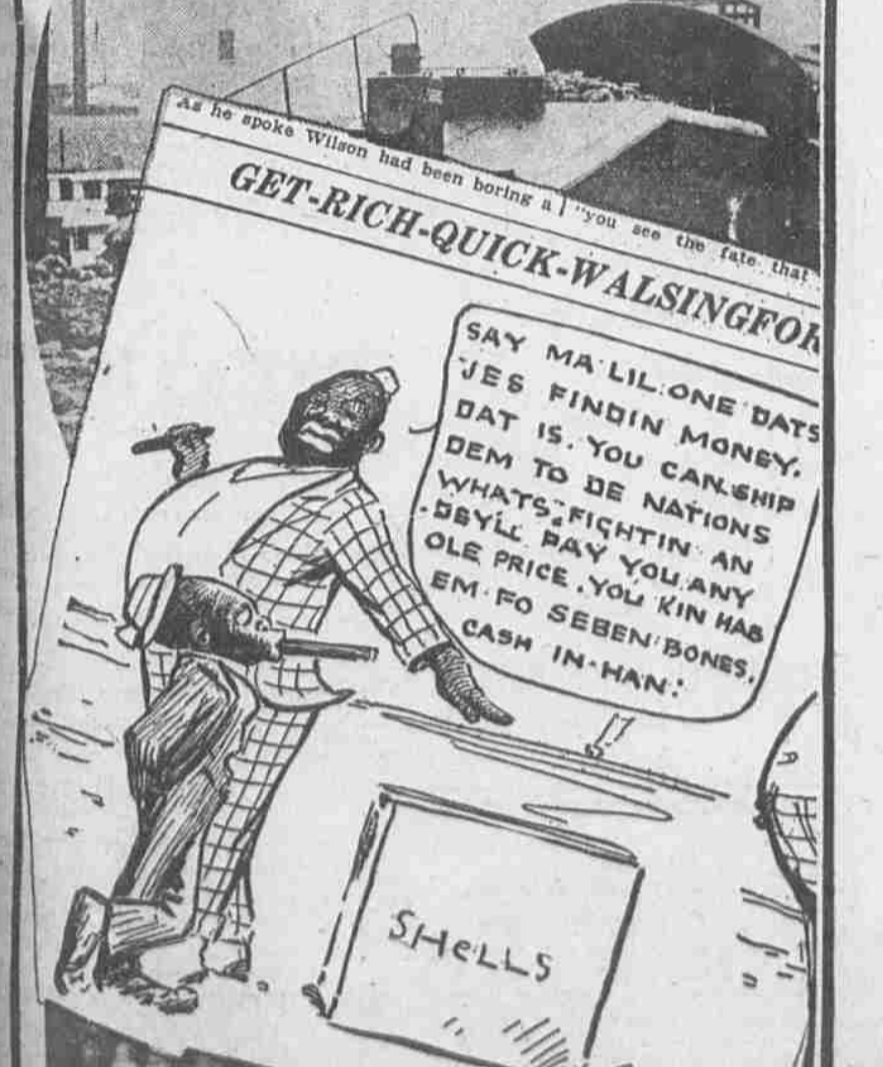
