

RECOVERY FOLLOWED

BREAK IN GRAINS

Heavy Export Sales Reported.
Corn and Oats Were

CHICAGO, Sept. 8.—Weakness in Winnipeg sent the support afforded the grain market late yesterday by short covering tumbling and prices sagged at the opening. The Government's official prediction of record crops was considered bearish, which was another strong factor on the decline. Shorts, seeking profits, covered. One house is said to have purchased 1,000,000 bushels of corn on the market and a similar amount at Minneapolis. Considerable selling of wheat took place

In the early hours on the Winnipeg Bourse, Minneapolis stocks have shrunk 70,000. In the last five days, against a 200-50-basis increase in the same period a year ago.

Selling of securities was scattered. It opened at 94, 4c. higher than the final quotation yesterday. Before noon it stood at 93 1/2, but rallied a trifle later.

There was a rush to sell May, which opened at 94 1/2, against 95 1/2, the closing quotation of yesterday. Before noon it sold for 94 1/2.

May opened at 96 1/2. Yesterday it closed at 95 1/2. The undertone was weak, and nearly 1 cent loss was recorded before noon.

Recoveries were in order later in the day, final figures showing gains for the month.

It was rumored that the break brought heavy export sales. This could not be verified. Sales reported totaled 75,000 bushels of Manitoba, with Chicago cash handlers selling for seaboard delivery; 60,000 bushels of wheat and 250,000 bushels of oats.

Corn and oats were fairly firm with little change in prices, but the movement declined in sympathy with wheat.
