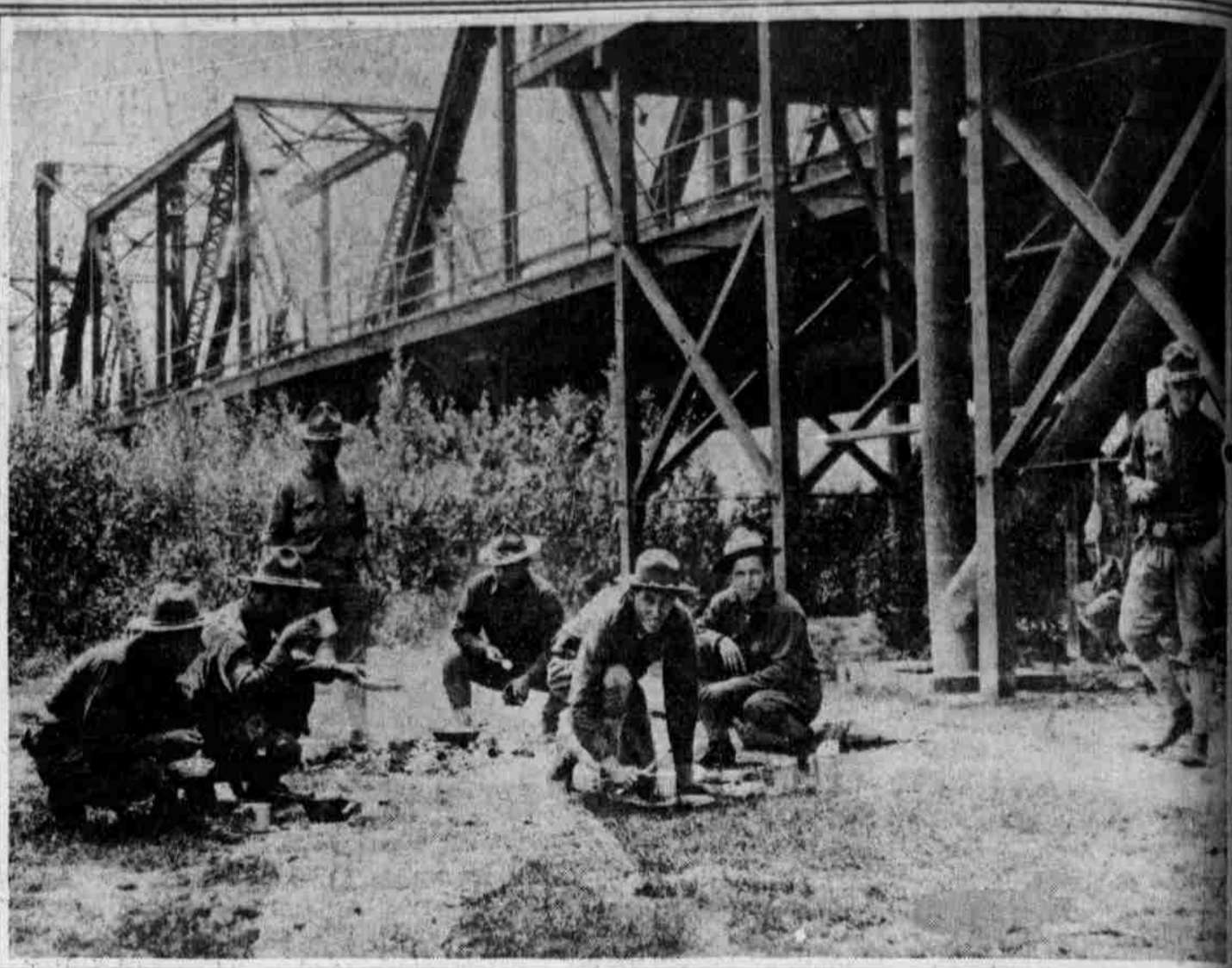


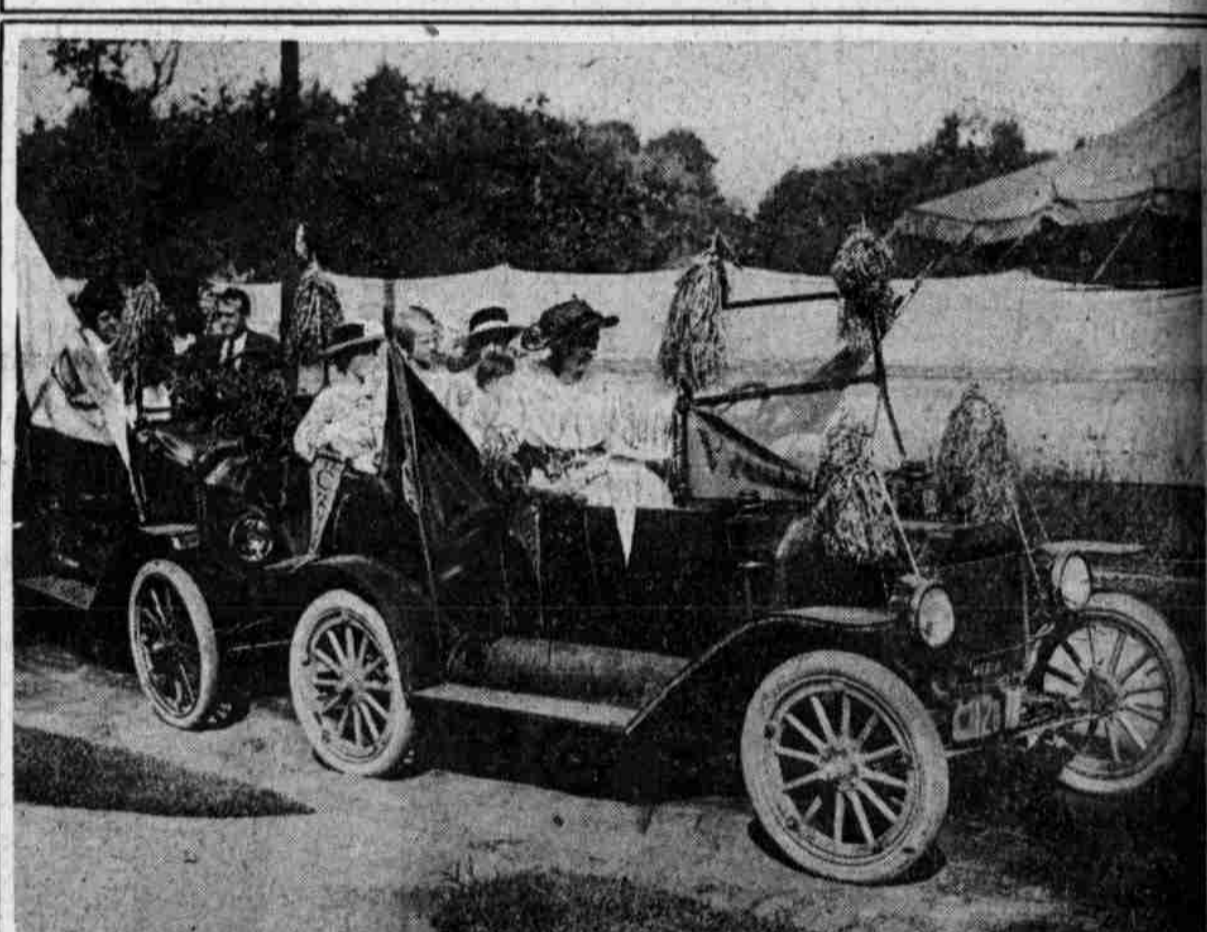

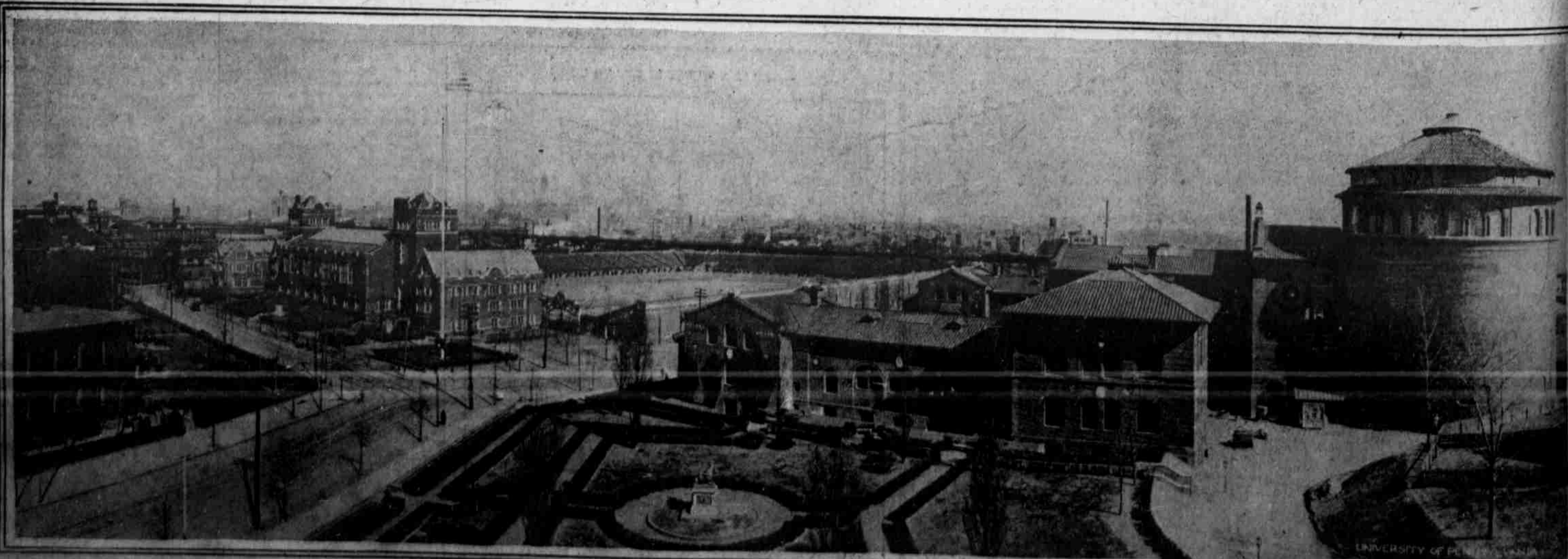
AMERICAN TROOPS ON GUARD AT BRIDGE OVER THE RIO GRANDE

NEW PANORAMA OF UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA CAMPUS, SHOWING RECENTLY COMPLETED MEMORIAL TOWER WHICH HAS AN AUDITORIUM WITHOUT WINDOWS
In the basement of the Memorial Tower, seen at right, is an auditorium unequalled elsewhere in this country. The auditorium is absolutely circular and believed to be as nearly perfect in an acoustic sense as science can produce. Speaking scarcely above a whisper, one can be heard all over the room. Perfect acoustic properties have been obtained because the room is circular, the ceiling is a dome and the walls are constructed of different kinds of tile. There is not a corner to smother sounds and the tile of the wall is of two kinds to prevent echoes. The first six feet of the wall is made of a dense tile which absorbs the sounds. The remainder of the wall and the ceiling is made of porous tile. The auditorium and the tower, which rises 90 feet above the city, are further distinguished by the fact that not a piece of steel or iron have been used in their construction. The walls are of brick. The tower rises 90 feet above the ceiling of the auditorium and is 20 feet in diameter. The architecture is an adaptation of Lombardic Romanesque. The auditorium contains no windows, but is artificially lighted and ventilated.
