COMMERCE CHAMBER STARTS ON CAMPAIGN TO GET CONVENTIONS Special Committee Gets Data From Members Regarding Organizations That Might Be Brought Here WOULD BRING MILLIONS

From \$10,000,000 to \$12,000,000 annually can be brought to Philadelphia by drawing conventions to this city. This keynote in a campaign launched today is spurring the city's business men to greater efforts to attract conventions. "All together for Philadelphia" is the slogan.

The Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, through its Convention Bureau, has begun a systematic campaign to bring conventions here. Letters and blank forms were sent to all its members yesterday by N. B. Kelly, general secretary, asking for information regarding any organizations to which they belong.

The builders will thus have on record the names and addresses of the officers and the Philadelphia members, the time and frequency of conventions, the place of the next meeting, the number of delegates appointed and the number who usually attend, the number of visitors received and other information which would be of aid in determining the desirability of having the convention in this city.

If the business men get together in a systematic campaign, they can bring from \$10,000,000 to \$12,000,000 to this city that now goes to other communities," said Mr. Kelly. "This emphasizes the importance of the work of the convention bureau and it is hoped that every member will give hearty support. Philadelphia stands pre-eminent in its ability properly to entertain large assemblies and as the world's greatest workshop and historic city we feel justly proud when inviting strangers here."
