

STEEPLECHASE MARK IS SET AT BELMONT

Twenty-four Jumpers Carded to Go at United Hunts Meeting Saturday

With 85 entries already in hand and chances favoring a number of additions, the two-day autumn meeting of the United Hunts Racing Association, to be held at Belmont Park Terminal next Saturday afternoon and the Saturday afterneon following, promises to produce two red-letter days for the thousands of dev-orces of thoroughbred racing in this vi-

Twenty-four horses have already been Twenty-four horses have already been named to start in the fifth race, a handicap steepischase for 2-year-olds and upward, to be run the second day of the meeting, and this is said to establish a new high mark for an "over-night" steepischase in this country.

The Trial Steepischase, for three-year-old, to be run next Saturday afternoon, has 13 entries to date, and the first and fifth races on the same day have drawn
