

FINANCE KILLS SINGER WHO PLACED CAREER ABOVE LOVE FOR HIM

Young Baritone Commits Suicide After Fatally Wounding Sweetheart Whose Voice Charmed Crowds

SANG IN "PRINCESS PAT" Miss Pearl Palmer, a talented soprano, known as Angela Palmer in Victor Herbert's light opera, "The Princess Pat," which closed its engagement at the Lyric Theatre in this city Saturday, died in New York today.

CORNERED RUSSIAN SHIPS ESCAPE FROM TURK CRUISER

LONDON, Sept. 27.—The former German cruiser Goeben (renamed the Sultan Selim after her purchase by the Turks) on her recent appearance in the Black Sea 50 miles from the Bosphorus, says a dispatch from Petrograd, hemmed in several Russian torpedo-boats, but the vessels escaped owing to skilful handling and poor shooting on the part of the cruiser.

The Sultan Selim in the middle of August was reported to have been torpedoed by a submarine of the Entente Allies near the Bosphorus.
