Take Negro Accused of Running Gambling House

The Merchants and Miners' liner Creed the vessel and placed Clem "Per-kins," a negro, under arrest for the al-leged conducting of a gambling house in Atlantic City. Perkins denied that he is the Clem Borden mentioned in the warrant. Detective Harbridge and Acting De-tective Cuniffe, of the 3d and De Lancey streets station, hurried to the steamship's wharf when word was received at City Hall that Borden had booked passage on the Cretan. They reached the pier as the vessel swung into midstream. Hur-

He was taken to City Hall and an urgent message was sent to the Atlantic City police for a photograph. When it arrived it proved, according to the detectives, that "Perkins" and Borden are the same. He will be arraigned at central station today and held for requisition papers from Atlantic City.
