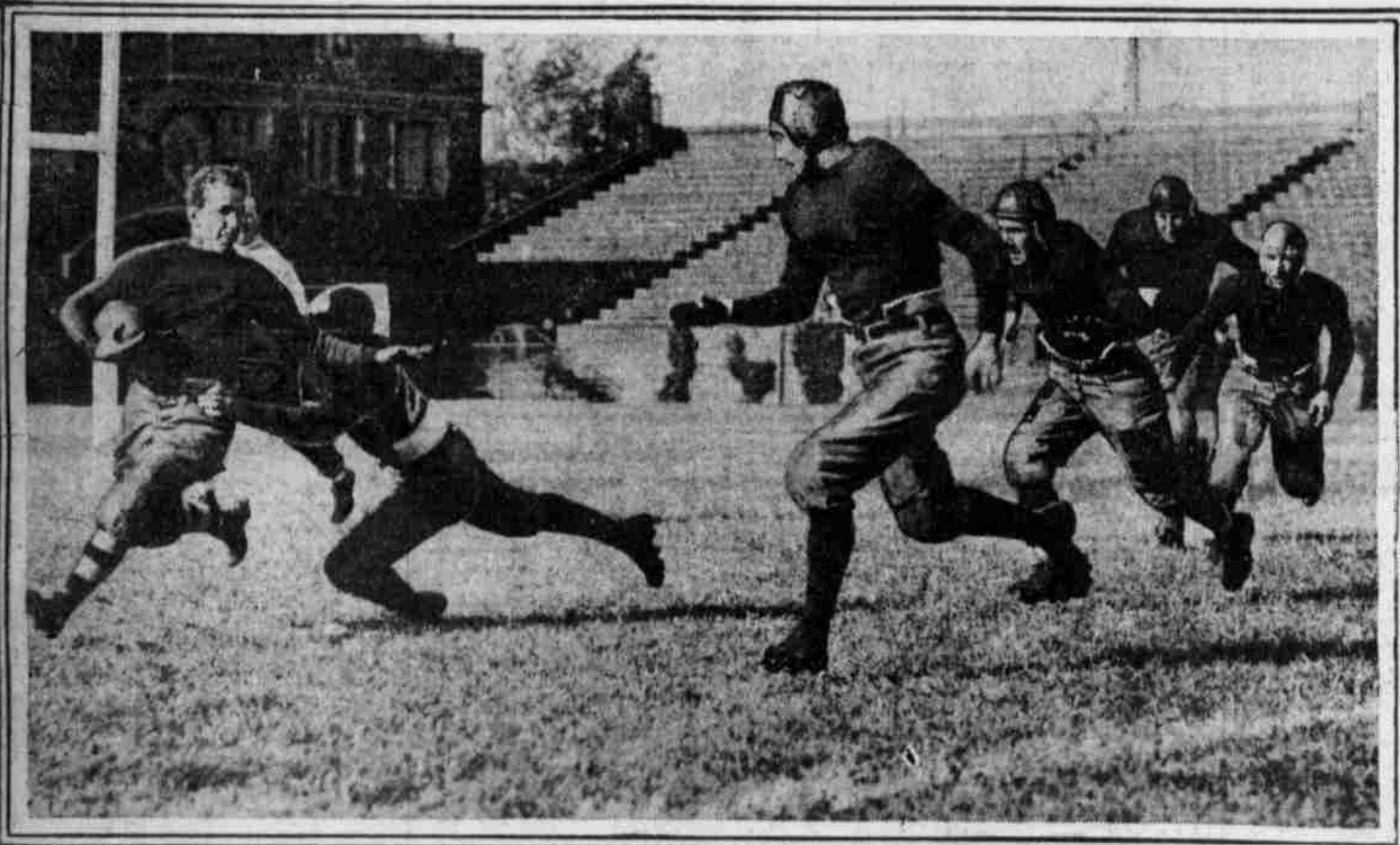




PERSONS AND PLACES LOOMING BIG IN THE DAY'S NEWS FROM THE WORLD OF SPORTS



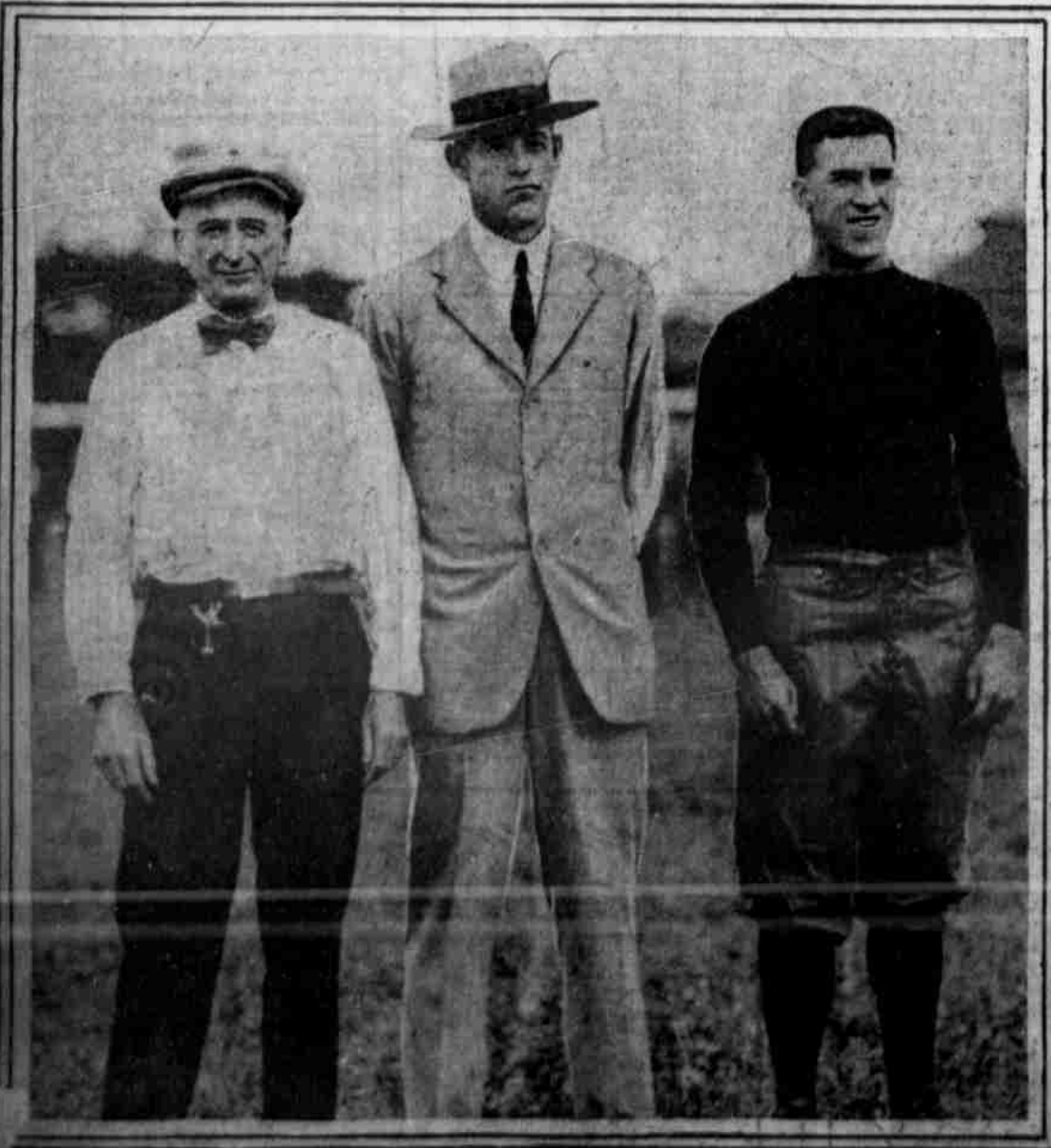

At the left piles of lumber may be seen. These are being converted into seats against the right field wall, which may add two or three thousand seats to the present capacity of 19,000.



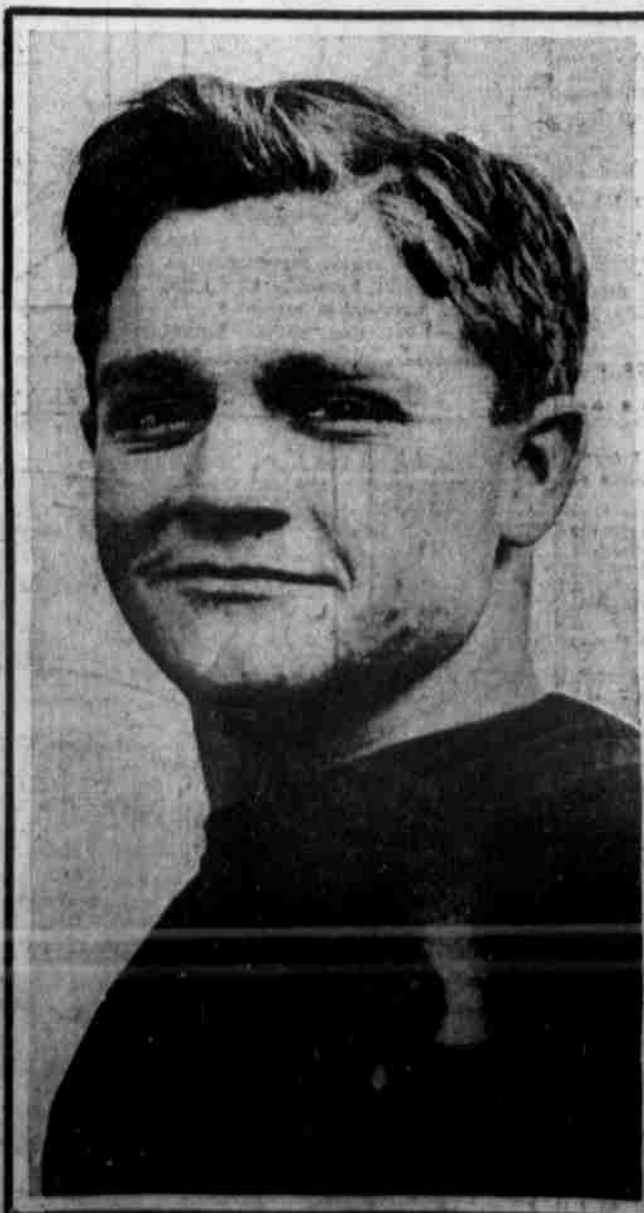
A FLYING TACKLE ON FRANKLIN FIELD
