MOVIE CENSORS FRAME MORE STRINGENT RULES

State Board Goes Present Onerous Regulations One Better for Morality's Sake

HARRISBURG, Pa., Oct. 8.-The new

rules of the State Board of Moving Picture Censors, announced today, are much which have aroused much resentment among moving-picture operators. The rules, say the censors, are designed "to keep motion pictures attuned to public epinion." They were framed jointly by J. Louis Breitinger, Mrs. E. C. Niver and Ellis P. Oberholtzer, the members of the board, and are based on the observations and experiences of the board since its

Sacrilege and allied subjects are forbidden, and the board does not consider use and effect of habit-forming d ugs or nes which cast discredit on the marrage vows as proper subjects for the "movies." Slapstick comedies are permovies. Stapstick comedies are permitted, if proper, and the costuming is to be subject to censorship. Pio'onge! passionate love scenes are frowned upon, and the censors say that "frank exposure of the person" may, from the stan-po nt of the movies, be less objectionable than "partial exposure".

"partial exposure."
Infidelity and sex problems must be carefully handled and underworld, objectiondances, questionable reserts and the like, if permitted at all, will be for the moral effect and then only in such manner as not to excite the beholder to temptation. "Bar room scenes, drinking and drunkenness" have their place on the screen, but must be brief and handled with discretion. Women and drinking with discretion. Women and drinking may be all right in places and all wrong Such scenes are frowned upon, at times permissable. Crime, death and grewsome scenes must not be dwelt upon at length and deeds of vio-lence tending toward debasement of morals will be discouraged. All manner of suggestiveness and vulgarity must be eliminated and even posters to be placed in front of theatres must bear the stamp of the censors' approval before they can be hung.

REV. B .T. CALLEN

Secretary of Philadelphia M. E. Conference for 16 Years

An illness lasting two years has caused the death of the Rev. B. T. Callen, of 4308 Aspen street. Until ill health neces-sitated his resignation he was paster of the Forty-third Street Methodist Epis-copal Church, 42d and Aspen streets, and secretary of the Philadelphia Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church. He had held the latter position 16 years. A nervous breakdown occurred shortly

after the clergyman assumed charge of the West Philadelphia church in April, 1913, and several months later he resigned. He has been under treatment for several months in a sanitarium.

Funeral services will be held Monday afterneon in the Forty-third Street church. Interment will be in Bethlehem.

The Rev. Mr. Callen is survived by a

widow and the following children: Cope-land Callen, a professor at the Univer-sity of Illinois; Arthur Callen, an instructor at Lehigh University, and Miss Edna Callen, a teacher in the Baltimore

Mr. Callen entered the Philadelphia conference in 1881. He has held charges in the West York Street Church and the Emmanuel Church, of this city, and St. Peter's Methodist Episcopal Church in Bethlehem.
