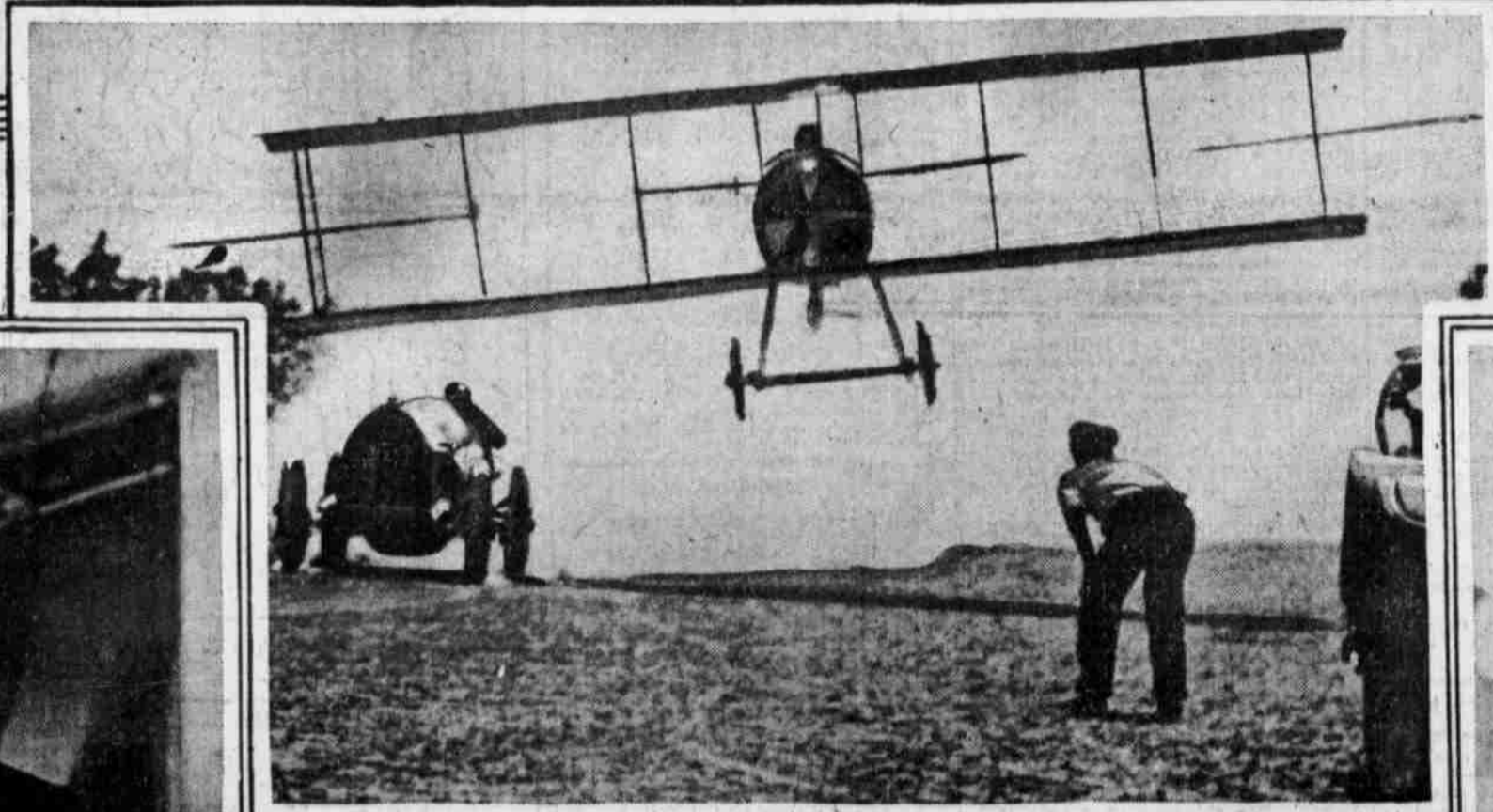




LOOKING AT THE NEWS OF A WORLD'S DOINGS THROUGH THE LENS OF THE EVER-PRESENT CAMERA

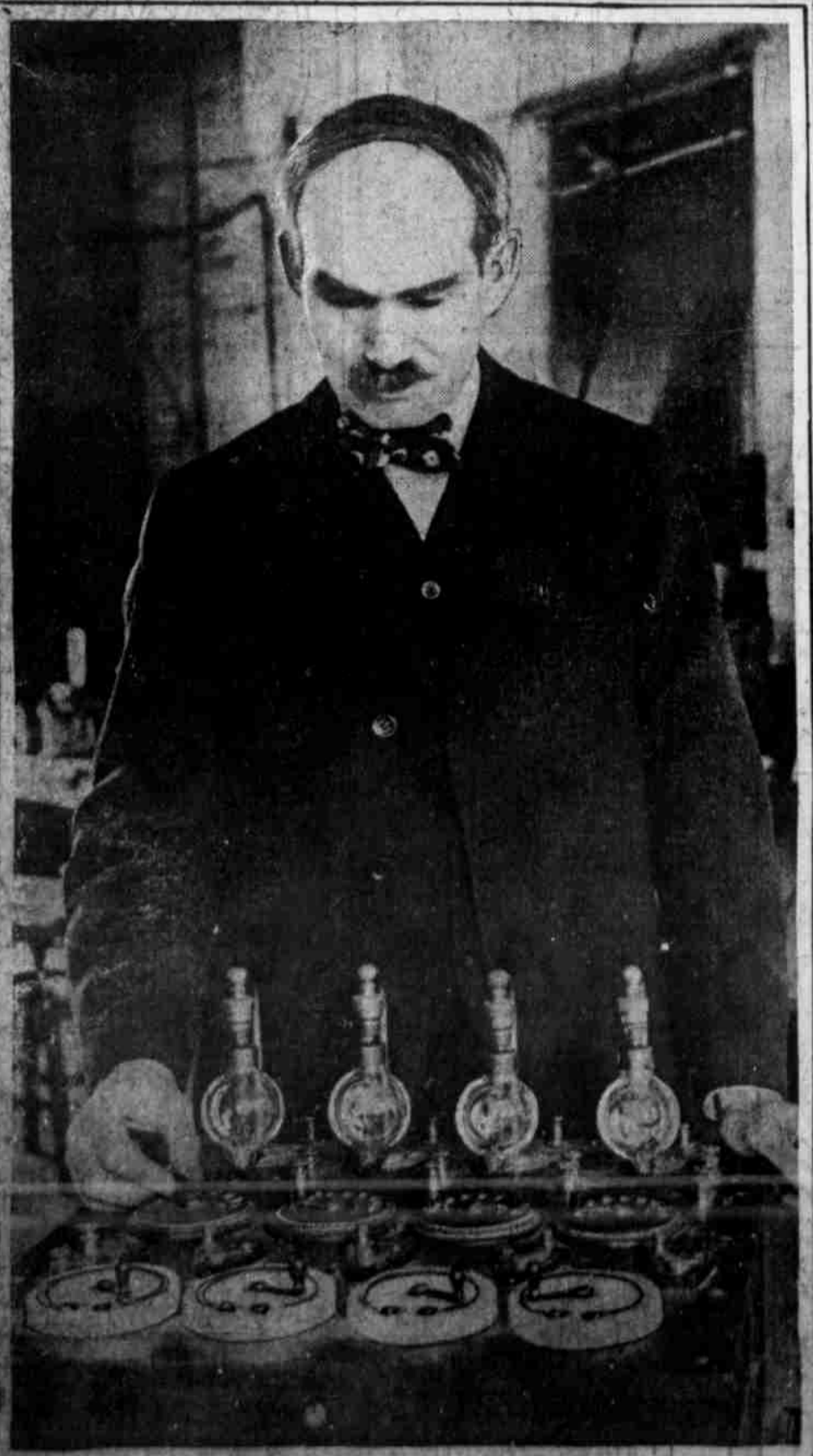
