

TEACH MORE FROM REAL LIFE, HE ASKS

Dr. R. R. Reeder Says Public Schools Follow Textbooks Too Closely

Public schools teach too much from textbooks and too little from real life, according to Dr. R. R. Reeder, superintendent of the New York Orphanage of Hastings-on-the-Hudson.

Dr. Reeder made this remark today during a conference at the Bellevue-Stratford to determine the best method of substituting \$100,000 worth of Robert E. Carson and William E. Ellis, of this city, for the care of orphaned girls in Pennsylvania.

Following a general discussion of the subject, Dr. Reeder spoke of the desirability of a course in number, adjoined to the Drexel Institute, where they were entertained at a luncheon by Dr. and Mrs. Hollis Goddard.
