CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH AGAINST PREPAREDNESS

Resolutions Oppose "Extravagant Ex-

penditures for Ships and Guns"

NEW HAVEN, Oct. 35.-Resolutions opposing the policy of preparedness in this country and proposing international co-operation of churches in the interest of permanent peace were passed today by the National Council of Congregational Churches in session here.

The resolutions declare that the "war now desolating Europe has demonstrated the futility of gigantic armaments as a guarantee of international security and justice"; that "various forces are at present working to sweep the American Republic into the same course of government action which has brought Europe immeasurable disaster," and that the council "views with heartfelt solicitude the organized and desperate effort to stampede the nation at this time, with wild and extravagant expenditures for ships and guns and earnestly objects just now to the committing of our nation to a policy of so-called preparedness."
