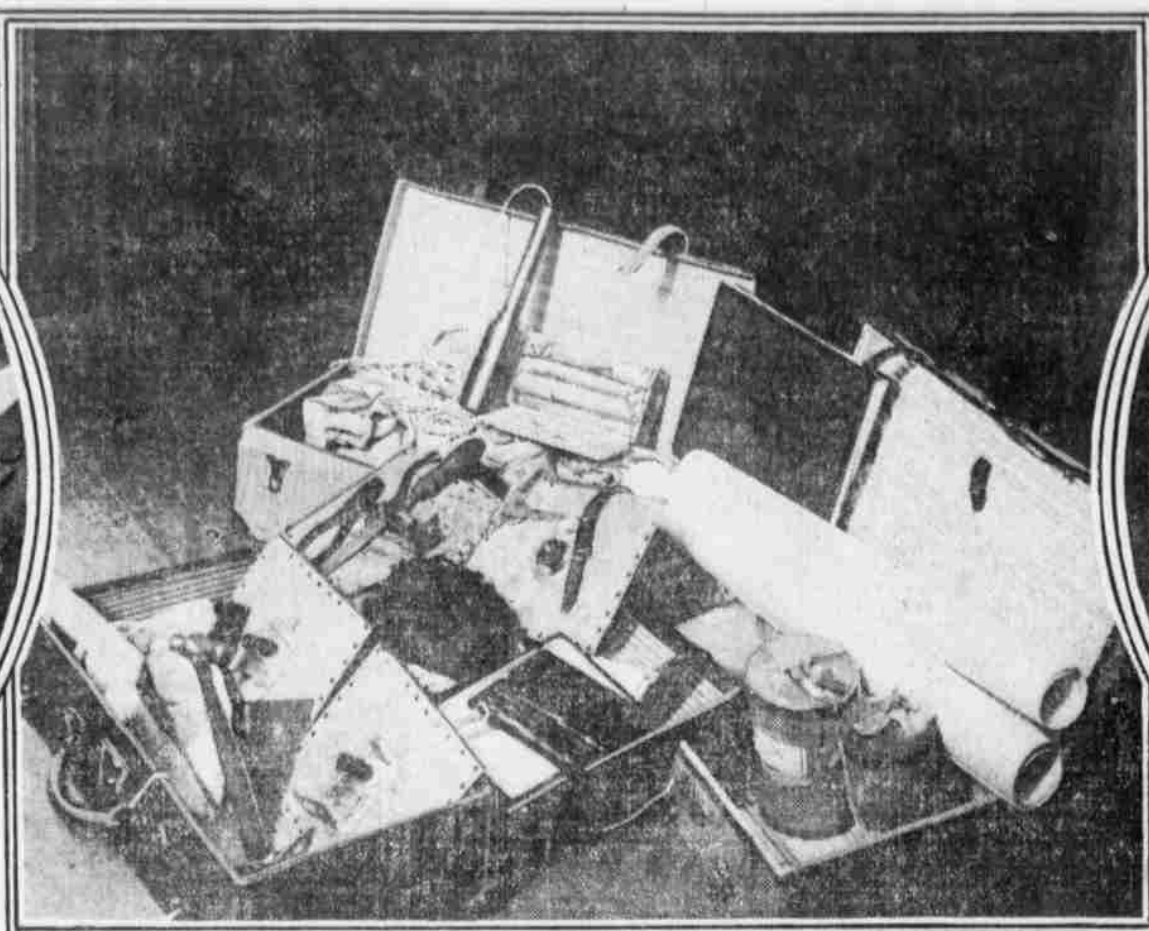

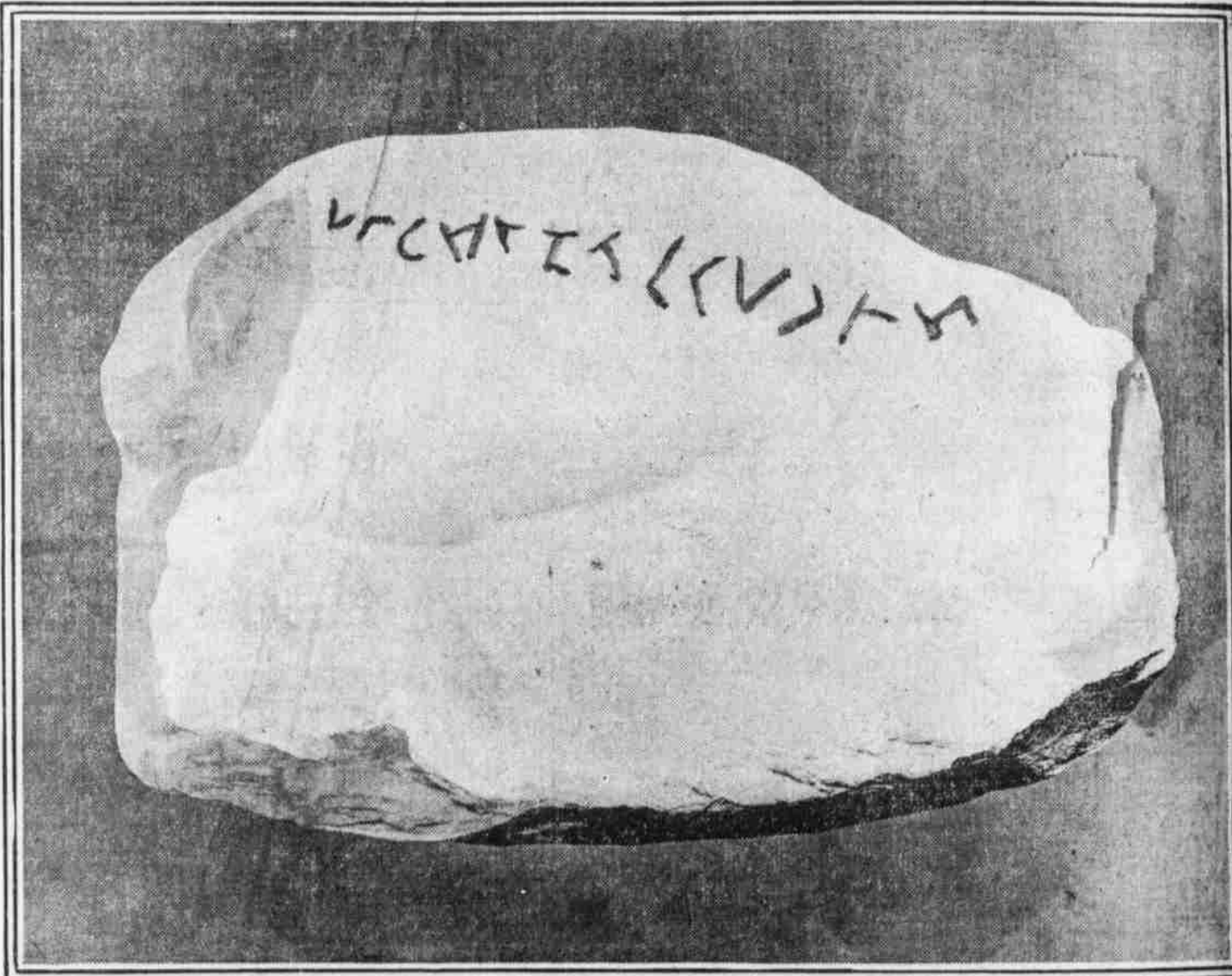
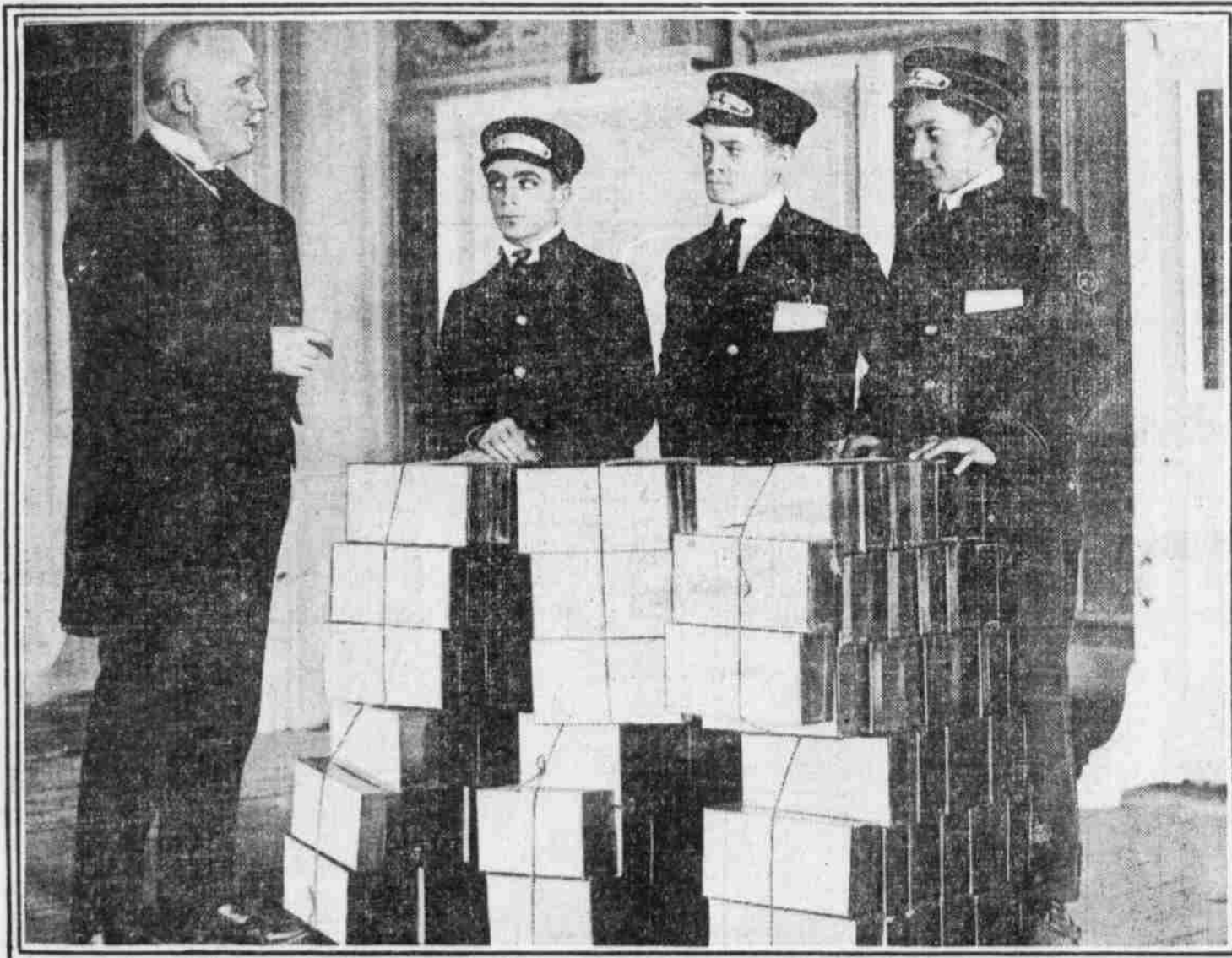
NO INCIDENT IS TOO IMPORTANT OR TOO TRIVIAL FOR THE EVER-VIGILANT CAMERA MAN

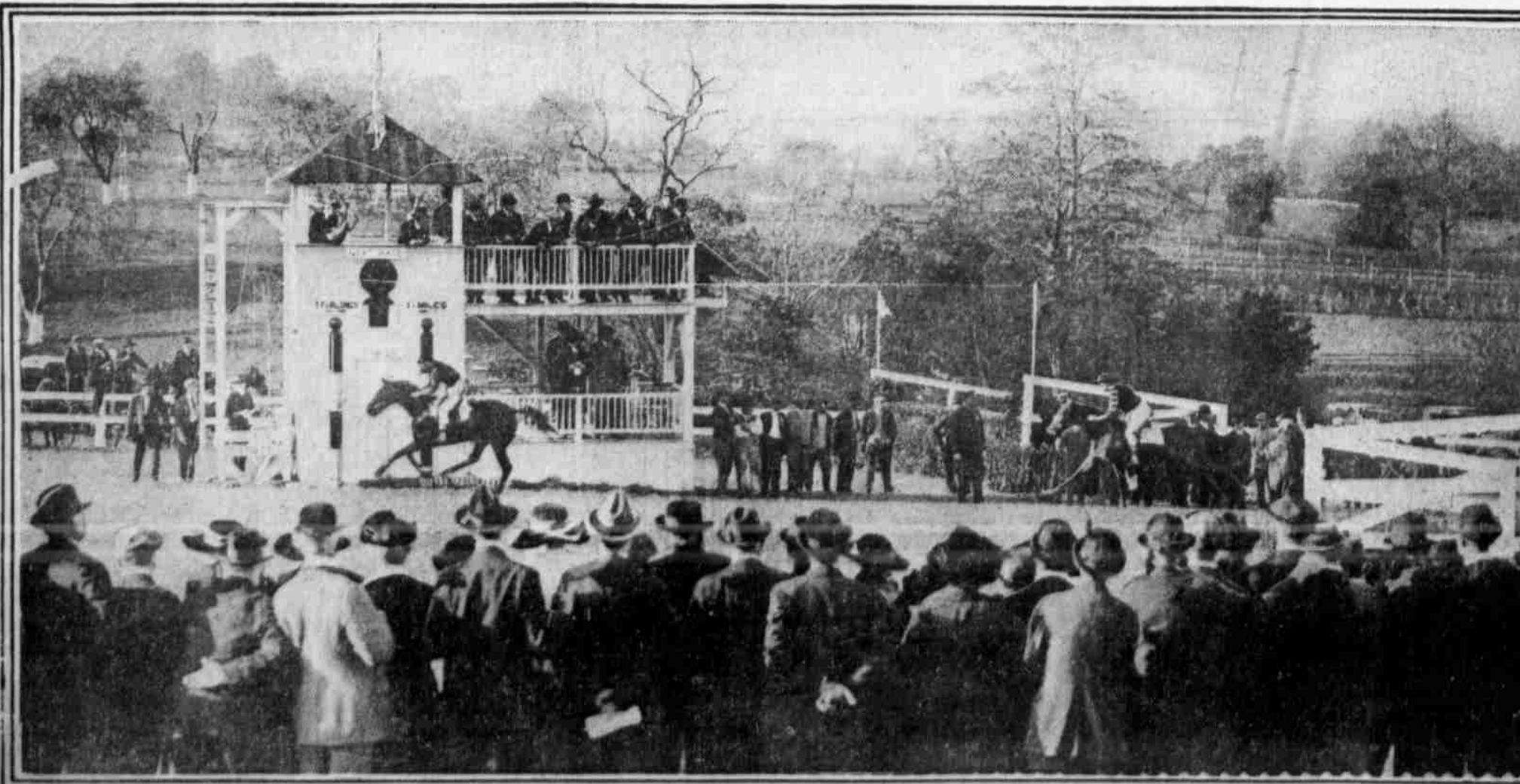
ENOUGH EXPLOSIVES TO BLOW UP PHILADELPHIA
