Her ambitions were wide and she looked with longing eyes toward Europe, where great singers were winning laurels and

great singers were winning laurels and also more substantial remunerations. She went to Berlin, where her aptitude for study and work made most of the pupils seem shirkers in comparison. In one year she had accomplished more than many students to in these, and was ready. many students do in three, and was ready for her European debut. She had pre-viously sung the role of Santuzza in "Cavalleria Rusticana," in Tokio, and has won the praise of her countrymen.
