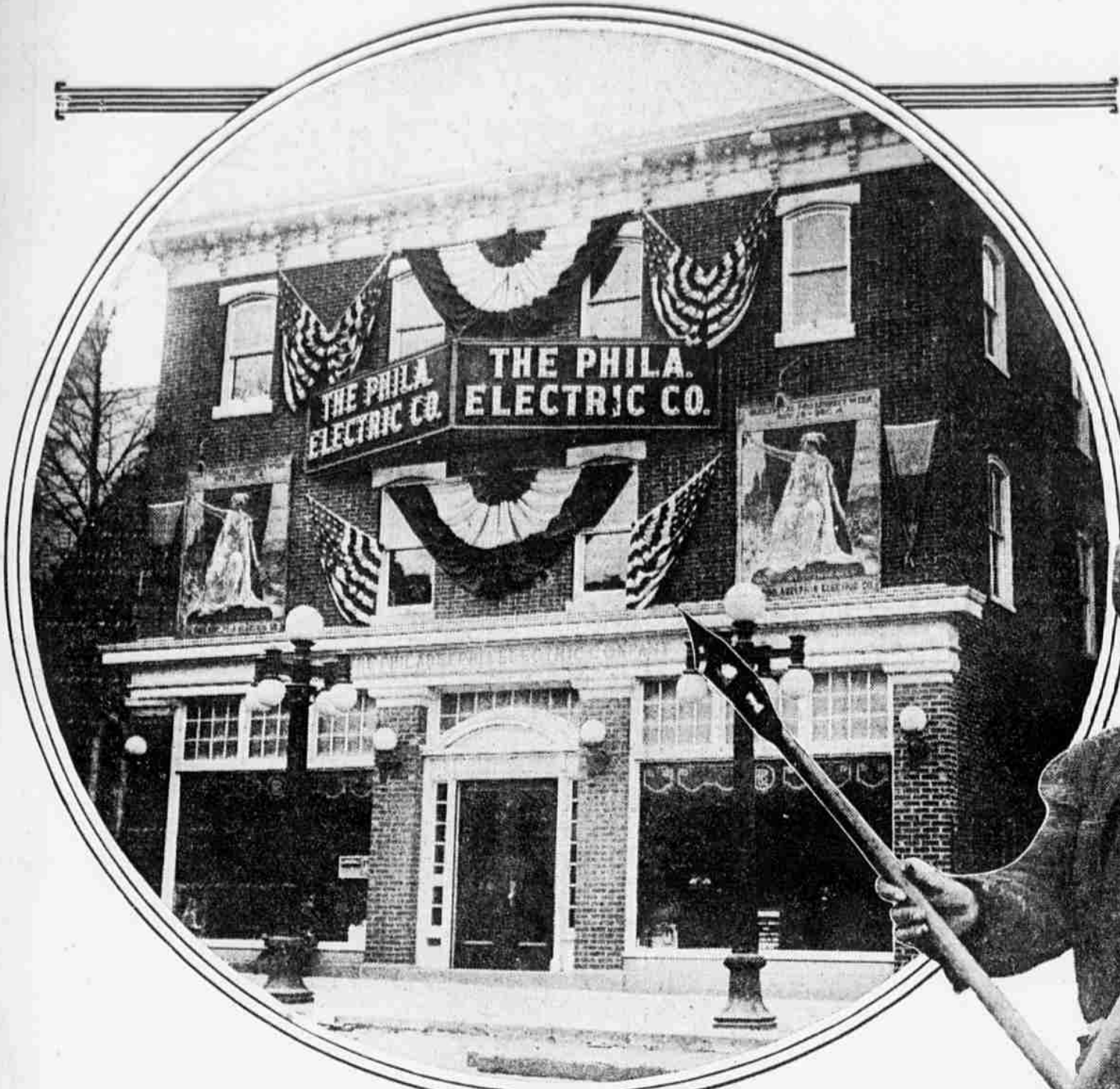




INTERESTING SIDELIGHTS OF A DAY'S NEWS GRAPHICALLY TOLD BY THE CAMERA

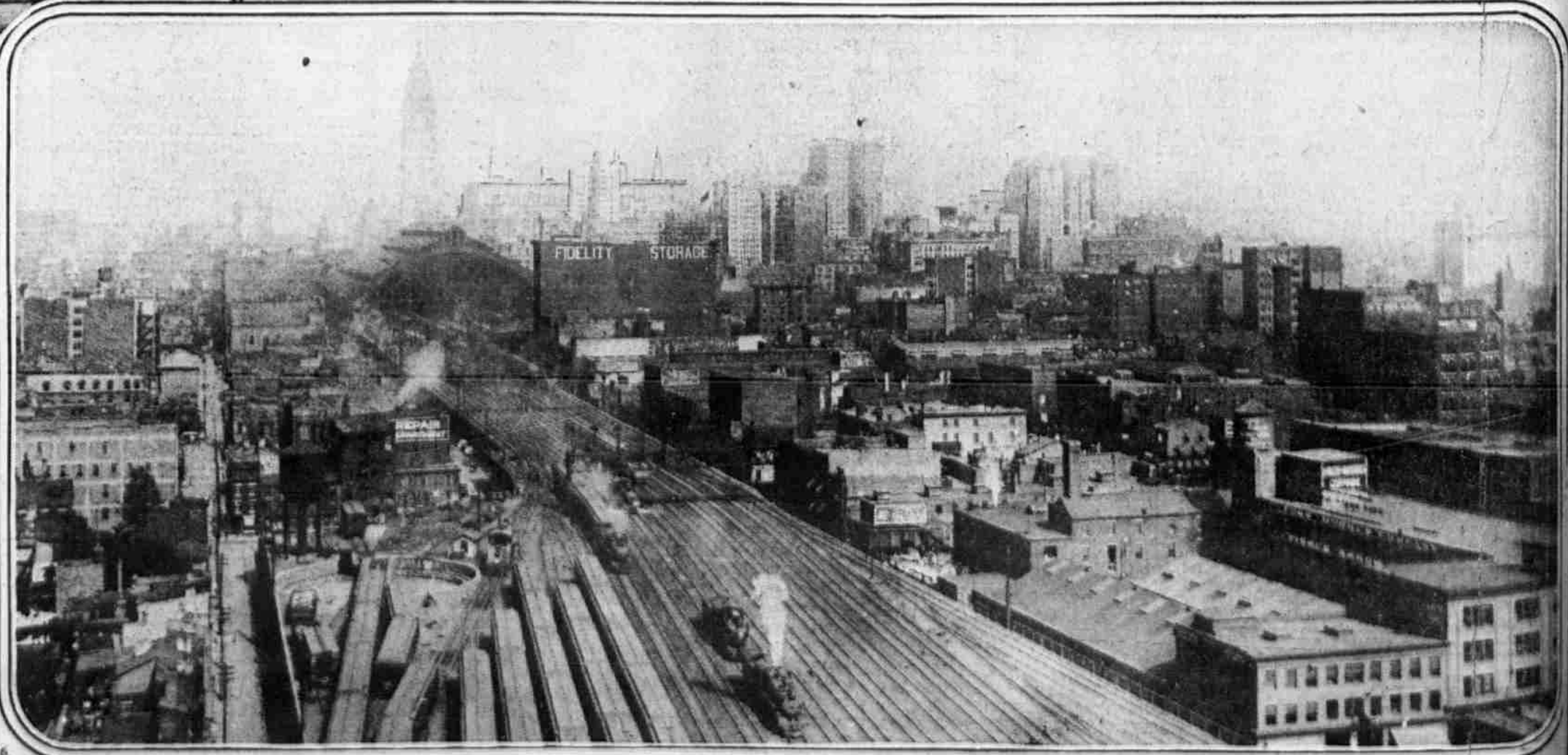
ADVANCE GUARD OF SUFFRAGE ATTACK
