Woman in France has liked the soldier's helmet and has appropriated the idea.




AND HERE IS A DRAGOON EFFECT

one eye on the cavalryman's casque.




WINTER CAMPAIGN AGAINST THE SOUTH PHILADELPHIA MOSQUITO

Experts declare that the battle against the pest of summer should begin in cool weather with the cleaning up of marshes and weeds.




NEW CHURCH IN TACONY IS BUILT OF GRINDSTONES
