JOBLESS TEACHERS GET POSITIONS WHEN NEW SCHOOLS START

Child Labor Law Is Boon to Normal School Graduates Who Have Waited Long

SALARIES \$1200 A YEAR

Positions for 140 teachers at average salaries of \$1200 a year will be provided through the establishment of continuation classes on January 1.

Although it is probable that the new instructors will be given to experienced teachers only, the appointment of the latter to these positions will leave vacancies in the elementary grades to be filled by younger women.

Two physicians will be appointed as additional medical inspectors at \$1200 a year, because of the increase in the number of children who will be cared for by the Board of Education under the new law.

The organization of the new classes will cost the Board of Education \$25,510 for the year 1916, according to a report prepared by Louis Nusbaum, associate superintendent of schools.

Equipment necessary to the technical phases of the instruction will cost approximately \$60,000. Text-books and other articles needed in the academic courses will be purchased for half that sum.

Women teachers of scholastic subjects will be appointed from a large eligible list now available to the school board. An examination for male instructors in scholastic branches will be held on January 6 and 7, at 122 Cherry street.

Men who have had practical experience in industrial institutions will receive preference when these vacancies are filled. Women who have been trained in homekeeping will likewise be preferred.

Two hours a week will be devoted to technical work, while six hours will be devoted to general instruction under the plans of Mr. Nusbaum.
