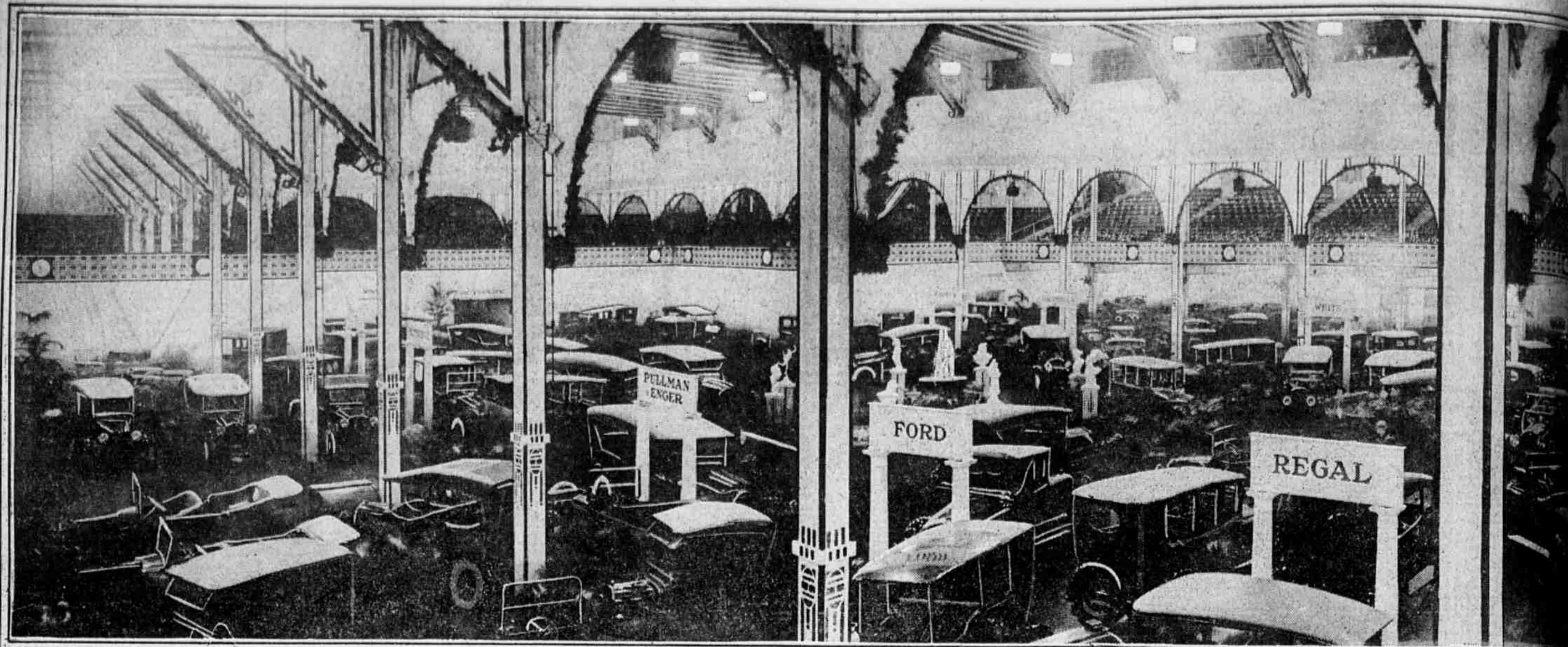

The German conquerors are photographing and numbering family groups in France and Belgium to provide for future identification.

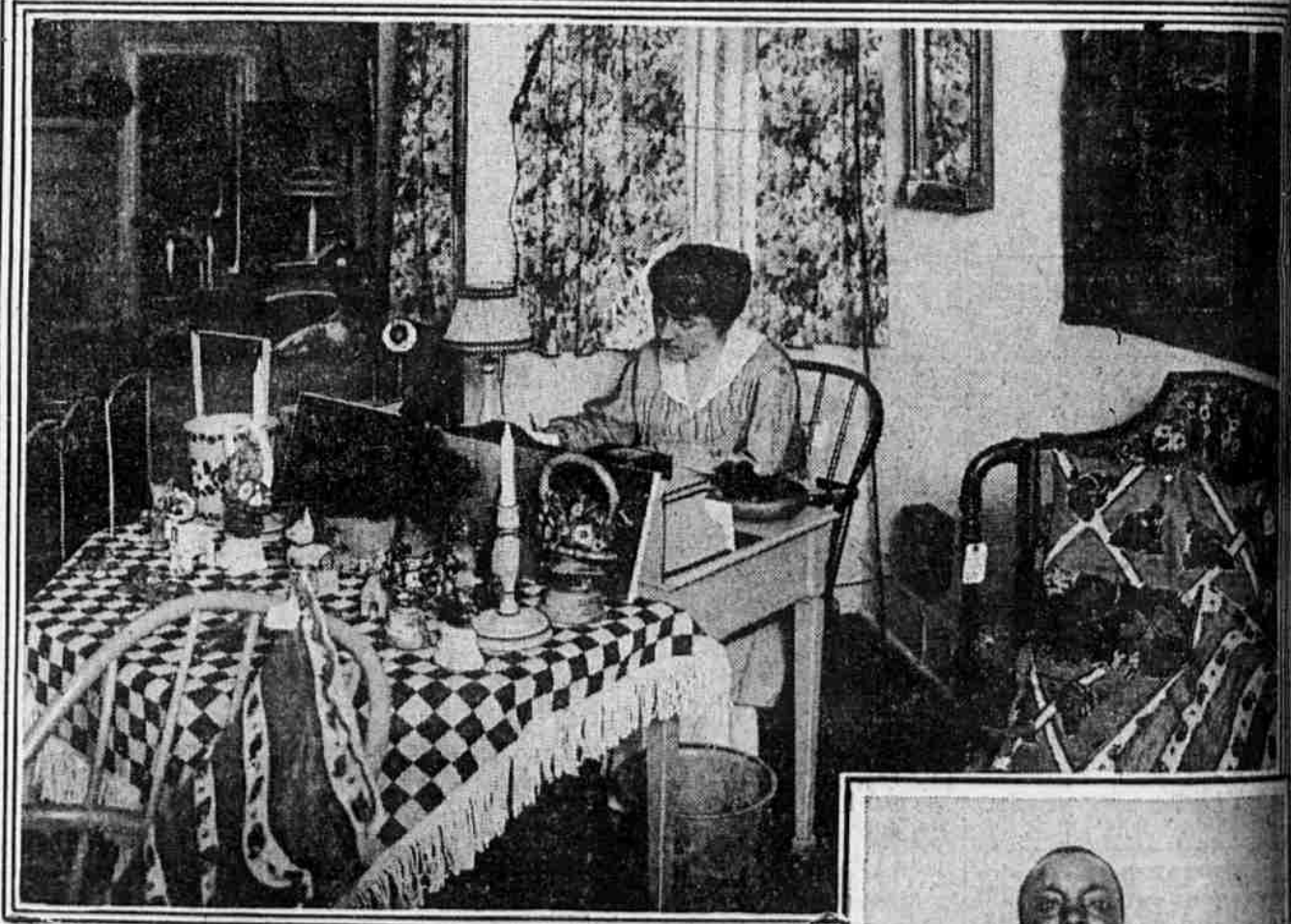
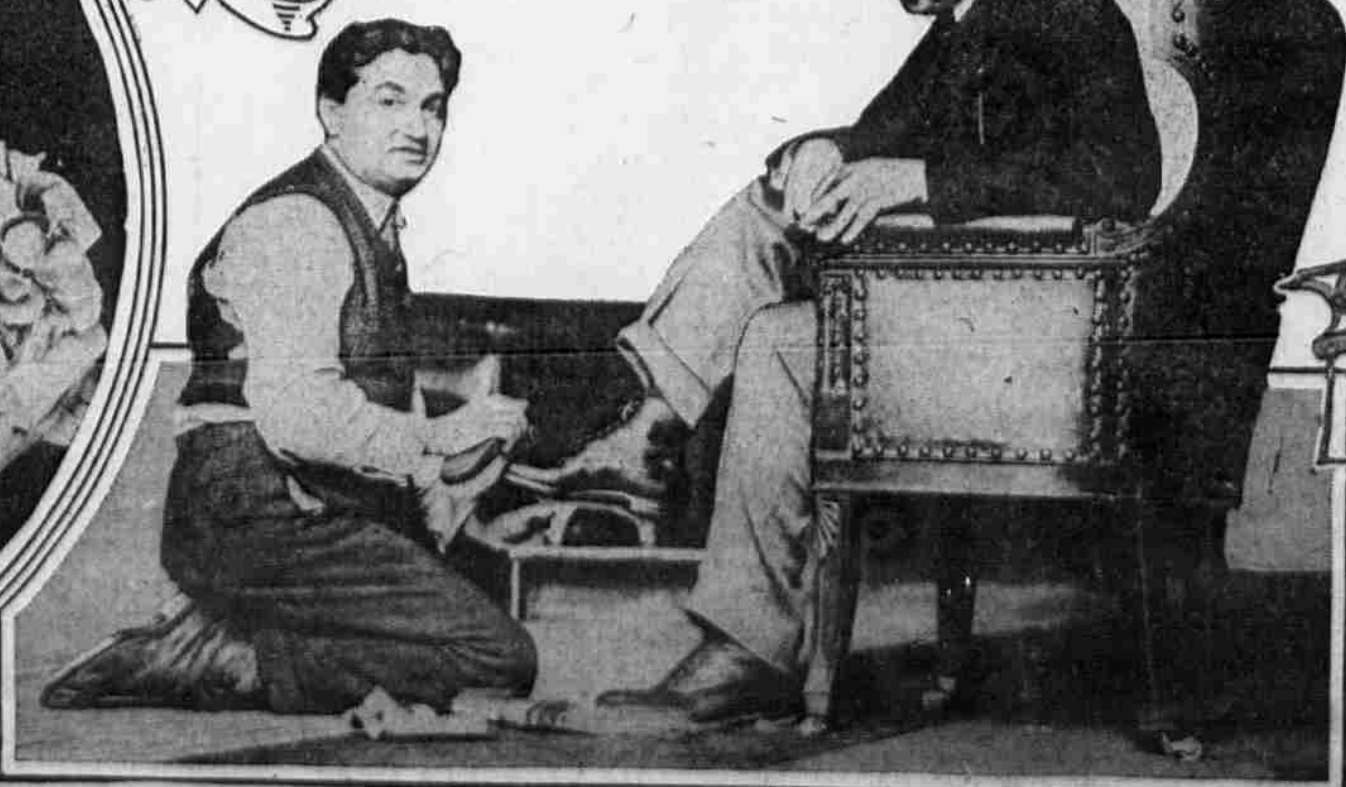
