It is to be noted that the Kaiser wears a knitted hood which goes around his head and covers his ears. It is probable that this is for the protection of his weak throat—a considerable concession for the Kaiser, who believes in a Spartan rigor.






SHRINERS' CIRCUS POSTER AND NOTED CLOWN WHO WILL APPEAR
