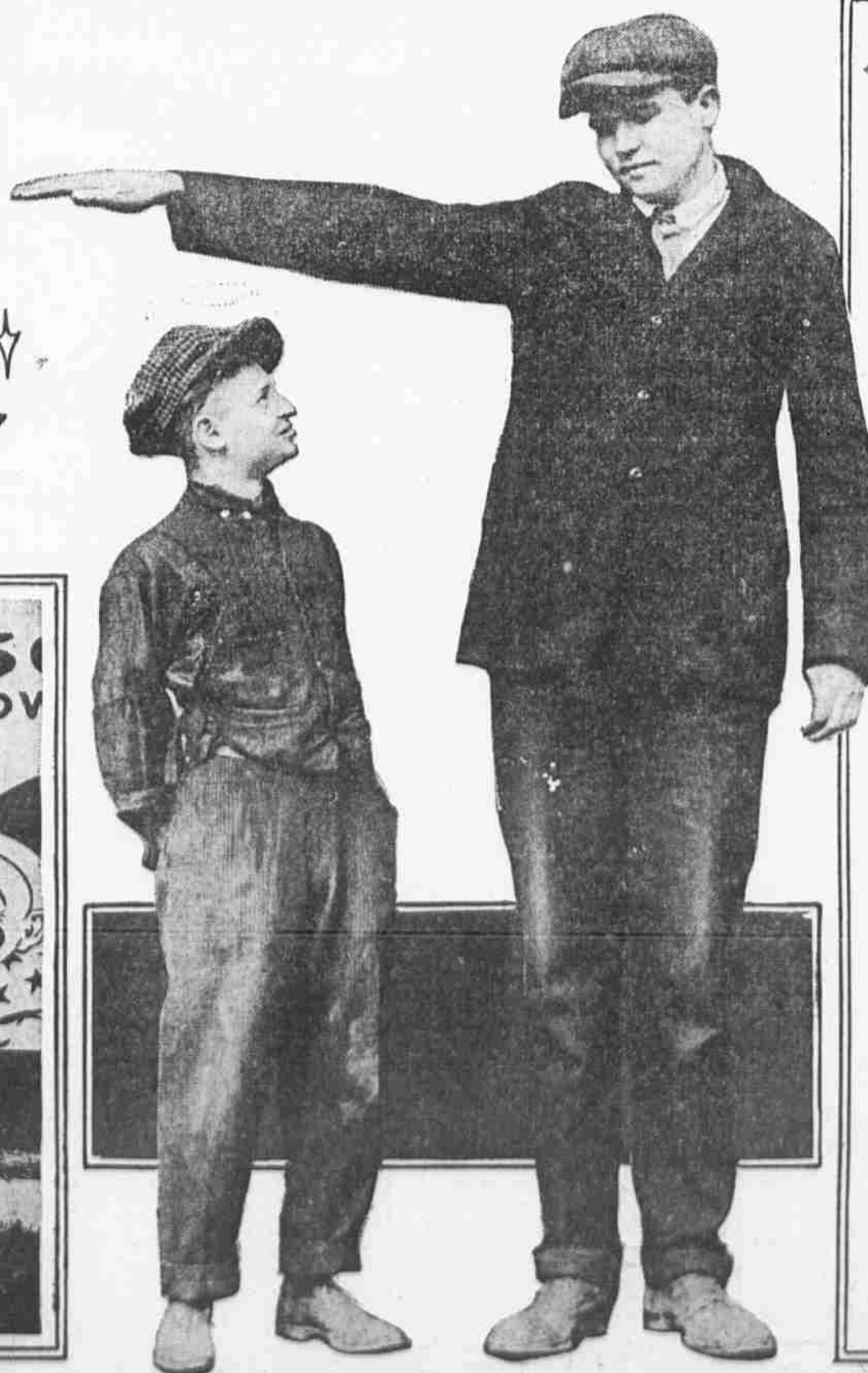
LATEST WAR-FRONT PICTURE OF THE KAISER, WHO IS 57 YEARS OLD TODAY

This photograph, which has just arrived from Germany, shows Emperor William inspecting a column of troops in East Galicia. At his right walks their commander, General von Bothmer. It is to be noted that the Kaiser wears a knitted hood which goes around his head and covers his ears. It is probable that this is for the protection of his weak throat—a considerable concession for the Kaiser, who believes in a Spartan rigor.
