

THE MOVING PICTURE BOOKSHELF

There are many books now appearing There are many books now appearing on the market which are supposed to thoroughly cover the field of acenario writing, this new branch of the writer's art. Many of them are just written for the sole purpose of making money from the unsuspecting public who imagine writing of a scenario is as simple as writing a letter. "The Motion Picture Story," by William Lord Wright and published by the Lundeen Publishing Company, Fergus Falls, Minn. is not one of these. It is one of the best texthooks of photoplay-writing yet issued, covering the entire field of the film story in a clear and concise manner casily understood. The specimen scenarios show the proper form and give the necessary information form and give the necessary information as to construction. Photoplay terms and tools of the trade are also explained. The methods to employ in marketing the finished scenario and the prices paid are also given.

The book brings the history of the business of photoplay-writing up to the present time and concludes with some valuable advice to the prospective writer. The author, as the Motion Picture Editor of the Dramatic Mirror, has had an amount of experience which places him in position to write a book time security. a position to write a book upon scenario writing that is really authorative.


