



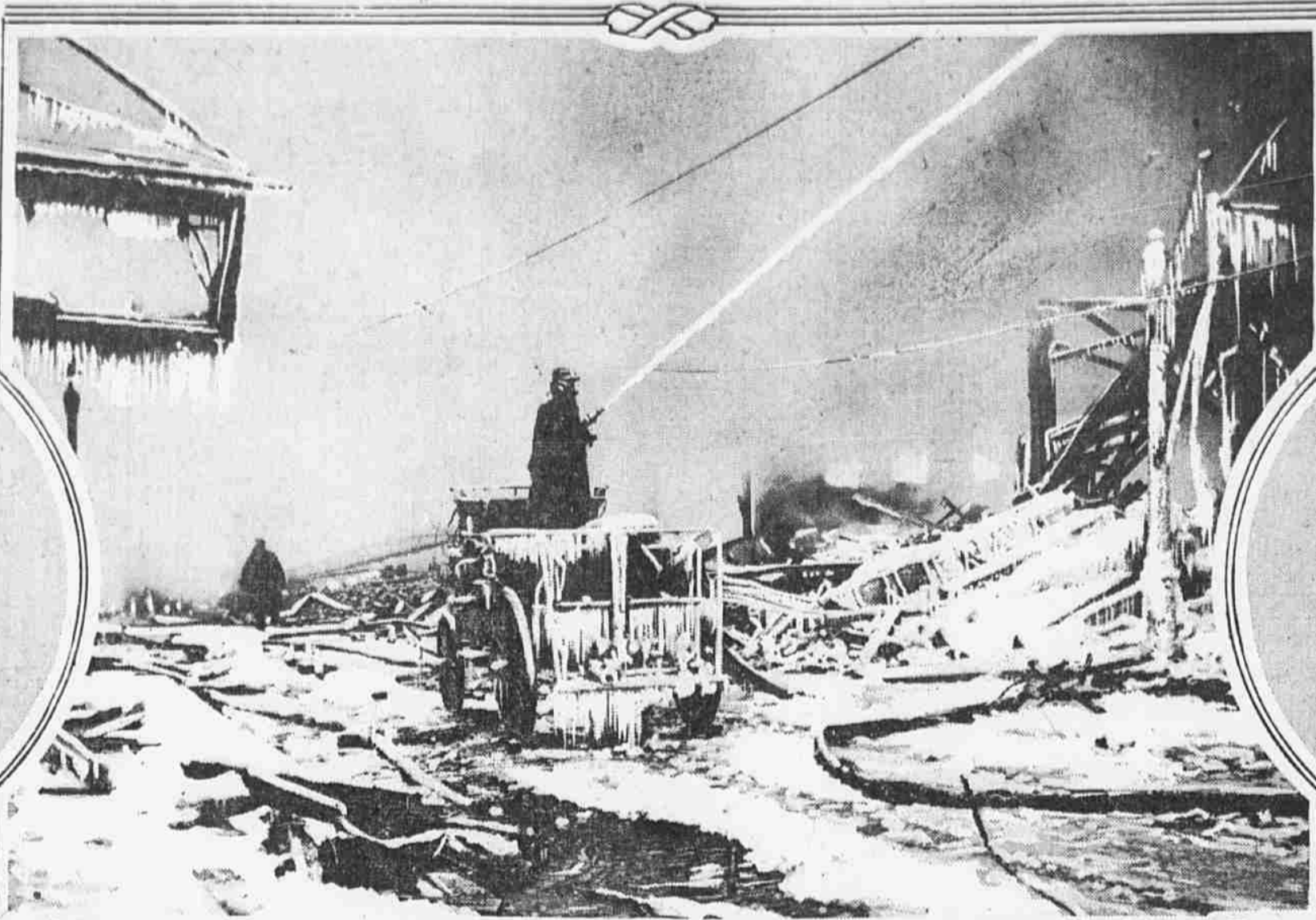

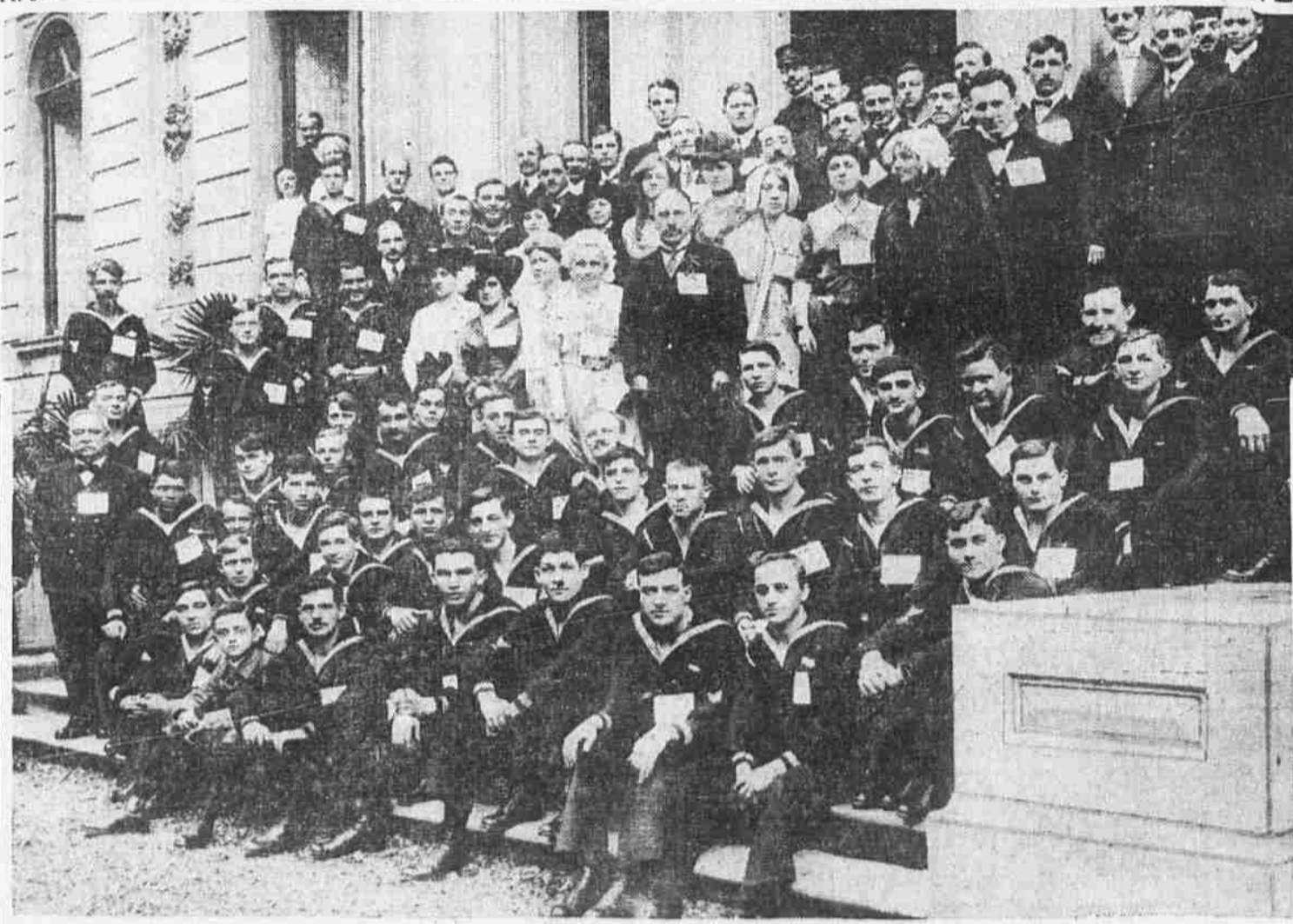
"FIGHTING PASTOR" FROM THE WEST

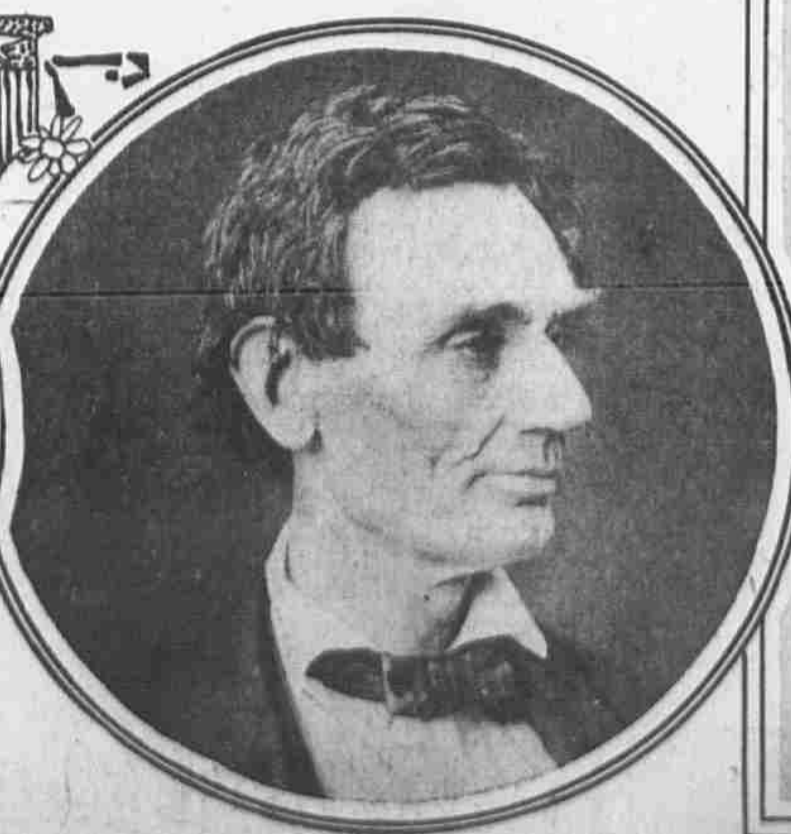
ANOTHER WESTERNER IN OUR MIDST
