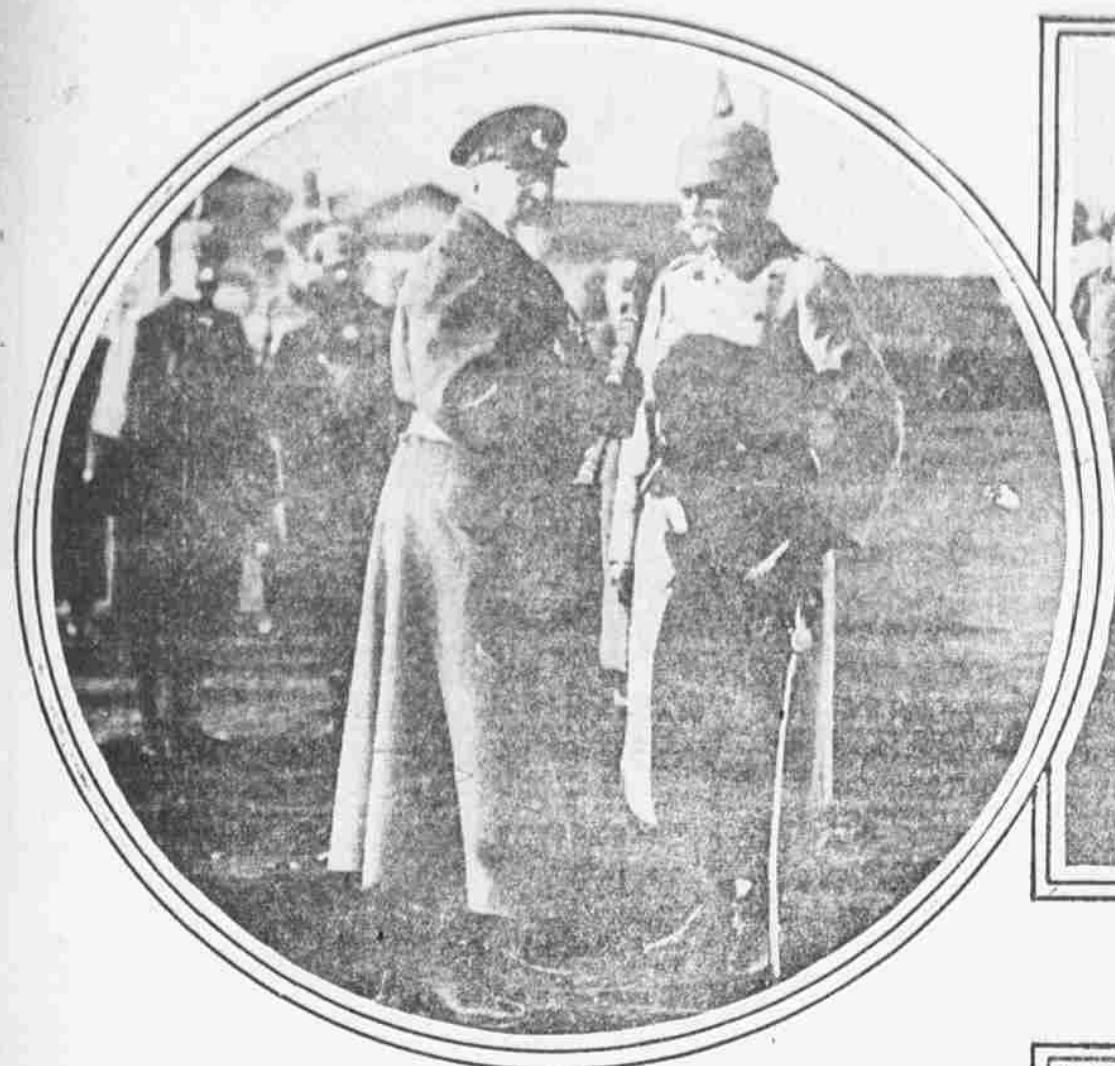




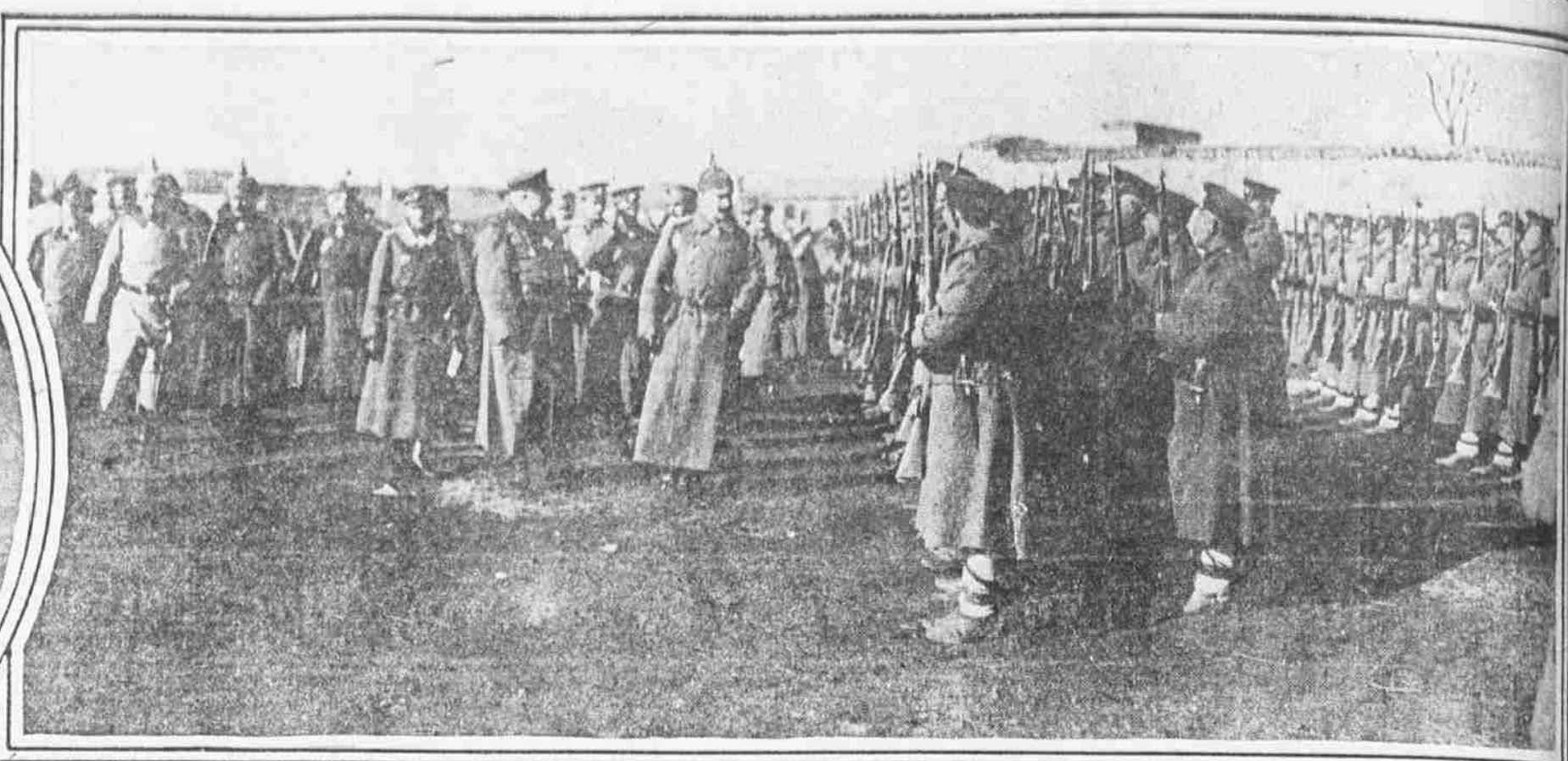

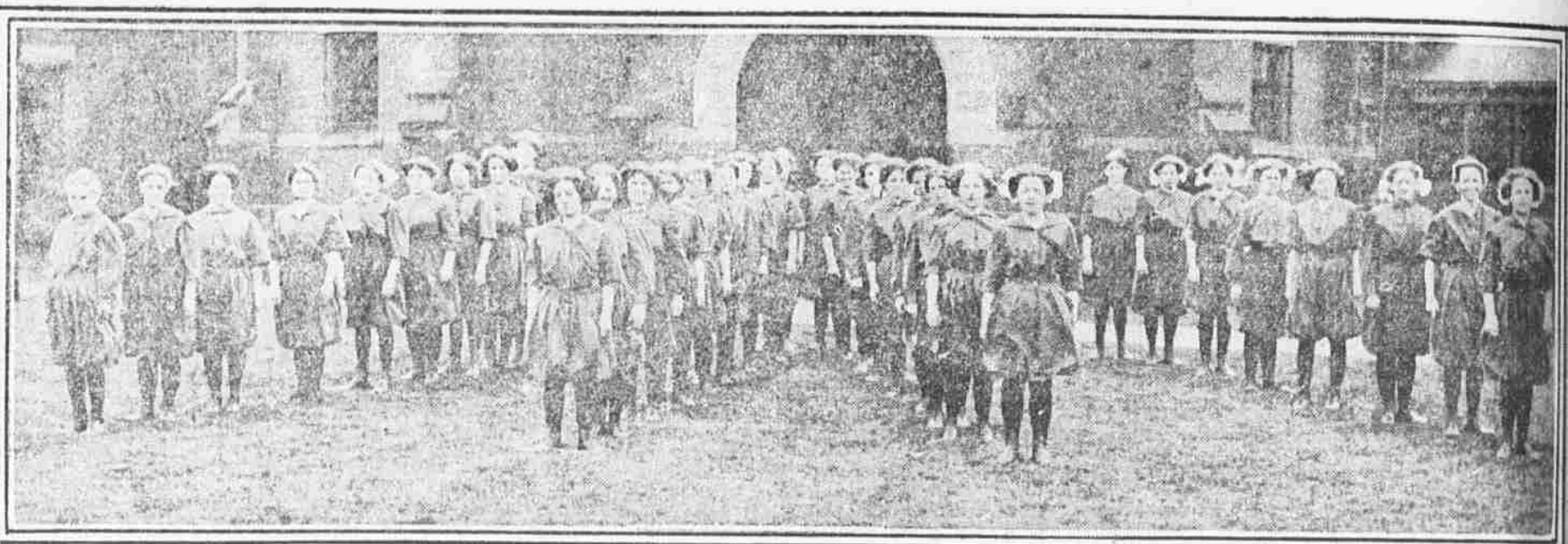
BULGARIAN CZAR CONFERS WITH GERMAN LEADERS

This shows Emperor William inspecting a regiment of Bulgarian soldiers, who wear the tape-wound leggings peculiar to their country.



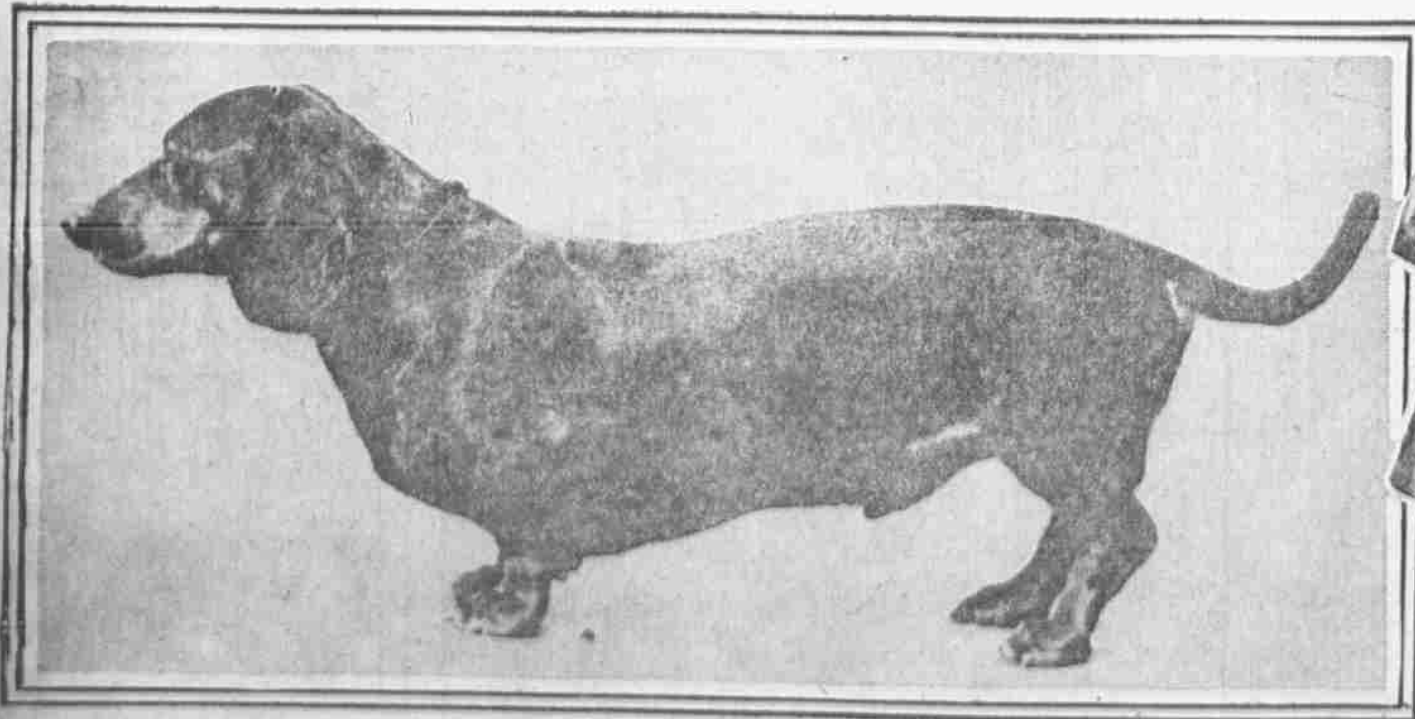
HOUSE IN PARIS SLASHED DOWN THE MIDDLE BY ZEPPELIN BOMB
