Miss Helene Iungerich as the Turtle, whose voice "was heard in the land" calling the creatures of earth to the worship of the Sun at the coming of spring.

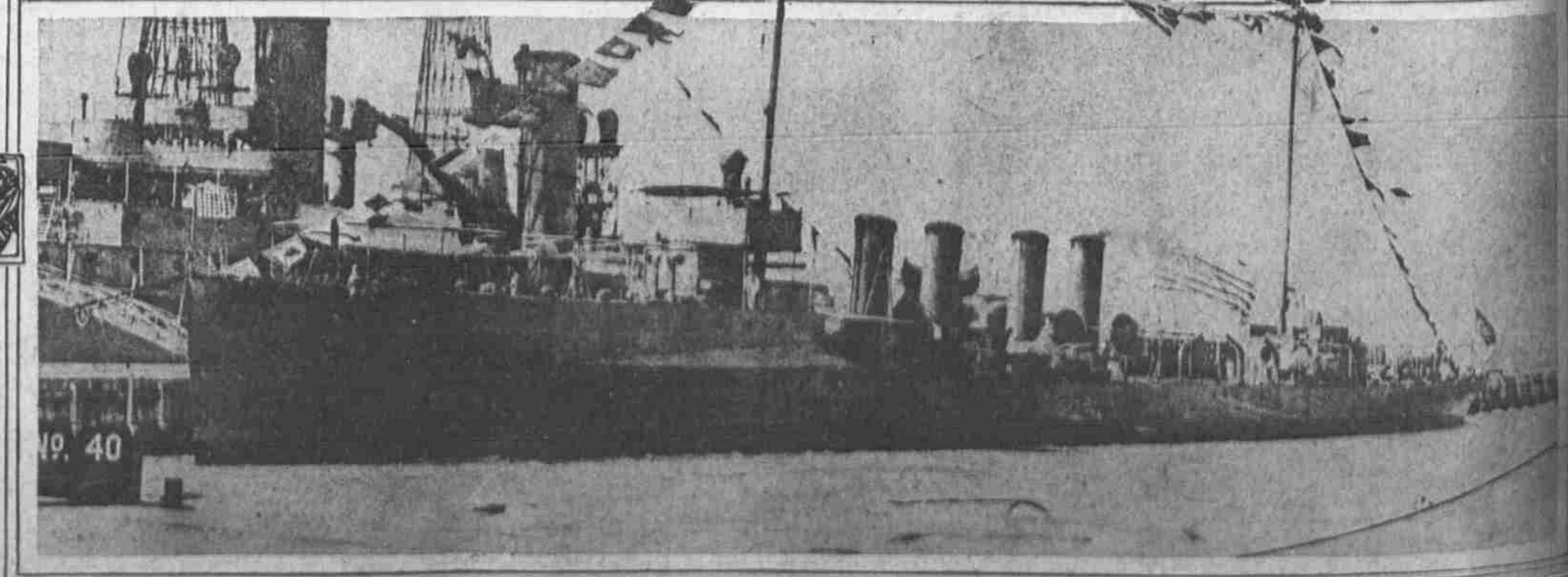


**SACRED HORSES FOR JAPANESE EMPEROR BOUGHT IN CALIFORNIA**
