MINISTERS THREATEN FREE SPEECH FIGHT

Presbyterians Say They Will Meet in Park Without Permit, if Necessary

Threats to hold religious services in Fairmount Park without permission from the Park Commissioners were made today the Rev. Dr. August E. Barnett and other Protestant clergymen at the quarrial Union in the Wesley Building, 17th and Arch streets. The threats were made after a committee from the union had reported that the organization had been ignored when it tried to present the plea-of the union to the commissioners for the privilege of holding religious services in the park during the coming summer.

The Rev. J. M. S. Isenberg, who reported for the committee, asserted that there was very indication that the committee was "ignored intenionally", when it went to the office of the Park Commissioners at the time of their last meeting for the purpose of an interview, which was re-fused. The Rev. Dr. C. H. Woolston, pastor of the East Baptist Church, a member of the committee, said that the action was just as he had expected. "You be good litle boys and go home and put your request in writing, was what we were told," he declared.

When Doctor Woolston had finished peaking there came cries of "Go higher up! We've fooled with the commissioners long enough." And then Mr. Barnett, who is secretary of the union, arose and made the threat.
