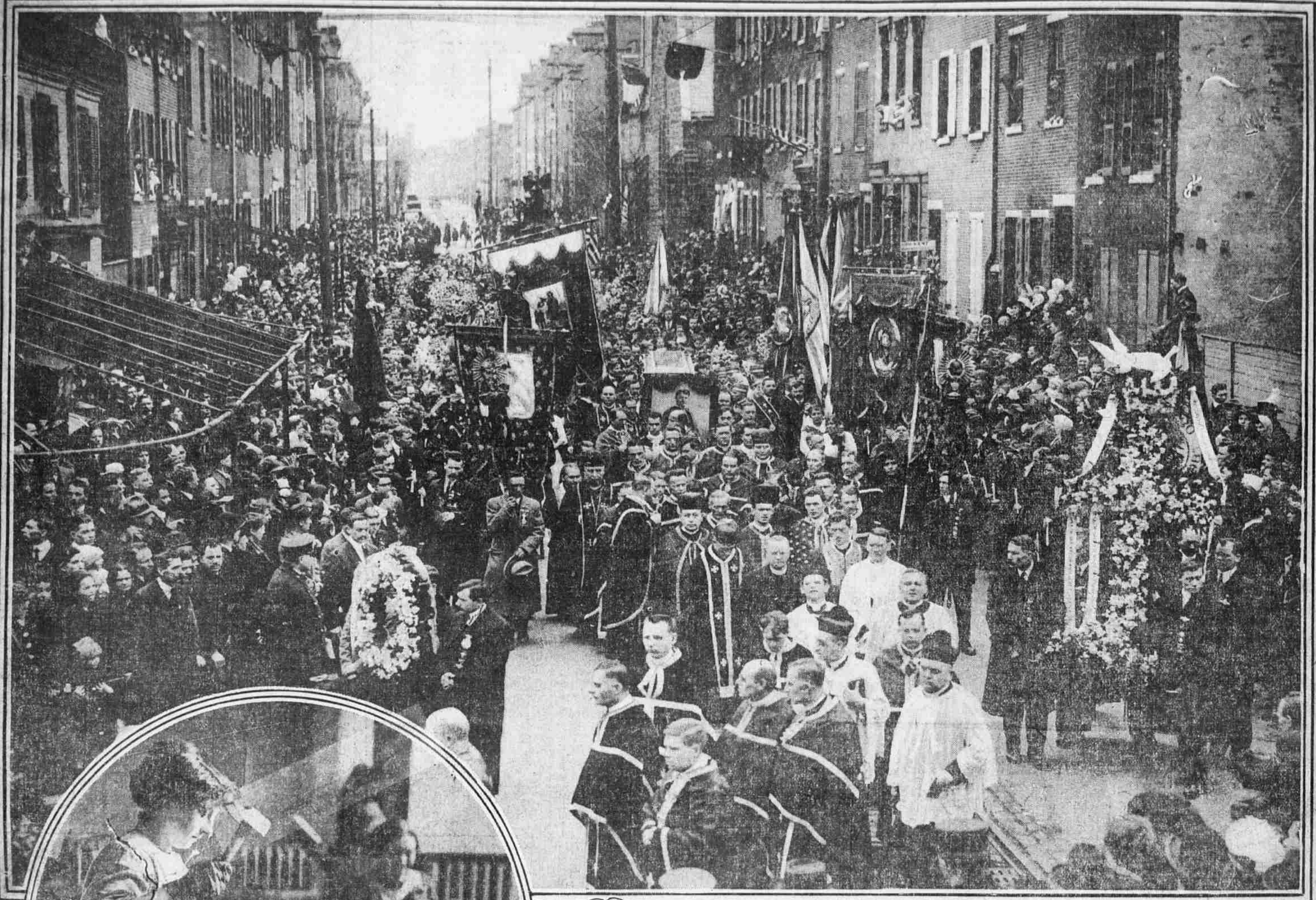

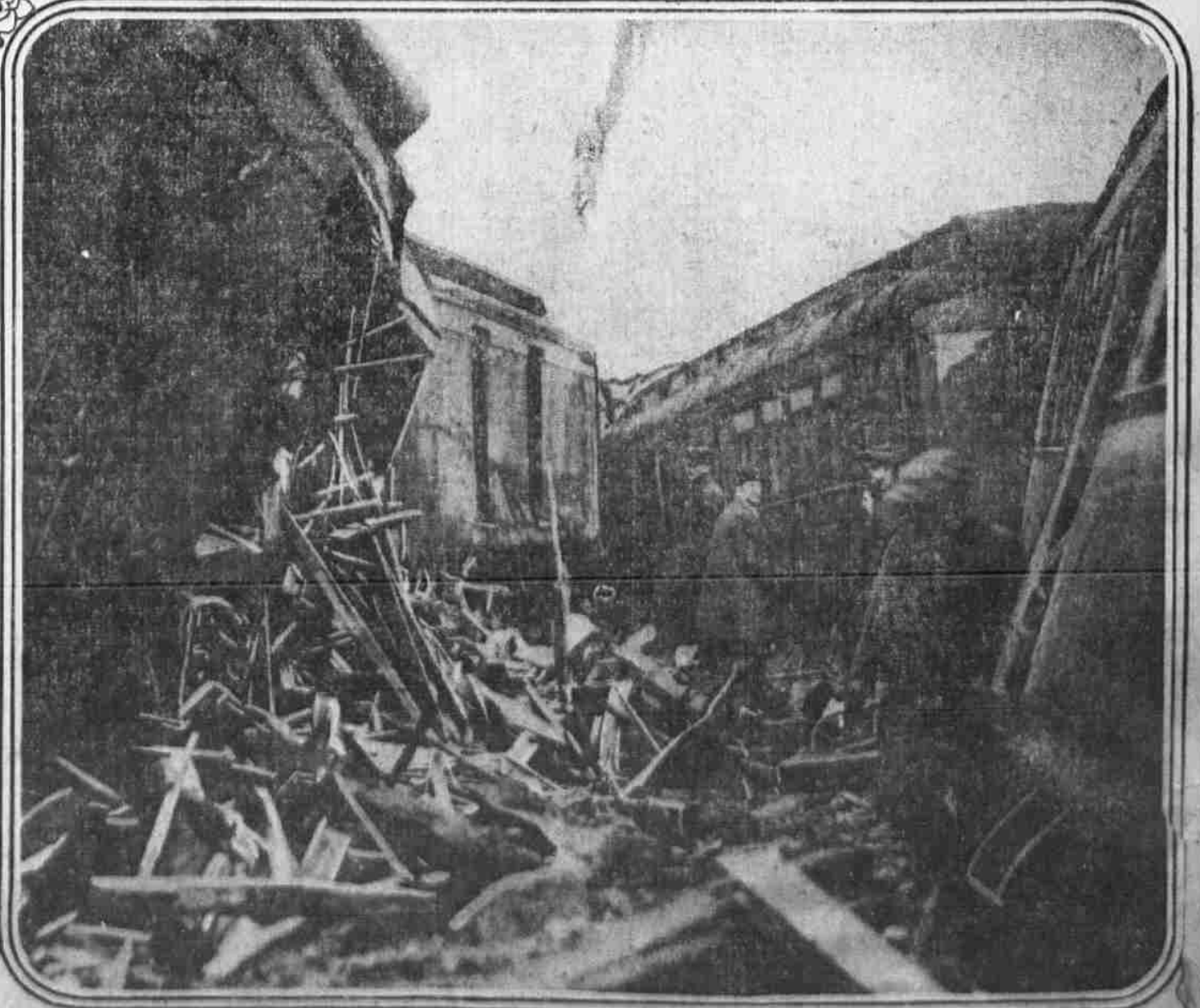

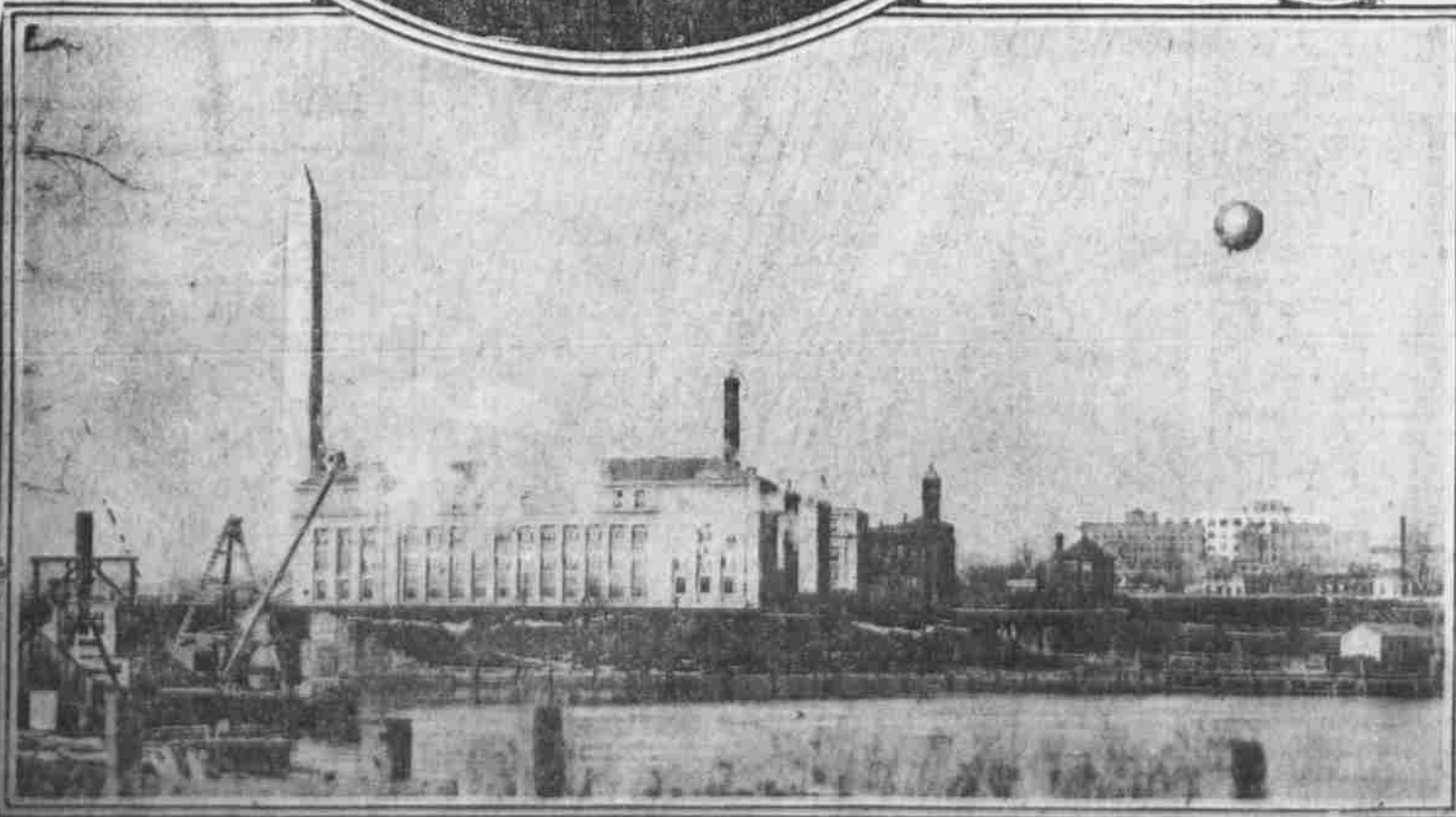
**WOMEN HASTEN AMMUNITION FOR VERDUN**
