

SEE REVENTLOW PEACE TERMS IN HOLLWEG SPEECH

Reventlow Asserts Chancellor's Declaration Means Continuation of Present Submarine Policy

UNITY IN GOVERNMENT High Official Avers End of War by Autumn Seems Possible

BERLIN, April 7.—The German Federal Council has passed a measure providing that, on May 1, all clocks shall be set ahead one hour.

This was the interpretation today of the Lokai Anzeiger, Vossische Zeitung and the Tageblatt, three of the most influential newspapers of Germany.

Count Reventlow, the "German firebrand," alone laid stress on the importance of the Chancellor's remarks regarding the submarine, assuring his readers that Bethmann-Hollweg reiterated firmly Germany's determination to continue the present policy.

This interpretation may be of the greatest significance in view of the statement of a high German Government official that peace in Europe by autumn is a reasonable possibility.

"We have not an abundance," said this official, "but we are not going to starve or be forced by hunger to yield."

"Some people," it was suggested, "have interpreted Admiral von Tirpitz's resignation and the head-and-shoulder change as indicating that Germany is in serious straits."

"That's what our enemies would like to have the world believe," replied the Government official, "but let them wait and see. The German Government is absolutely confident."

Germany to Gain Daylight by Setting Clocks Ahead

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BULGARIA E RUMANIA SONO ALLA VIGILIA DI UN CONFLITTO ARMATO

La Prima Ha Concentrato Sei Divisioni al Confine della Dobrugia, e Bucarest Si Prepara

ROMA, 7 Aprile.—Terzi sera il Ministero della Guerra pubblicava sul rapporto del generale comandante delle forze italiane operanti sulla fronte italo-austriaca.

"I nostri reparti sono attivi lungo la fronte dalla Stevia alla Val Giudicaria. Si sono avuti duelli di artiglieria sulla zona del Lago di Garda all'alta valle dell'Asio."

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Grief Breaks Heart of Debutante Who Married Osborne Protege

AUBURN, N. Y., April 7.—Forsaken by her friends, disowned by her family, Jane Louise Cameron, the young society girl that eloped a year ago with an ex-convict, is dead of a broken heart today.

On April 15 last year, Jane Louise McCarty, 19, pretty, a debutante in Auburn society, married Roy E. Cameron, who had just served a 10-year term in Auburn prison.

Both friends and relatives this afternoon repeated their remarks of a year ago, when the news was flashed around the world that Creely went to heroic lengths to aid in raising the P-4.

"A hero in every way, and we're mighty proud of him," they said. Creely has had long experience in the hazardous task of deep-sea diving, his first exploit having been in 1908 when he took a plunge of 160 feet in San Francisco Bay, while on the Roosevelt-ordered cruise of the American fleet around the world.
