# **EPISCOPAL FACTIONS** HAVE TILT AT BANQUET

Dr. Grammer, Attacking 'High' Church View, Answered by G. W. Pepper

An attack on the "high" faction of the Enlicental Church by the "low" and a counter criticism of the "low" lent zeed to a banquet held in the Church House 18th and Walnut streets, last night, dur Isth and Wain't streets, last fight dif-ling which the subject, "What is Hindering the Greater Advance of the Church?" was under discussion. The Rev. Carl Gram-mar, rector of St. Stephen's Church, criti-cised the "high" faction. George Whur-ton Pepper answered and attacked the stand of the "low" faction.

Dr. Grammar criticised the "high" party for basing its authenticity on spostolic succession and its theology strictly on the doctrine promulgated by the church and sanctioned by her authority, in distinction from the "low" party, which assumed liberal views. He said the "low" party was too "broad" to attach any imice to apostolic succession.

Mr. Pepper placed the blame for the Air. Pepper placed the blame for the condition within the Episcopal church on the clergy, who, he said, are disunited and divided into factions. He neatly turned the statements of Doctor Grammar against himself by calling into question the alleged "breadth" of the "low" faction. If the "low" church was as broad as Doctor Grammar said, the speaker contended, it should be broad enough to include every party in the church and be clude every party in the church and be willing to assimilate the views of all in the spirit of harmony, instead of accusing and abusing one faction which should have, according to the alleged open policy of the "low" faction, the liberty at least to had the own clara. He ridiculed the position assumed for the "low" faction by Doctor Grammar and said the clergyman had not only attacked the church as being faulty and holding a wrong theological position but had set up the "low" church as being alone correct in its theology and system.
