SENATE ASKS REPORT ON OIL BUSINESS

Western Jobbers Assert Failure of Supreme Court Decree Dividing Standard

WASHINGTON, April 11.—The Senate today adopted without objection a resolution by Senator Kenyon of Iowa calling upon the Attorney General to submit to the Senate all reports of investigations of oil interests, including the Standard Oil Company, since the Standard Oil dissolution decree.

The adoption of the resolution was preceded by the reading of a letter from R. K. Walsh, of Chicago, general counsel for the Western Oil Jobbers' Association, declaring that unless the present discriminatory oil prices were equalized by governmental action, Middle Western independent oil companies would be driven out of business before the end of the coming summer.

Fish Dealers Warned

HARRISBURG, April 11.—Dairy and Food Commissioner James Foust, of the Department of Agriculture, has issued warnings to all dealers in fish in the state to watch for dried fish containing borax acid as a preservative in warm weather, which is strictly forbidden by the law.
