Official Forecast

WASHINGTON, April 25, For eastern Pennsylvania and New Jer-Overcast tonight and Thursday, with probably showers; cooler Thursday; light to moderate variable winds.

Unsettled conditions have throughout the eastern half of the country during the last 24 hours, with showers, ex-cept in the eastern Gulf and south Atlantic States. Showers are also reported from the southern plains States. The western area of high barometer covers all of the region from the Mississippi River to the Rocky Mountains and the temperatures have continued to fall slowly in most of the great central valleys under its influ-ence. There is a deficiency this morning of 6 degrees or 8 degrees over most of the country from the Rocky Mountains eastward to the coast.
