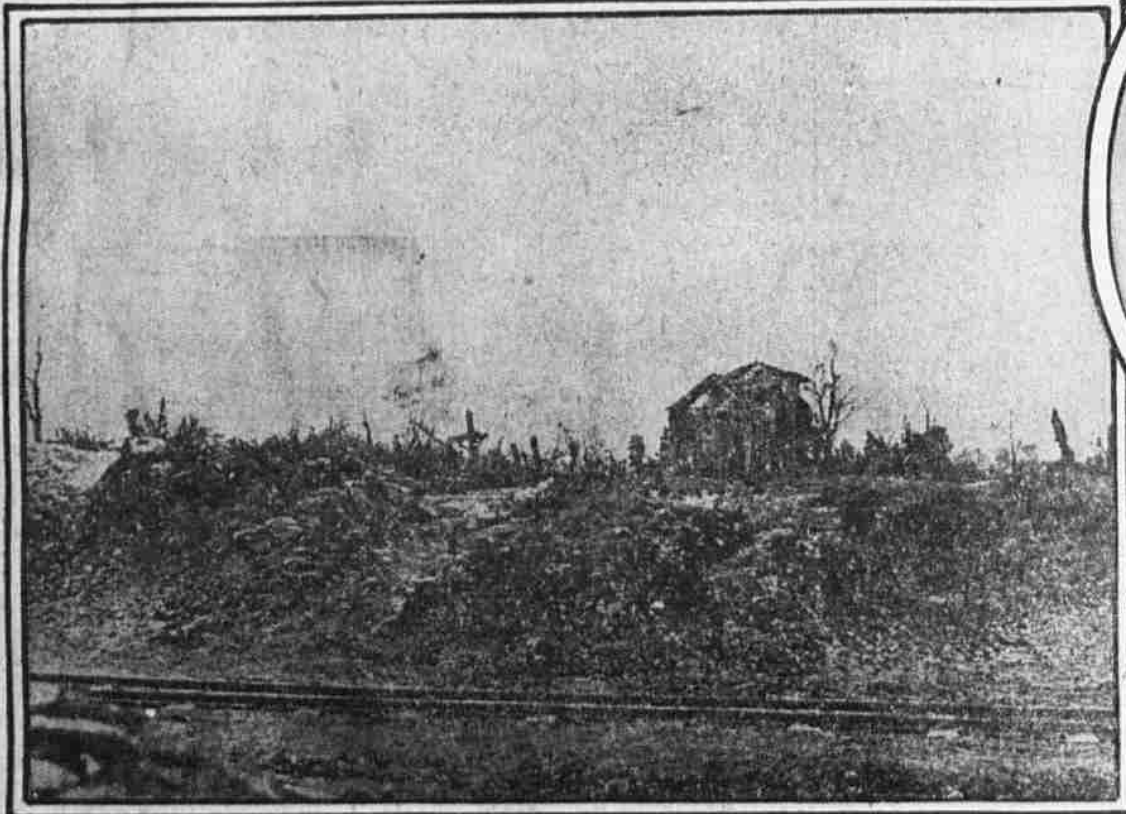
#### CARRANZISTA OFFICERS MEET AMERICANS IN CONFERENCE

#### CENTRE OF FIGHTING BETWEEN IRISH REVOLUTIONISTS AND ENGLISH TROOPS IN STREETS OF DUBLIN

This is Sackville street, where the first clash between the inhabitants and the soldiers is reported to have taken place last Sunday. On this broad, central thoroughfare is situated the general postoffice, which the revolutionists captured after a charge on the constables.
