




EXCLUSIVE PHOTOGRAPH SHOWING HOW 12-INCH GUN ON BATTLESHIP MICHIGAN CRACKED ALONG VIRTUALLY ITS ENTIRE LENGTH IN RECENT FIRING PRACTICE OFF GUANTANAMO BAY

As a result of the discovery of this defect, all four big guns in the forward turrets have been discarded and new ones are being mounted while the ship is undergoing repairs at the Navy Yard.
