These boys and girls will take part in the review demonstrating phases in the industrial life of the nation at the William Penn High School tonight.

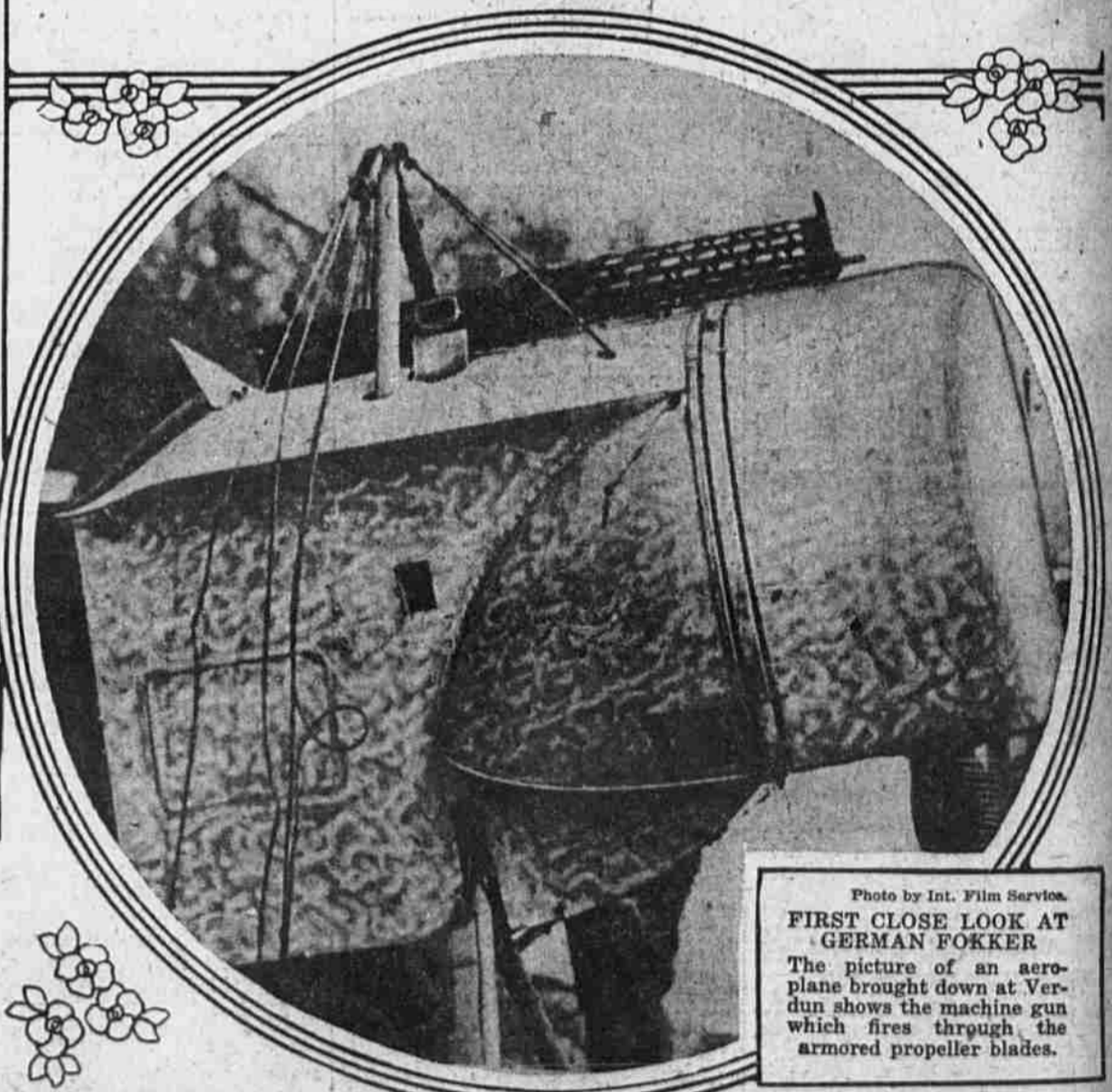
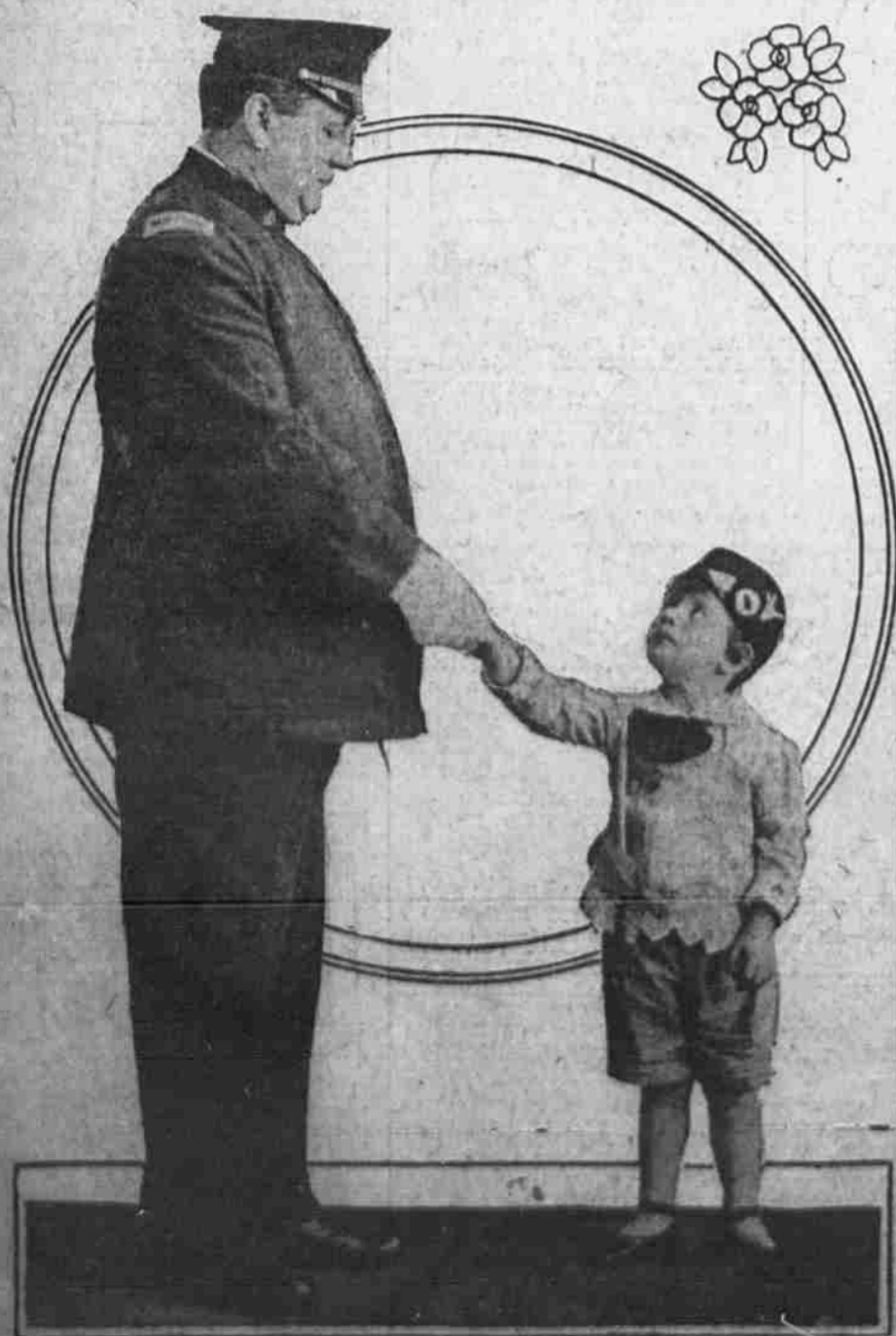
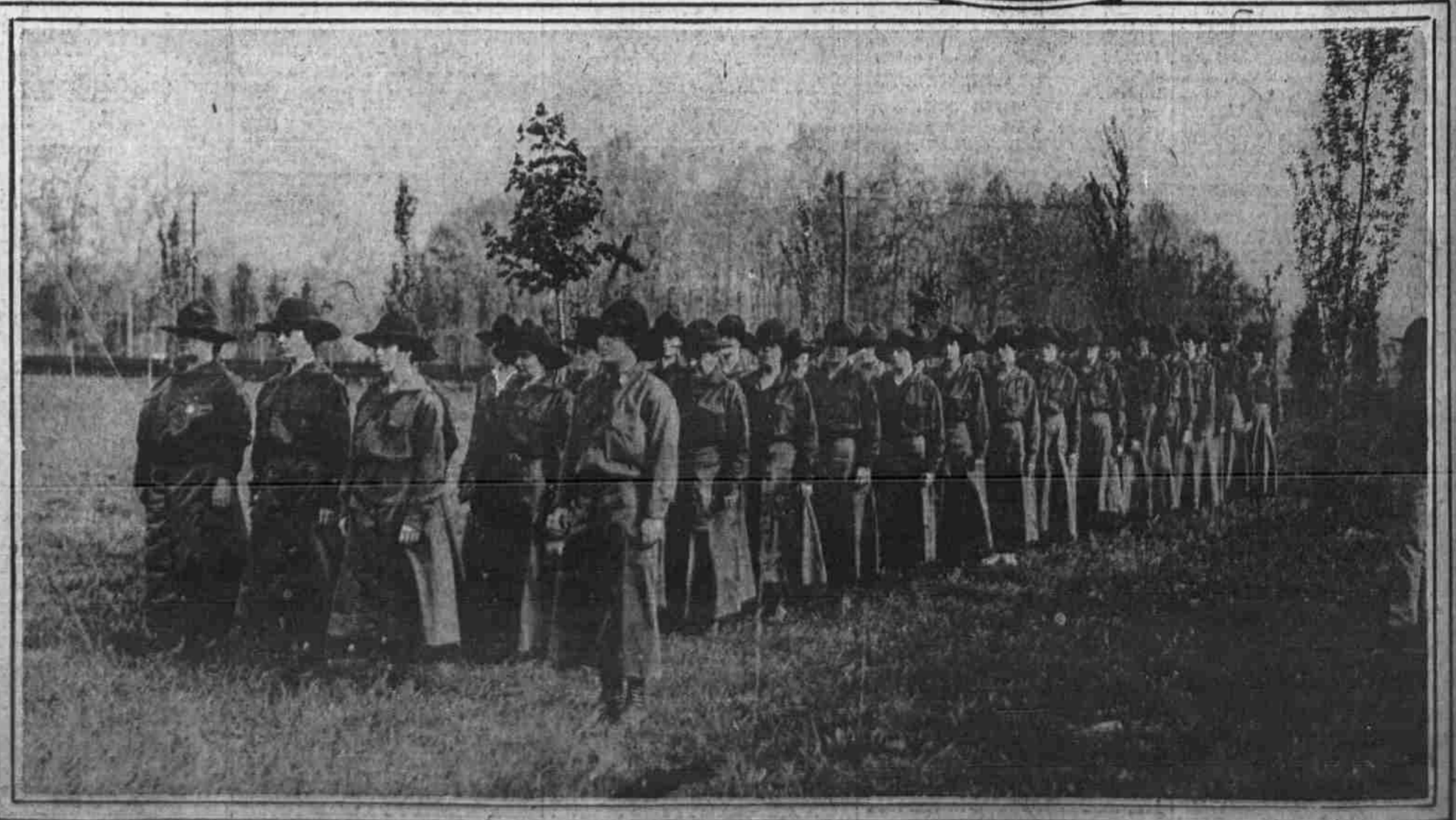
