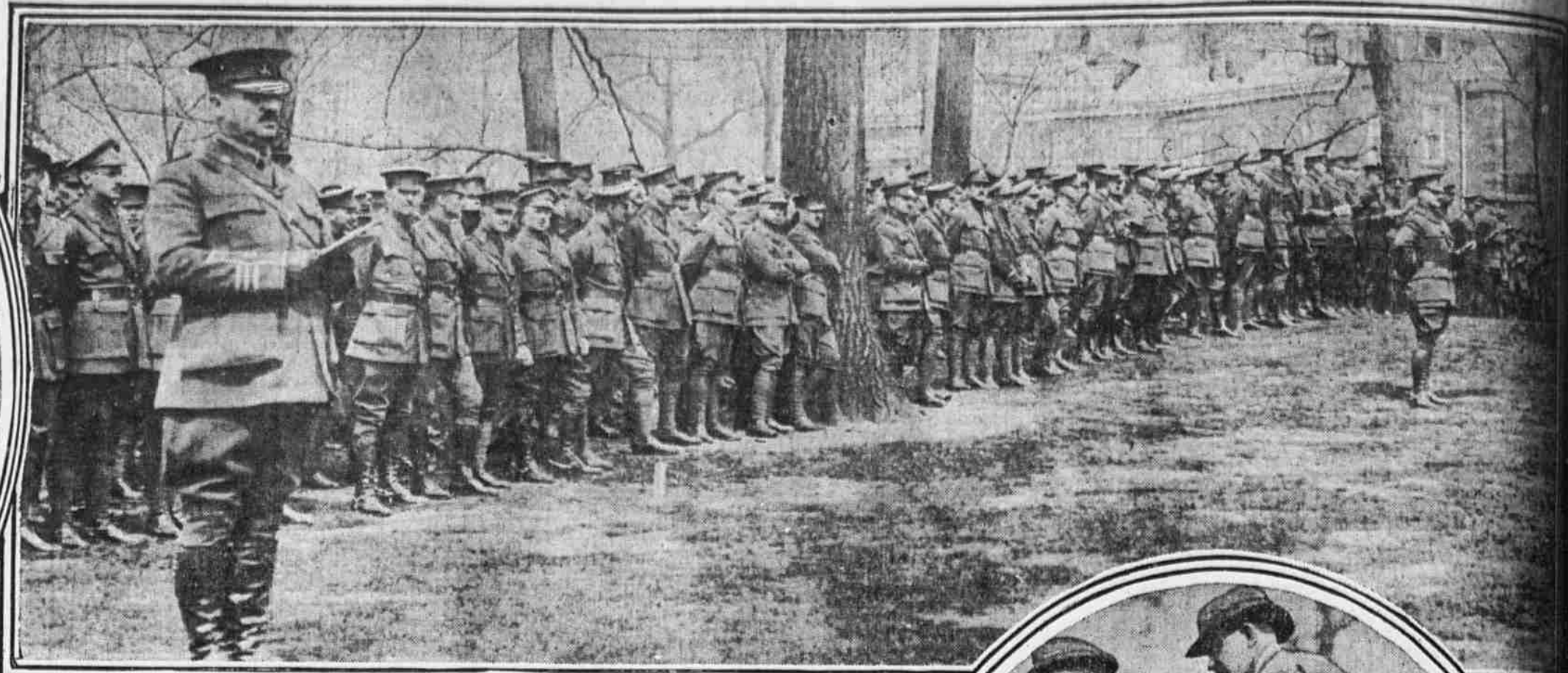

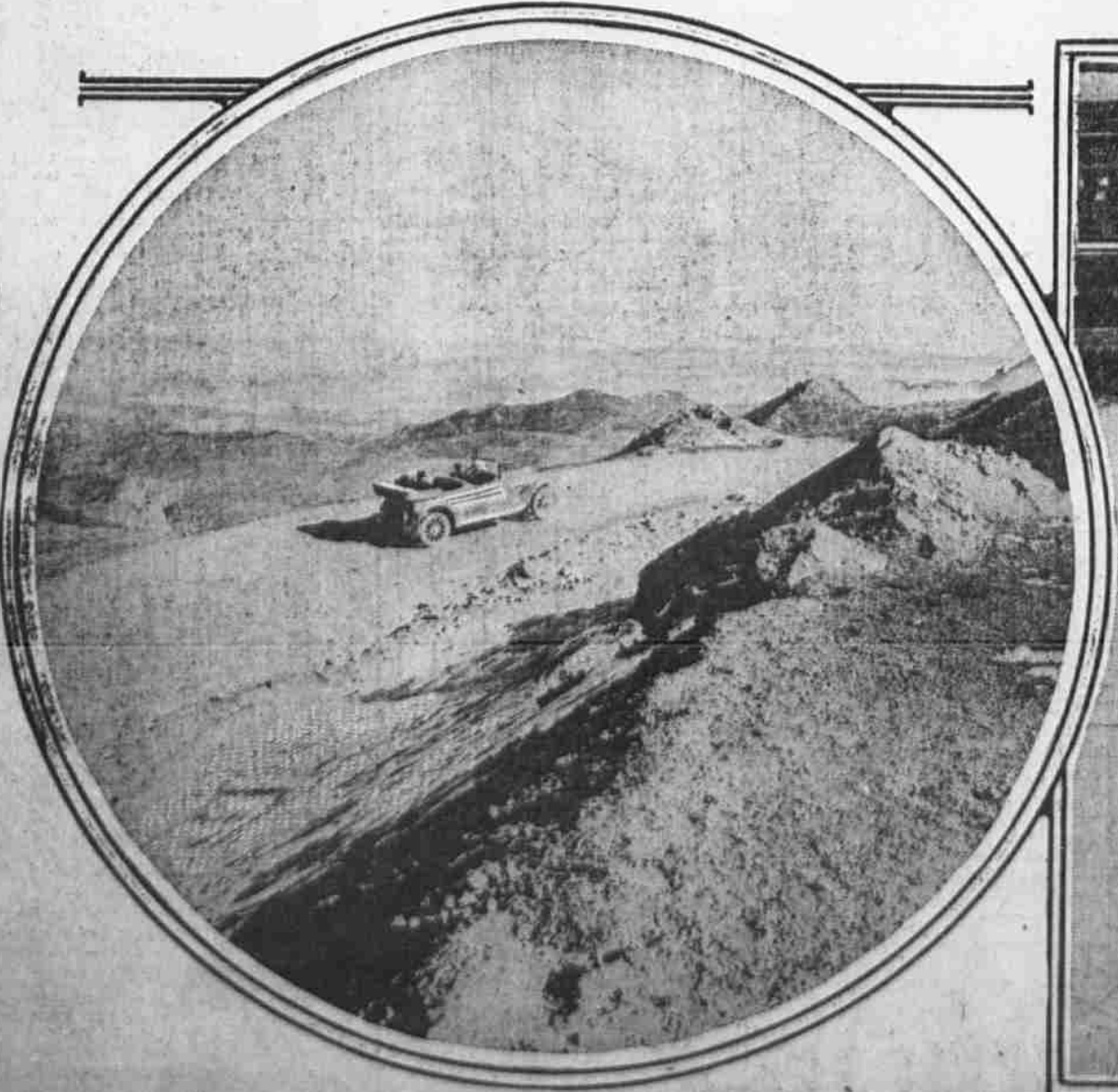
THE "AMERICAN LEGION" IN CANADA'S NEW ARMY AND ITS COMMANDER

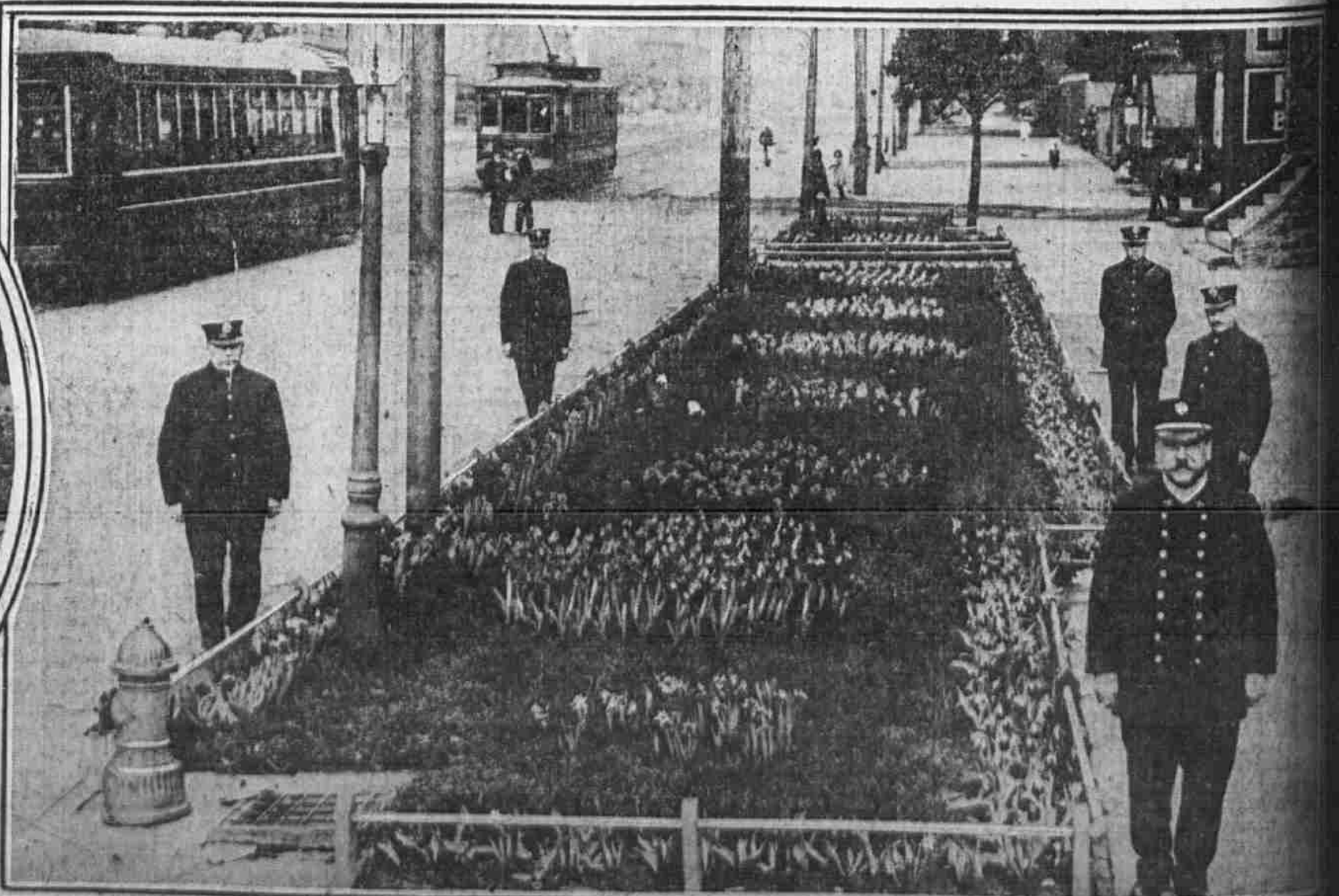
SURVEYING SQUAD FROM THE SOUTH PHILADELPHIA HIGH SCHOOL ABO UT TO GO INTO ACTION
