Man Wearing Kid Gloves Hanged Himself, Probably Last Winter

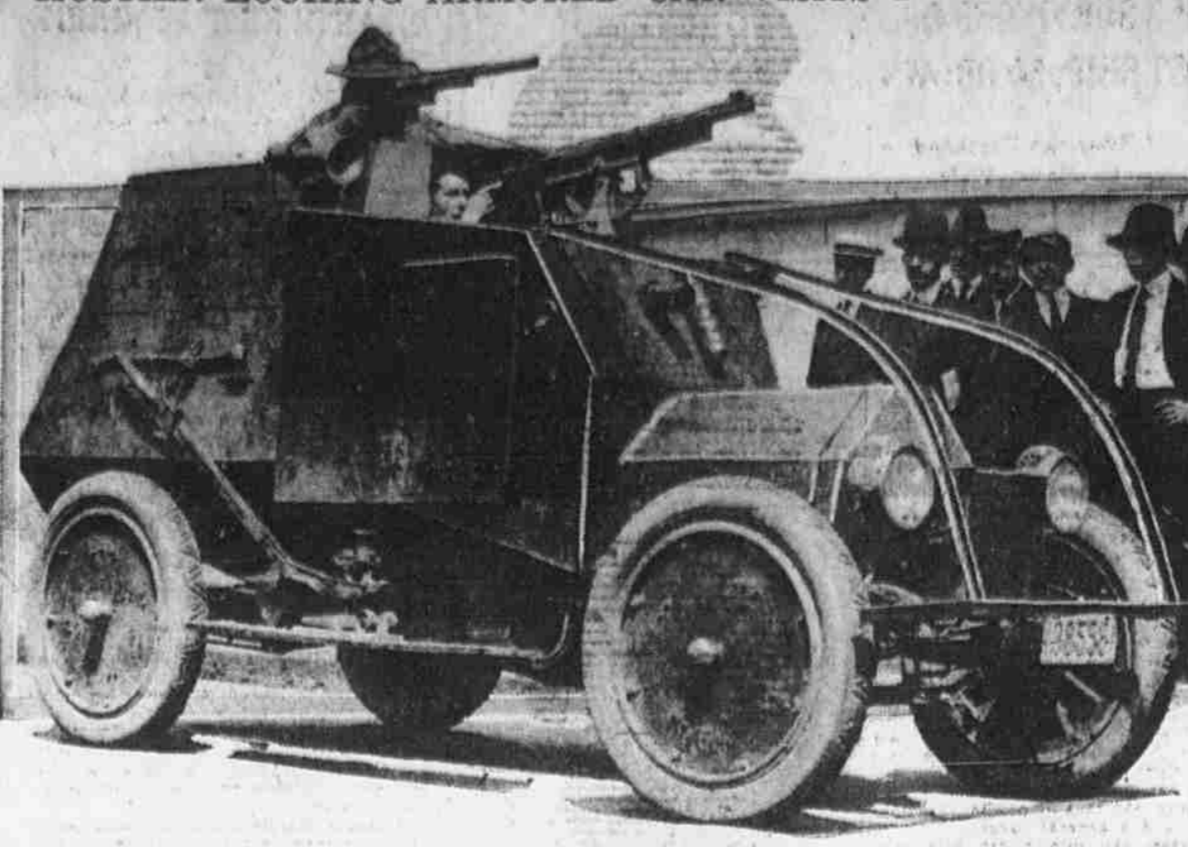
The body of a man hanging by a rope, with kid gloves on the hands, was found today in a dredge boat on Schuylkill river, at the South Street wharf.
