

TEMPLE CAMP FIGHTERS SPURRED BY SUCCESS

\$37,000 of \$250,000 Fund Subscribed—Doctor Conwell Urges High Aims

Contributors for the Temple University fund to raise \$250,000 toward an endowment to maintain that institution of the city today set out on the fourth day of the campaign heartened by the knowledge that they already had turned in \$37,000.
