That will be "Preparedness Day" of the Philadelphia Today and Tomorrow Exposition. The maneuvers were decided on at a conference of the staff of the brigade presided over by Brigadier General Price last night at the Union League. It will be part of a mevement to get 2000 recruits, who would bring the brigade up to its full quota of men.

It is planned to have the Phoenixville Dattery at the maneuvers and to stage a sham battle along the lines of the trench fighting now going on in Europe. The treops will bivous Saturday night in the Park and resume operations the next day.
